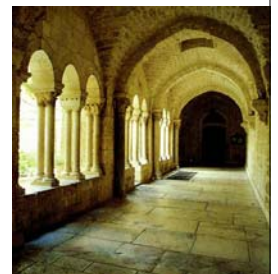

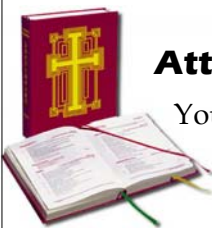

Pakistan: Church World Service (CROP) is there!

In the wake of Pakistan's worst flooding in history, Church World Service CWS is responding over a wide geographic area, part of a decades-long commitment to the poor of this country. Through funds raised from **CROP Walks** for Hunger, direct assistance to over 100,000 individuals has been made possible. YOUR pledges have helped provide food and non-food items, shelter kits and healthcare items to those in crisis. By mid August, CWS has already distributed 75 tons of food items in Balochistan and Khyber.

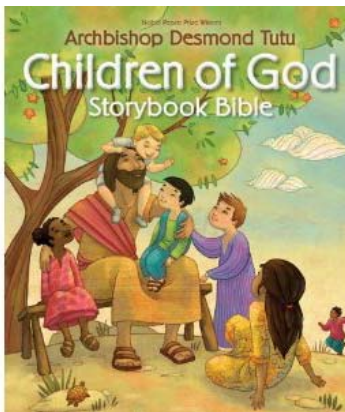
It Takes An Entire Village

Children of God—Storybook Bible



Even though this book is subtitled a Storybook Bible, it is a little misleading. The book is not a Bible; rather it is a collection of 56 stories from the Bible, 24 from the Old Testament and 32 from the New Testament. Each story (and illustration) is over a two page spread. There is a main title and then a subtitle explaining how it relates to God. Each

ends with a short prayer. Here is his introduction to the story when the apostles ask Jesus to teach them to pray. "Praying is easy, Jesus said. "God wants to know you and bring you close. Just speak to God like a friend and he will listen.. God hears your softest whisper, and even when you can't find the words, God hears what's in your heart." One of the greatest gifts of this book is that the artwork was done by twenty different artists from around the world. On the back cover, Archbishop Desmond Tutu writes "In the spirit of celebrating children all over the world, each illustrator in this book has been invited to draw on their own unique and rich cultural heritage in their portrayal of these biblical stories. Their art is truly a marvelous reflection of how we are all made in God's image." ISBN-13: 978-0310719120

WHAT DOES THE ST. ANDREW CAREER MINISTRY DO?

We support the unemployed and those in job transition in 3 ways:

We put on presentations with professionals in the field of employment such as HR Managers, Recruiters, Career Counselors, Life Coaches...many of these people are volunteers from our parish.

We also do what is called a "One-On-One" workshop. This is where we bring together many of our St. Andrew volunteers together with the jobseeker. The employment experts sit at several tables in the room and the job seeker can choose to go to any of the experts and discuss whatever he/she chooses one-on-one with that expert... such as reviewing a resume or talking about interviewing or networking or skills assessment.

We also have a Yahoo Group Website. We are partnered with several churches in the Detroit-Metro area. Together with our partnered churches we post job opportunities, presentations, workshops and job fairs and much more.

In addition the jobseeker may work one-on-one with many of our professionals through emails, phone calls or in some cases in person to help the job seeker through the job transition. All our services are at no cost.

We are also partnered with Oakland University's Counseling Center for both career counseling and physiological counseling.

We meet every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month.

Saving Children on the Streets of Kenya
