Internet Sabbath

This is part of an article that appeared in the San Francisco Chronicle about a café owner who asked patrons to log off and engage in conversation. I thought these few paragraphs were worth our consideration. You can read the entire article by Carolyn Jones at <http://scrippsnews.com/content/cafe-owner-forces-customers-talk-each-other>.

Technology-free time is critical these days, especially as the cascade of new gadgets lures people into near-constant distraction, said Ken Goldberg, director of Berkeley's Center for New Media. It's now socially acceptable to text during dinner parties or stand alone at a party and check e-mail - actions that not long ago would have been considered unspeakably rude, he said. The result of having the world available at our fingertips, and likewise always being available to the world, is a general devaluation of information, ourselves and personal relationships, he said. Constant availability creates a world of little intensity or differentiation, a "beige existence" where people hop from one distraction to the next without focusing on real people or actual ideas. Paying attention, being patient, listening to people and concentrating on an idea not easily expressed in 140 characters are skills we're in danger of losing unless we learn to occasionally unplug, Goldberg said. Ancient rabbis knew this, he said. They insisted on one day a week, the Sabbath, free of distractions like electricity. We need to instate our own Internet Sabbath, Goldberg said.

Reflect On This ...

May 30, is Most Holy Trinity Sunday. I am reminded of a Spiritual Director at Sacred Heart Seminary, who would periodically ask me—**Who (which person of the Trinity) do I (you) pray to?** Recalling that we are a monotheistic faith community, I would always need time to reflect on how I pray and to whom I call upon. Do I begin prayer in a child/parent mode by praying to **God as father** and creator? Thus thanking Him for the blessings/gifts he has bestowed on me and the world. Do I pray the **Jesus Prayer**? When I reread the Gospel passages where Jesus is close to me as true God/true man? When Christ tells us *to ask and we shall receive*? Or do I sit quietly in meditation (emptying myself); waiting for the **Holy Spirit** to come and fill me? Waiting to receive or recognize my gifts from the Holy Spirit?

I hope my prayer is not so rushed that I don't know who or how I pray. The Holy Trinity is a mystery of relationship. Let us never become so busy that we neglect our relationship with the Lord. *Pray always & all ways!*

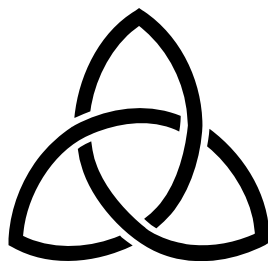

Forgiveness is difficult when we feel we are being taken for granted. Our offender hurt us the first time and we forgave him. Then he wrongs us again, and we forgive again. The third time he does something else, and like previous times we forgive. The offender sees a pattern emerging.

A good person will appreciate the Christian attitude and try to emulate us., or at least try to be nice and do his best not to hurt us again. Should we be silent while being hurt repeatedly or refuse to forgive this person anymore? Neither is a good option.

God has not called us to be abused again & again. We will fall apart after a while. While we continue to forgive, we must use the powerful weapon **God gave us—Wisdom!** *Be wise...*use wisdom to avoid abuse or misuse in your relationships. This reduces the potential hurt you may have to bear. God will be pleased.

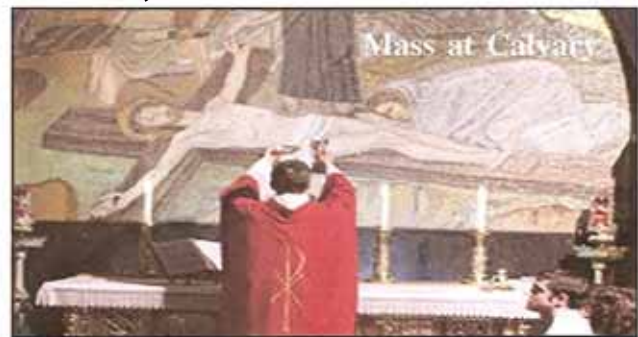

The Holy Land Itinerary*

Day 1 Departure from the United States.

Day 2 Arrival in Tel Aviv's modern Ben Gurion Airport and transfer to Galilee. Dinner then evening Mass at the Primacy of Peter Church on

the Sea of Galilee. Steve will give a short talk on the shore, then overnight in Tiberias.

Day 3 Ascend the Mount of Transfiguration (Mt. Tabor) early to miss the crowds; then to Wedding Church in Cana for Renewal of Wedding Vows. After lunch Visit Nazareth, especially the Church of Annunciation for Mass at the Grotto of Annunciation. Visit House of the Holy Family. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Day 4 Mount of Beatitudes for Mass. On to Caesarea Philippi. Lunch at Druze Restaurant. Drive through Golan Heights; view the Syrian border. Visit Tabgha where Jesus multiplied loaves and fishes. Dinner at Aberge Shulamit. Overnight in Tiberias.

Day 5 Visit the Ancient "Jesus Boat" then boat ride on Sea of Galilee. Drive to Capernaum for Mass at St. Peter's House and the synagogue where Jesus said "Eat My Flesh!" St. Peter's fish for lunch. Renew Baptismal Vows in the Jordan River. Drive through the Jordan Valley to Jerusalem and just before we get there we stop at Ein Karem to visit the Church of the Visitation. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 6 High Mass at the Tomb of Christ in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. After breakfast drive to Bethlehem for shopping. Visit Sheperd's Field, Church of the Nativity where Jesus was born. Lunch at Christmas Tree Restaurant. Back to Jerusalem to visit Temple Model and Shrine of the Book at the Israel Museum. Steve's talk on the Israeli-Palestinian situation. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 7 Drive to the Mt. of Olives to visit the Church of Pater Noster. Palm Sunday procession to Dominos Flevit where Jesus wept and further down the mountain to the Garden of Gethsemane for Mass. Promenade scenic view and lunch. Drive to Mt. Zion to visit the Church of the Dormition and the Upper Room ending at the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 8 Carry crosses along the Via Dolorosa arriving for Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, then breakfast. Visit the Church of St. Anne where Mary was born and the Pools of Bethesda. Enter through the Dung Gate to pray at the Western Wall. Free afternoon. Optional tour of the Shroud of Turin Exhibit and extra shopping. Farewell dinner in Bethlehem. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 9 Free day for shopping, prayer, rest, or optional side trips. We offer an Optional Excursion (tour escort will advise price) to Qumran, Masada, Jericho and swimming in the Dead Sea with lunch at the Temptation Restaurant. We also have Sammie the Camel ready to give you a ride. Mass at Notre Dame Chapel and dinner. Blessing of all the Rosaries and other religious items.
