14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples out to announce the kingdom of God. This was not a move for political power (though some saw it that way) or even for earthly success. It was not even so much a rebellion against the past as a fulfillment of promises made by God long ago. "The kingdom of God is at hand for you," the disciples proclaimed.

The message of Jesus has lasted far longer than nations or kingdoms. Christ is not allied with any government or political faction. God's kingdom exists apart from any political boundaries or human limitations. As Christians, we recognize our responsibility to seek justice and peace. Our calling is to promote the common good, even at the expense of our own self-interest. While we celebrate independence, we also understand that liberty does not mean unfettered license to do what we please. The kingdom of God is not so much a place of individual right as one of communal responsibility. And as citizens of that kingdom we submit ourselves to the law of love for God and for our neighbor.

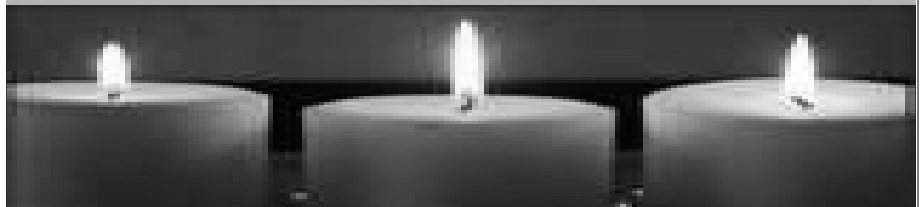

A Stewardship Parable – In Four Parts...**Stewardship****Part I**

There was a certain Professor of Religion named Dr. Christianson, a studious man who taught at a small college in the Western United States. Dr. Christianson taught the required survey course in Christianity. Every student was required to take this course his or her freshman year regardless of his or her major. Although Dr. Christianson tried hard to communicate the essence of the gospel in his class, he found that most of his students looked upon the course as nothing but required drudgery. Despite his best efforts, most students refused to take Christianity seriously.

This year, Dr. Christianson had a special student named Steve. Steve was only a freshman, but was studying with the intent of going on to seminary for the ministry. Steve was popular, he was well liked, and he was an imposing physical specimen. He was now the starting center on the school football team, and was the best student in the professor's class.

One day, Dr. Christianson asked Steve to stay after class so he could talk with him. "How many push-ups can you do?" Steve said, "I do about 200 every night." "200? That's quite impressive, Steve," Dr. Christianson said. "Do you think you could do 300?" Steve replied, "I don't know...I've never done 300 at a time." "Do you think you could?" Dr. Christianson asked again. "Well, I can try," said Steve. "Could you do 300 in sets of 10? I have a class project in mind and I need you to do about 300 pushups in sets of ten for this to work. Can you do it? I need you to tell me you can do it," said the professor.

Steve said, "Well... I think I can...yeah, I can do it." Dr. Christianson said, "Good! I need you to do this on Friday. Let me explain what I have in mind." After he explained, Steve was only too glad to help.

Leave a Legacy

What does the phrase "leave a legacy" really mean? We may have frequently heard it or read it and decided that it really didn't apply to someone like us. One definition of a legacy is "something passed down by an ancestor". Most of us are already leaving a legacy as we pass our faith on to our children and grandchildren. Others of us are leaving legacies of good works in our parish and community as we donate out time and talents by serving others. Some of us may also want to leave a legacy of our treasure to help others but are uncertain about how to do it. It is easier than you may think. Here are some simple and easy ways to leave a legacy of treasure:

... A direct bequest to St Andrew Church can easily be made by adding a codicil to a will or an amendment to a trust. The bequest can be a specific dollar amount or a percentage of an estate's total value. You can leave bequests to more than one charity by executing a simple change to your will or trust.

... An IRA or an annuity can have more than one beneficiary. For example, the IRA or annuity owner might direct that 90% of the account go to his children and 10% to a named charity.

... A life insurance policy may also have more than one beneficiary. It is a good idea to review beneficiary designations periodically anyway to make sure they are current. Your financial advisor or insurance agent can quickly provide you with the forms to make a beneficiary change at no cost to you.

... Charitable lead or remainder trusts may be appropriate for individuals who want to continue to receive income from their investments but leave the principal amount to a charity. You can also fund a trust that directs current income to a charity but leaves the principal to a different beneficiary like a family member.

It is easier than you may think to leave a lasting legacy that will continue to benefit parishioners of St Andrew Church for many years to come. Before implementing any of these strategies, you should discuss them with your own advisors to see if they are appropriate for you and your family.

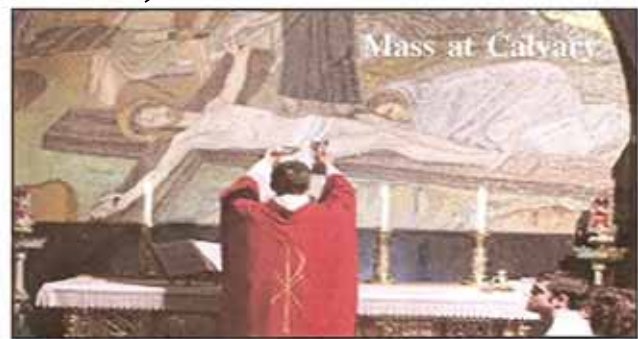
