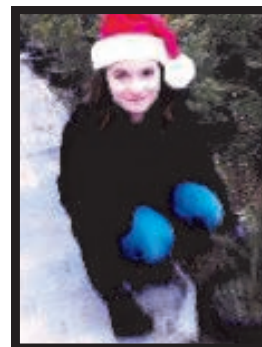
### TEENS AND CULTURE

Traditionally this is the day families bless their homes for the new year. To bless your home, acquire a piece of chalk, and walk from room to room, symbolizing the Magi traveling to Bethlehem. Inscribe above each door, 20+C+M+B+12. The numbers equal the current year and the letters represent the names of the Magi; C is for Casper, M is for Melchior and B is for Balthazar.

The letters are also an acronym for *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless this house."

## Daughters of Isabella

### Our Lady of Lourdes Circle #1426 2011 Summary of Accomplishments

As we look upon the past year, we all personally look at our accomplishments of the past year. As Daughters of Isabella, below is a short list of the many things we were able to accomplish in this our 3<sup>rd</sup> year as a Circle. If one or more of these charities are of interest to you, please consider stopping in to check us out. We meet the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of each month from 7 p.m. – 9 p.m. generally in the Multi-Purpose Room. We are proud of what we have been able to accomplish, but we look forward to more Catholic women age 16 or older joining our group to allow us a longer and even more rewarding list of help to charities in 2012.

**February, 2011** – 1<sup>st</sup> of our Ronald McDonald House dinners. We served fried chicken, rosemary potatoes, grilled vegetables and dessert of brownies to the residents of the house. It would be only a week or two later that one of our members had a niece sent to Children's Hospital and the family knew about and used Ronald McDonald House during their stay.

**March, 2011** – Assisting in the opening and sorting of baby items for the Christ's Child organization in Clawson. Several of us spent the evening opening packages and stacking items for ease of assembling the numerous baby layettes that are provided to unwed mothers. At the end of the evening, we assembled a small number of layettes to understand how our work helped the process.

**August, 2011** – 2<sup>nd</sup> trip to Ronald McDonald House for dinner service. We once again provided fried chicken, potato salad and other sides and dessert to the residents. A different group of ladies handled this event (we are limited to 6 volunteers at a time). This has become a rewarding service for our ladies.

**November, 2011** – trip to The Haven home and tour of their facilities. We learned a lot about what was needed. We had a drive to provide donated items for their wish list and those items were delivered as part of the tour taken.

**November, 2011** – at the Advent by Candlelight event, we were able to accumulate food for the Rochester Neighborhood Food Pantry. Those canned goods were delivered the following morning and were available prior to the Thanksgiving season.

**December, 2011** – Once again our ladies chose to donate to charity rather than exchange gifts. We collected monies amongst ourselves to purchase numerous household items for The Haven. We delivered these goods to their drop-off site where they will be sorted and made into a "shopping area". The Haven helps domestically abused women, and shopping for Christmas is difficult if you are not able to go out in public to shop. Our purchases were done by 3 of our members, who made a wonderful time of it. They were able to fill the back of an SUV, and our contribution helped fill the room at the drop-off site.

**December, 2011** – We collected monies to donate to the "Adopt a Girl" program at Vista Maria. This program helps troubled young Catholic girls. We delivered not only the monies, but several "stocking stuffer" type items from their website's list. This included makeup, yarn and crafts, and stuffed animals.

We have also assisted as drivers for the delivery of food many of the months for the Community Soup Kitchen. We have been blessed to feel that we do make a difference. - See how the Holy Spirit guided the apostles in the Truth. Observe the way the Spirit-filled Church adapted to new cultures when proclaiming the Gospel.

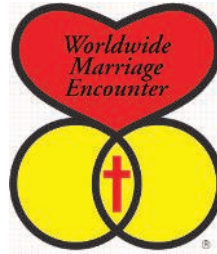
