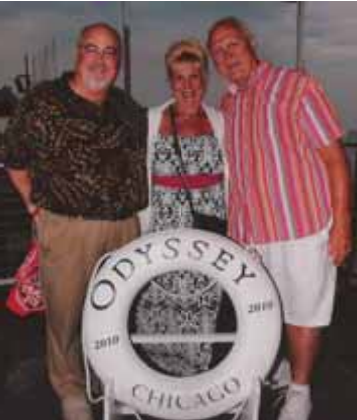

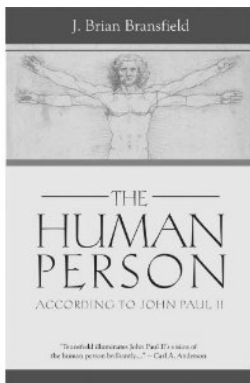
Religious Education Program 2010-2011

Liturgy of the Word

Have you thought about being a catechist, but can't be available during the week? Maybe you aren't able to teach during the entire school year?

Consider offering yourself as a catechist with our Liturgy of the Word program. On Sundays, during the 9am and 10:45am Mass, children from grades 1-4 are invited to gather in the chapel to listen to the readings at their own level. We share the same readings of the Sunday Mass, have a discussion at their level and offer prayers together. Preparation and assistance is provided to all our catechists to be active in this ministry. The Human Person: According to John Paul II
 "What does it mean to be human?" A new book by the priest who spearheads the evangelization and catechetical efforts of the U.S. bishops explores this question by drawing on the teachings of Pope John Paul II in his theology of the body. Bransfield writes about the challenges raised by three social revolutions of the 20th Century; the industrial, sexual and technological revolutions – and how John Paul's theology of the body responded to the resulting societal shifts. These shifts, he observes, have led to a disregard for women, the spread of cohabitation, the rise in divorce and the growing trend of fatherlessness. John Paul II challenged all of these trends. Bransfield shows how Christians today can overcome the negative consequences of these shifts through living the teaching of the theology of the body as an essential element of the new evangelization proclaimed by Pope John Paul II.

Consider Sharing Your Faith as a Catechist

It is the call of all baptized to share their faith with the next generation. The Faith Formation staff would like to invite you to think about becoming a catechist in our program. The Religious Education program meets weekly from October thru April. Classes for Pre-K and Kindergarten are offered on Sunday morning. Classes for grades 1-5 meet on Monday at 4:30, 6:00, Tuesday 4:30. Middle school (grades 6-8) meets Monday 7:30pm, Tuesday 6pm. All sessions last one hour and 15 minutes. The catechists work closely with a section head to plan their classes. Lesson planning takes place once a month. Class size is usually between 12 and 15. Most catechists would say that they spend about an hour per week at home making final preparations. If you'd like more information, please call the Faith Formation Office at 248-651-6571.

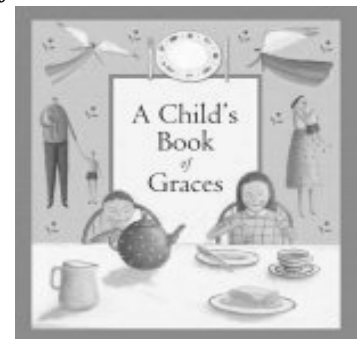


A Child's Book of Graces

**WHAT DOES THE ST. ANDREW
CAREER MINISTRY DO?**

We support the unemployed and those in job transition in 3 ways:

We put on presentations with professionals in the field of employment such as HR Managers, Recruiters, Career Counselors, Life Coaches...many of these people are volunteers from our parish.

We also do what is called a “One-On-One” workshop. This is where we bring together many of our St. Andrew volunteers together with the jobseeker. The employment experts sit at several tables in the room and the job seeker can choose to go to any of the experts and discuss whatever he/she chooses one-on-one with that expert.....such as reviewing a resume or talking about interviewing or networking or skills assessment.

We also have a Yahoo Group Website. We are partnered with several churches in the Detroit-Metro area. Together with our partnered churches we post job opportunities, presentations, workshops and job fairs and much more.

In addition the jobseeker may work one-on-one with many of our professionals through emails, phone calls or in some cases in person to help the job seeker through the job transition. All our services are at no cost.

We are also partnered with Oakland University's Counseling Center for both career counseling and physiological counseling.

We meet every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month.
