Economic Justice For All Statement!

It is now over two decades since this statement on *Economic Justice for All* was released by the U. S. Catholic Conference of Bishops. Our bishops **encourage us to participate** in lively dialogue and principled action on a wide variety of issues and concerns, including the following excerpts:

How can our nation work together to overcome the scandal of **so much poverty in our midst**, especially among children?

How can our Church take a **leadership role** in calling those in positions of power to promote economic growth, job security, decent wages, and more job opportunities?

How can our community **shape the priorities** of our culture to promote greater personal responsibility and better economic choices?

How can the **dignity and rights of workers** be protected and enhanced in an economy where increasing competition, frequent downsizing, and less unionization have left many workers at risk?

What are the **moral responsibilities** and limitations of markets, the state, and the voluntary sector? So how can business, labor, various levels of government, and mediating structures like charities, churches and voluntary groups work together to overcome economic injustice & exploitation in our communities?

How can we honestly assess our own work ethic, productivity, consumption and lifestyles in light of the **needs of a hungry world**?

How can we address the **racial discord** that exists in our nation & neighborhood today?

How can the **Church practice** in its own life and institutions **what it preaches** to others about economic justice, human dignity, and the rights of workers?

There are many more questions that could be raised, but these are examples of issues where **Catholics can apply the Church's teaching**, share our experiences, and voice our hopes in civil dialogue and principled action on economic justice.

Our faith community crosses lines of class and race, politics and ideology. Catholics are at the center and fringes of U. S. economic life. We need to renew **our sense of solidarity!**

Catholic Medical Mission Board in Haiti

Your parish tithing (Sunday Offerings) has helped **St. Andrew Parish support** the Catholic Medical Mission Board in its ministry to the people of Haiti. The CMMB has been present in Haiti for nearly a century. Unfortunately most people, when looking at a destructive earthquake, focus on collapsed buildings and death. But in fact, one of the most crippling effects of a serious earthquake is a large number of amputations. **To date more than 4,000 people in Haiti have had amputations as a result of the earthquake**, and it is anticipated the number will grow due to infections. CMMB is teaching new ways of sitting, standing and exercising to victims. In the best situation, it also means getting fitted for a prosthetic limb and learning to use it. CMMB has joined with the Haitian Amputee Coalition to provide prosthetic fittings and therapy to a quarter of the current amputee survivors. Please keep them in your prayers while we as a faith community continue to support CMMB and others in the effort to help the earthquake survivors.

It is always the second Sunday of the month after the 10:45am Mass in the activities building. This month's meeting is next Sunday, August 8th. The September meeting is the 12th.



Consider Sharing Your Faith as a Catechist

It is the call of all baptized to share their faith with the next generation. The Faith Formation staff would like to invite you to think about becoming a catechist in our program. The Religious Education program meets weekly from October thru April. Classes for Pre-K and Kindergarten are offered on Sunday morning. Classes for grades 1-5 meet on Monday at 4:30, 6:00, Tuesday 4:30. Middle school (grades 6-8) meets Monday 7:30pm, Tuesday 6pm. All sessions last one hour and 15 minutes. The catechists work closely with a section head to plan their classes. Lesson planning takes place once a month. Class size is usually between 12 and 15. Most catechists would say that they spend about an hour per week at home making final preparations. If you'd like more information, please call the Faith Formation Office at 248-651-6571.

Liturgy of the Word

Have you thought about being a catechist, but can't be available during the week? Maybe you can't teach during the entire school year? Consider offering yourself as a catechist with our Liturgy of the Word program. On Sundays, during the 9am and 10:45am Mass, children from grades 1-4 are invited to gather in the chapel to listen to the readings at their own level. We share the same readings of the Sunday Mass, have a discussion at their level and offer prayers together. Preparation and assistance is provided to all our catechists to be active in this ministry. **WHAT DOES THE ST. ANDREW
CAREER MINISTRY DO?**

We support the unemployed and those in job transition in 3 ways:

We put on presentations with professionals in the field of employment such as HR Managers, Recruiters, Career Counselors, Life Coaches...many of these people are volunteers from our parish.

We also do what is called a “One-On-One” workshop. This is where we bring together many of our St. Andrew volunteers together with the jobseeker. The employment experts sit at several tables in the room and the job seeker can choose to go to any of the experts and discuss whatever he/she chooses one-on-one with that expert.....such as reviewing a resume or talking about interviewing or networking or skills assessment.

We also have a Yahoo Group Website. We are partnered with several churches in the Detroit-Metro area. Together with our partnered churches we post job opportunities, presentations, workshops and job fairs and much more.

In addition the jobseeker may work one-on-one with many of our professionals through emails, phone calls or in some cases in person to help the job seeker through the job transition. All our services are at no cost.

We are also partnered with Oakland University's Counseling Center for both career counseling and physiological counseling.

We meet every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month.
