What do we know and how do we know it? Is what we know really the truth?

We human beings are unique, we think, because we think. We think so automatically we hardly think about it. Thinking is what we do. We often think we know the truth.

A lot of information is at our fingertips. The internet, books, advertising, broadcasts, images and words—all contain information. Whether any or all of it is the truth is another question. Whether or not we understand or retain information, and agree with it, is also another question.

Truth exists whether or not we know or agree with it. In a sense, truth is beyond us. Truth exists whether or not anybody or everybody understands it.

In an ideal world, we human beings would take information, think about it, and then know whether or not it agrees with what is ultimately the truth.

We live, however, in a real world, one that is not ideal. Words and images can be incomplete and/or distorted. Understandings are shaped, colored and sometimes distorted by emotions, experiences, history, intentions, education and environment.

Truth, ultimately, is of God. God is always true; our knowledge is always limited and sometimes mistaken. We reach out to God by faith, seeking to know more clearly and fully what is true about God and our life on this planet. Grounding our faith in the actual word of God is a process developed through prayer, learning, religion and science.

Coming to know real truth is hard work.

### Holy Reading *Lectio Divina*

*You are welcome to join in a group of parishioners and friends, who experience Holy Reading (Lectio Divina). We meet each Saturday morning at 10:30 a.m. right after Centering Prayer.*

January, after all the noise and color of Christmas festivities, is a time for peaceful quiet. Even the outdoor world, except for a few noisy squirrels, is silent. It's a time to appreciate the silence, to read a good book. What better time to get to know Jesus better through Holy Reading - slowly, prayerfully, thoughtfully reading Scripture. Here are some suggestions on how to begin.

(From Thelma Hall, *Too Deep for Words*): "...I prepare for this sacred reading by taking time to quiet my body and mind, in order to bring my whole person into a single focus. Concerning my body: in every prayer discipline, East and West, the one consistent principle common to all is that the spine must be erect, but not tense. Whether sitting on the floor or a cushion, with legs crossed or folded, or on a straight-backed chair, the basic idea is not to impede circulation or breathing, while remaining fully attentive and alert. All such preliminaries are means to help me come to an awareness and conviction of faith that I am about to listen to the living word of God, intimately present to me."

#### Defrosting the Heart?

"If you call right now and leave your email address, we'll send you this life-changing information about making money that others have paid dearly to receive!"

So, are you like me? When one of these commercials comes on the radio or TV, do you sit there and think to yourself, "OK, if they have some big secret about how to make lots of money, why are they giving it away for free?"

There are certain questions in life that EVERYONE is looking for the answer to, but very few people really ever find it. "How do I make more money with less work?" "How do I lose weight without changing what I do or eat?" or "How do I stay young forever?" We WANT the elusive answers to these questions because we think that knowing them would change our lives forever.

Many of us who have truly known and loved Jesus Christ have an equally perplexing question—"How do you 'get' faith?" We see so many people in our world among our friends and family that we WISH could experience the richness, power and joy of life to the full that we have in Christ, but who don't see it. How many Catholic parents worry about their kids who seem to have walked away from their faith? How many of us have had that friend or colleague who clearly need more in their life but refuse to look at Christ standing right in front of them? The Psalm today says, "If today you hear the voice of God, harden not your heart." So, the million-dollar question is: How do we unhardened, defrost or open the hearts of others?

The easy answer is, "We don't—God does." However, as soon as we say that, St. Teresa of Avila complicates the whole matter by reminding us "Christ has no hands on earth now but yours." So, God works through us—so what do we do? There are two events coming up that may help give you some perspective on that. On Sunday, February 12, I will be offering a 2-hour formation topic titled "Evangelization: What is it Really?" This is actually one of the seminars the diocese offers to certify catechists, but I am opening this up to anyone. Also, on Thursday, February 16 representatives from the Archdiocese will present *Will Our Kids Have Faith?*, which presents groundbreaking research about what factors are most important when it comes to young people holding on to what they have been given. Please join us for one or both!

## Let's Talk

The popular music group Coldplay has a lyric that says "Oh brother, I can't get through, I've been trying hard to reach you, but I can't get through." Is this God talking to us? The eighth grade students gathered in the Multi-Purpose Room to practice ways to talk to and listen to God—Prayer.

Recognizing that there is no wrong way to pray (except as an eighth grader said "not to do it at all"), we

sometimes need help in saying what is in our hearts.

Some of the techniques we try are well known, like guided meditation and scripture reading, others are less well known. Have you ever tried body prayer? (see

picture) Ask an eighth grader how this is done. Have you ever listened to music and the message seemed directed to you? Maybe it was! When you want to pray, and the words won't come, have you ever tried doodling? Next time several of your friends give you the same advice, perhaps it is God trying to get through. Listen.

In this very busy world that we live in, taking time to pray can be as simple as just doing things that we are already doing (talking to friends, listening to music, drawing a picture) with new purpose. Just remember there is no wrong way to pray "except not to do it at all".

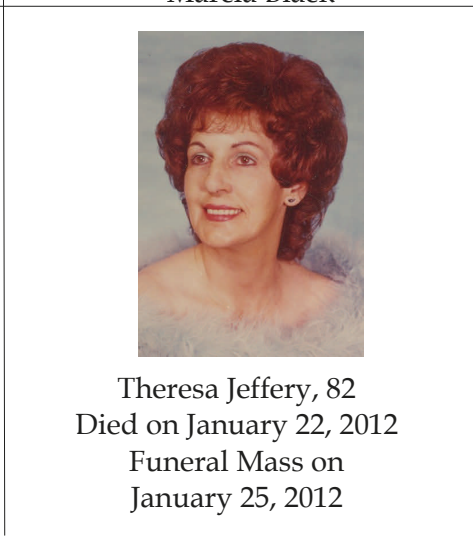

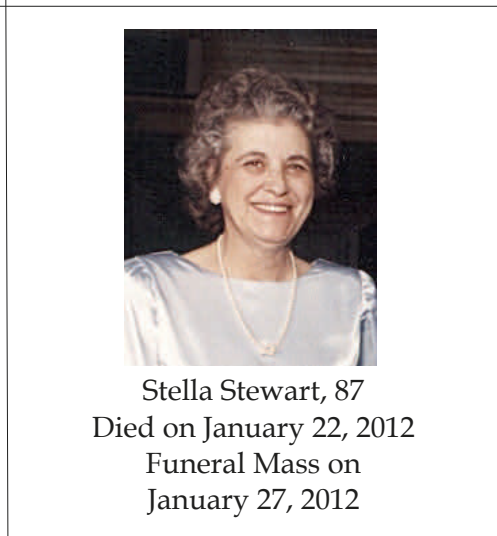
