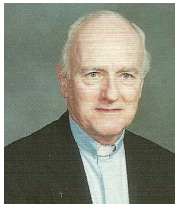

Hello, St. Andrew Parish,
I'm Fr. Joe Gagnon,

A month or so ago,
Msgr. John Zenz asked
me if I would serve as
temporary administrator
of St. Andrew Parish

from January through April. He is pastor of Holy Name Parish, Birmingham, and assists Bishop Arturo Cepeda in moderating the Northwest Region of the Archdiocese.

Unable to think of an adequate reason to refuse, and interested in what the Lord might want me to learn and do at St. Andrew Parish, I agreed to come.

As you know by now, Msgr. Jeffrey Monforton will leave Sacred Heart Major Seminary as rector and come here May 5 as your new pastor.

I was born in Detroit and grew up in Birmingham. Blessed Sacrament School, Detroit, Holy Name School, Birmingham, and U. of D. High School, Detroit, preceded entry in 1953 to Sacred Heart Major Seminary, Detroit. Graduate school in theology followed at St. John's Seminary, Plymouth. Some courses at U. of D. and Wayne State University

were added in. Ordination at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral was June 3, 1961. Mass the following day was at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs Parish, Beverly Hills.

Last June I celebrated 50 years as a priest of the Archdiocese of Detroit. All of my ministry has been in parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit. I live in Marysville, near Port Huron. Social science attracts my interest. I am an amateur regarding the internet. I would probably starve without a microwave.

My parents, Howard and Regina, are deceased. My sisters, Mary and Marge, live in Michigan; Frances lives in Ohio.

I admire Fr. Eugene Strain, your former pastor and recent temporary administrator. He continues to be a real help at St. Andrew Parish. He has already introduced me to Lino's and Papa Joe's.

Your neighbor, Fr. Stan Ulman, pastor of St. Mary of the Hills Parish, Rochester, is a good friend. We worked closely together in MOSES, doing congregation-based community organizing. I am good friends

with Fr. Ed Belczak, pastor of St. Thomas More Parish, Troy. In earlier years, with Fr. Ed prus, we played a lot of handball at the Maple Courts in Troy.

When I celebrated the 8:30 a.m. Mass for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, December 8, I spotted Cecilia and Bill Cunningham coming in slowly from the side door. They recently celebrated their 69th wedding anniversary. I know them from St. Benedict Parish, Highland Park, where I was associate pastor from 1967-1970. I hope they are discreet in what they say about those days.

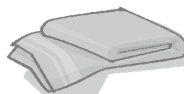

2011 St. Andrew Parish Christian Service & Outreach & You Were There When ...

With the guidance of the Christian Service Commission and Parish volunteers, 2011 was spent trying to meet the needs of people in crisis in many ways both near and far. **St. Andrew Parish** practices stewardship and models this commitment in word, action and financial support! Our 15% parish tithe, even in poor economic times, has not wavered. **Your offerings** have helped over 300 missions/ministries (locally & worldwide) exceed \$200,000. *Thank you* for endorsing the "offering box" instead of "passing a basket." Your outreach effort extends to the poor & vulnerable in volunteer time & talent as described below.

Care & Share donations exceeded \$5,500 and 1,000 lbs. of food & personal care items to pantries & shelters.

Our **St. Vincent dePaul Conference** activities include filling 6 trucks in spring & fall clothing drives. Plus they helped 257 people in crisis. *Our Vincentians are ready to try to assist folks in an emergency situation.*

Visiting Eucharistic Ministers brought Communion to over 2,400 patients at Crittenton Hospital & area nursing homes. (Mass is also celebrated by our priest on a monthly basis)

Operation Sunshine volunteers (12 yrs. and older) visit mentally impaired group homes in Pontiac, once a month, to celebrate birthdays and play BINGO with the residents.

Baldwin Soup Kitchen volunteers (12 yrs. and older) help prepare/serve lunch to over 200 folks twice a month.

Thanksgiving Meals On Wheels prepared and delivered 50 hot meals to the area shut-ins.

Giving Tree 2011 honored the requests of 3,800 under privileged folks from Oakland, Macomb & Wayne counties. Recipients of your generosity were South Oakland Shelter, M.O.R.C., C.P.C., Baldwin Center, Medilodge Nursing Center, Rochester Area Neighborhood House, St. Vincent dePaul families and more!

CPA'S in our parish offer free **Tax Prep Help** in March for those who ask and need it. Call: 248-651-7486 appts.

Easter Basket Outreach ministry provides 230 baskets & gift cards to poor families and 200 plants to nursing home and others during the Easter season.

Rochester Community Kitchen was a site where our volunteers made & served 220 meals to area hungry.

Parish Volunteers are committed and support community programs like Habitat for Humanity, Oakland Co. To bless your home, acquire a piece of chalk, and walk from room to room, symbolizing the Magi travel to Bethlehem, and inscribe above each door, 20+C+M+B+12. The numbers equal the current year and the letters represent the names of the Magi; C is for Casper, M is for Melchior and B is for Balthazar.

The letters are also an acronym for *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless this house."

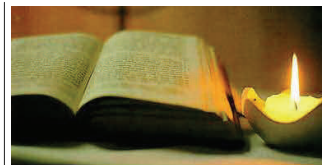

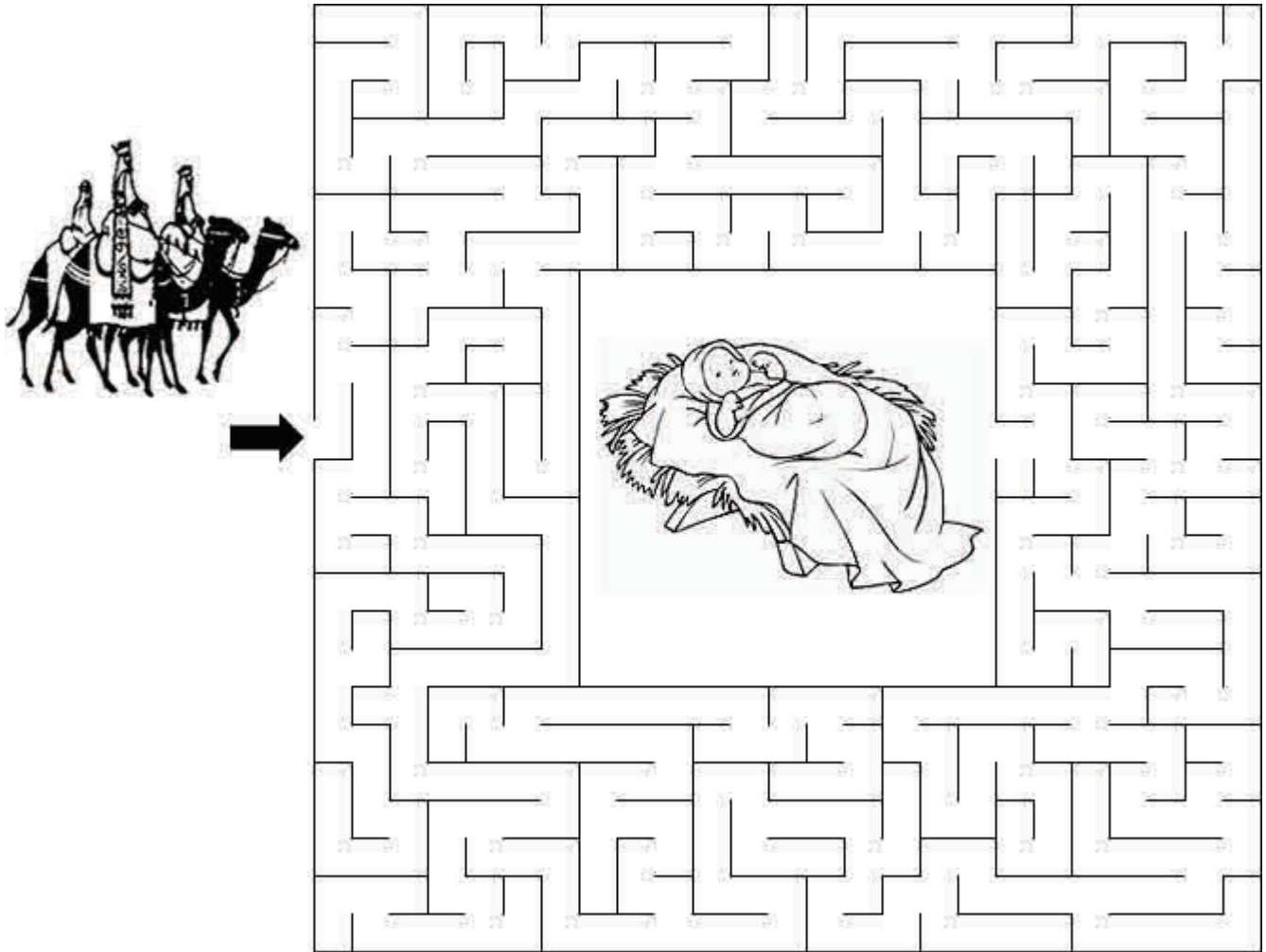
