In 1969 Pope Paul VI promulgated a new Roman calendar. This calendar removed many saints, changed cycles of the year and restored aspects of church life that had been forgotten like the Catechumenate (RCIA). It also reduced the number of Marian celebrations from 20 to 15 and classified them according to importance. Today's Solemnity is categorized as one of the greatest in importance along with: the *Annunciation of the Lord*; the *Immaculate Conception*; and *Mary, Mother of God*; next is, the *Visitation* and the *Nativity of Mary*. The last category consists of obligatory and optional memorials placed throughout the year.



The development of today's solemnity is not clear. It is believed to have been celebrated in Jerusalem in the 5th century. People celebrated what was called the "*Dormition (falling asleep)*" of Mary the term "*Assumption*" began being used in the 8th century.

FIRST DISCIPLE

The Assumption of Mary was officially proclaimed as a doctrine of the Church in 1950, but it was believed by generations of faithful before that date. In her willingness to be the mother of Jesus, God made flesh, she has a unique role in our salvation. No one knows for certain how Mary spent the rest of her life after the end of her son's earthly ministry. She was given by Jesus into the care of John, the beloved disciple, but we know almost nothing about her final days. The Church's long tradition has been that when she died God raised her, body and soul, into heaven. The Assumption defies anyone who wants to nail down details. On this feast we are confronted by pure mystery. Mary is not only the mother of Jesus and Mother of God, she is also the first disciple of the Good News. In today's Gospel she hurries to visit her cousin Elizabeth, pregnant with John the Baptist. Mary's arrival causes Elizabeth, under the influence of the child in her womb, to praise Mary as "the mother of my Lord" (Luke 1:43). Mary then shows us discipleship to the fullest by blessing God in the Magnificat. In this hymn Mary interprets the good news that she has brought to Elizabeth. The angel told Mary who Jesus is, the Savior and Son of God; but Mary translates this identity in terms of what his arrival means. Pope Paul VI said that Mary is an example to all of us because of the way in which she fully and responsibly accepted the word of God, and did God's will without question. She is worthy of imitation because she was the first and the most perfect of Christ's disciples. She is worthy of any honor we give her.

Pontiac Area Vicariate Fall Diversity Fair Nov. 7

The Pontiac Area Vicariate is holding a first time **Diversity Fair** at St. Mary of the Hills. The Fair begins with Mass at 2:30 pm, then moves to the gym where there will be booths, performances and speakers from various cultures. The **planning committee needs help** and input from many ethnic groups! We are inviting Cultural Leaders or Advocates who can share a glimpse of their culture with our area church members. Some of the groups we would like represented include; Latinos, Albanians, Philippines, Italians, Germans, Poles, Asians, Indians and more! Speakers are needed to give a 5 minute presentation on their cultural values, their immigration story and what their culture offers the local church and America.

It Takes an Entire Village

The Faith Formation Program requires the assistance of many parishioners to help create a safe and secure environment. At this time, we are asking parishioners to consider the following:

Child Care—we provide this service for catechists during class time on Mondays and Tuesdays.

We also need child care providers in the morning for our women's scripture study and MOMS group. These groups meet on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9:30 am - 11am.

Safety—we are in need of parents in the program to serve as hallway monitors while classes are in session and traffic guards during the time between sessions when parents are dropping off and picking up children.

Young Adults

Fusion Young Adult Ministry, established back in 2002, now has a new name and a new



structure. The new name is "Agape Young Adult Community." They have had a surprising & wonderful surge of interest of late and 31 leaders who were commissioned at Mass back in June are busy dreaming, planning and continuing to reach out to young adults in our Pontiac Area Vicariate to keep our ministry vibrant and relevant in the lives of young believers. WHAT DOES THE ST. ANDREW CAREER MINISTRY DO?

We support the unemployed and those in job transition in 3 ways:

We put on presentations with professionals in the field of employment such as HR Managers, Recruiters, Career Counselors, Life Coaches...many of these people are volunteers from our parish.

We also do what is called a ***"One-On-One"*** workshop. This is where we bring together many of our St. Andrew volunteers together with the jobseeker. The employment experts sit at several tables in the room and the job seeker can choose to go to any of the experts and discuss whatever he/she chooses one-on-one with that expert... such as reviewing a resume or talking about interviewing or networking or skills assessment.

We also have a ***Yahoo Group Website***. We are partnered with several churches in the Detroit-Metro area. Together with our partnered churches we post job opportunities, presentations, workshops and job fairs and much more.

In addition the jobseeker may work one-on-one with many of our professionals through emails, phone calls or in some cases in person to help the job seeker through the job transition. All our services are at no cost.

We are also partnered with Oakland University's Counseling Center for both career counseling and physiological counseling.

We meet every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month.

All make the sign of the cross. The leader begins:

Let us ever praise and extol God’s all-embracing providence, who gives us food from the fruits of the earth. Blessed be God for ever.

All respond: Blessed be God for ever.

The leader may use these or similar words to introduce the blessing:

The Lord has bestowed the fruits of the earth for the benefit of all of the world’s people. May we share with all in need and so be good stewards of God’s earth and its abundance. We remember the words Mary speaks in the gospel story of the visitation: “The hungry he has filled with good things.”

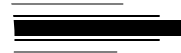
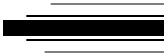

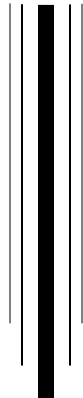
