2010 Catholic Services Appeal (CSA)

This weekend we inaugurate the 2010 version of the annual fund drive for the Archdiocese of Detroit, the Catholic Services Appeal. First and foremost, I want to take this opportunity to thank all who availed themselves to support this effort at our parish liturgies this weekend. Your contribution and/or pledge have already set the foundation for a successful campaign in two ways. In addition to helping attain our 2010 goal of \$392,406 your gift has also aided in the reduction of the time and expense of a parish wide mailing that will now serve as the second phase of this drive. Following this weekend all remaining parishioners who have not yet participated in CSA 2010 will be contacted through the mail and asked to support this annual campaign. Consequently, your participation at this early stage has already been of significant help to attain our goal this year.

If you attended church this weekend but were not prepared to commit to CSA 2010 please know that there is still time to be involved in this initial phase of the campaign. In all practicality it will likely take another week or even two before all the elements are in place to complete the mailing process. In addition to CSA envelopes being distributed at all liturgies this weekend there are also

limited number available on the collection boxes near the doors in the main body of church. You will also find them at the Information Center in the Chapel Hallway as well as in the Parish Office. Please either mail your envelope back to the parish, drop it off at the office, or simply place it in the Sunday Offering as you would your weekly contribution. If you want more information on CSA 2010 brochures detailing the drive are also available throughout church and in the Parish Office as well. This document outlines more fully all that is provided by the CSA.

Certainly by now virtually everyone is aware of the concept and practice of this drive. Each parish is responsible for its targeted goal. In the event that it is exceeded the overage is returned to the parish. However, if there is a shortfall the uncollected amount becomes the responsibility of the parish as well. For the past number of years this latter scenario has been the case here for us at Saint Andrew. While we attain our target in terms of pledged amount there has historically been an abyss between those figures and that amount of what is actually collected. Many factors can be cited for this chasm, none the least of which is our current economic conditions. In any and all cases, our CSA goal can only be realized through a concerted and comprehensive effort on the part of our entire parish.


Clearly, \$392,406 is an ambitious amount of money for any parish, especially in these difficult economic times. The only realistic way we have of attaining our target is by way of the pledge system. A gift given over time enables greater participation without necessarily feeling financially drained. CSA gifts can

be given in a monthly manner by way of nine payments or on a quarterly basis: July, October, January, and April.

As in all Christian Stewardship the amount of your gift is up to you. We are challenged to assume equal sacrifice and not equal gifts. Only you can determine the amount of your pledge or gift. We are all asked the same thing: to equitably assume our responsibility of the programs and ministries offered through the CSA. In these trying times it is essential that we all do our part to share the work of the church through the CSA.

As we embark upon another year of the CSA I simply wish to express both my own personal gratitude as well as that of our diocese and on behalf of all those who are benefited through CSA funds. No one individual parish or vicariate could begin to provide the ministry and services that comes through this annual effort. Please know that your expression of Christian Stewardship by way of CSA 2010 literally touches lives around the world. It is my hope and prayer that you will enjoy a lasting sense of peace, joy, and fulfillment for the good you have done through your expression of faith in CSA 2010.
