On The Journey

+This weekend, the first reading and the Gospel focus on the gift of prophecy given to both Jeremiah and Jesus to bring a particular message from God to the people. Perhaps prophecy is one of the most difficult gifts to receive from God, because, as we can see from the readings, good prophets are not always welcome, either in their native place, as Jesus discovered, or in places that receive difficult or challenging messages from God. But while prophets might not receive accolades from the people to whom they are sent, they do receive the assurance that God is with them to give them the strength and courage they need in their mission.

This assurance is implicit in our Rite of Baptism. By our baptism, we are anointed priest, prophet and king. That is our mission; these are the roles we have in evangelizing the world. Saint Paul gives us some insight into this. No matter what other gifts we might have, we are called to use them and the opportunities God gives us in love – for God and the good of others, and for the salvation of the world. The kind of love that Paul calls us to is challenging; it is not meant simply to enrich us, make us “feel good” or inflate our egos. It is meant to benefit the other, to focus on what’s best for the other person.

This is our challenge as Catholic Christians: to couch everything we do, all the spiritual gifts we bring to the Church, to our families or to our workplaces, with the gift of love, of practical concern for the benefit of others. It is the challenge that comes to us in our Archdiocese in a special way through the workings of the Holy Spirit, the efforts put forth at the Synod 16, and summarized in the pastoral letter Unleash the Gospel, written by the Archbishop as a summary of all the previous efforts. It is a daunting task, but we need not be afraid, for the Lord will not abandon us in our efforts as we move forward.

As we go about the rest of the coming week, let’s remember to ask God for the special spiritual gift of love to accompany everything we do, to spread the Good News, and help each other on the journey!

+The other week, Archbishop Vigneron met with the priests of the Archdiocese at Sacred Heart Major Seminary. At the meeting, he and other key staff (primarily Fr. Steve Pullis) addressed the upcoming plans for ALL parishes with regard to the next phase of our Unleash the Gospel efforts.

This will encompass each parish working on putting together a “strategic plan” for itself in light of the areas of concern that were brought up at the Synod and summarized in the Archbishop’s pastoral letter. While it will be a period of prayerful thought, discussions and work for us, I look forward to it being a way of “re-imaging” parish ministries and renewed efforts as we move forward into this new millennium of our faith journey! We have already worked on and submitted a plan for Holy Family Regional School; now the effort will be to get ready to do the same for the parish. I envision us having a mini “synod-type” of gathering here at the parish to further collect input from our part of God’s vineyard here at St. Andrew, and work in putting together our plan to offer more faith opportunities for our spiritual growth and development. I will keep you all posted as this all unfolds and takes on a more firm structure to help us in moving forward.

+It is certainly cold as I write this, and it is still snowing as I look out the windows. I had the parish operations close at 12:30 p.m. earlier today (I am writing this on late Monday afternoon.), with only the maintenance crew standing by to take care of some snow removal. We wish him well and anxiously (I especially!!) await his return, because then, I will be leaving for two weeks to check on the palms in Florida at my usual location on the Gulf Coast around Port Charlotte. (Nothing but the best palms for our parish!) Go easy on the ol’ pastor this coming week! See you in church!

St. Josephine Bakhita
1869-1947
Feast Day: February 8

Born in 1869 in a small village in the Darfur region of Sudan, Bakhita was kidnapped by slave traders at the age of 7. So terrified she could not even remember her own name, her kidnappers gave her the name

“Bakhita,” which means “fortunate” in Arabic.

She was tortured by her various owners, suffering especially during her adolescent years. Despite not knowing Christ or the redemptive nature of suffering, she bore her pain valiantly.

Eventually she was purchased by the Italian consul Calisto Legnani, who later gave her to a friend of the family, Augusto Michieli, who brought her to Italy as a nanny to his daughter. In the Italian families was the first time she was not mistreated.

While she was with the Michieli family she discovered the Crucified Christ through the gift of a small silver crucifix, given to her by the family’s estate manager. This was her first introduction to Jesus, whom she called “The Good Master.” In 1888, when she was almost 20 years old, she and the Michieli daughter were sent to be guests at the Institute of the Catechumens run by the Canossian Sisters in Venice. There she began her journey of faith.

Soon after she was baptized, taking the name Josephine Margaret. Desiring to dedicate her life to God, she won a legal battle to remain in Italy and entered the Canossians in 1896.

She dedicated the rest of her life to assisting her community and teaching others to love God. She died on Feb. 8, 1947. St. Josephine was beatified in 1992 and canonized in 2000 by St. John Paul II. She is the first person to be canonized from Sudan and is the patron saint of the country and all victims of human trafficking.



I know some people expressed disappointment that they were not able to attend the teaching on the Mass. As many of you know, St. Andrew has given the gift of Formed.org to every parishioner. If you haven’t signed up yet simply go to www.standrewrochester.formed.org to set up your account. Last week I found a new series on the Elements of the Catholic Mass. The series consists of 31 videos, but most are fairly short running anywhere between 2-6 minutes in length. While I have only watched the first fifteen videos, they are well done. I encourage those who are interested in learning more about the Mass, but may not have time to take on a lengthy study or attend a class at the seminary, to sign in and check out this series on Formed. I used the graphic for the series as the header above to help you find it on their website. Right now it is prominently on the home page under highly acclaimed series. I hope you check it out.

Hearing Assist Devices

Did you know that St. Andrew has Hearing Assist Devices available for use during Mass? These devices amplify the sounds in the church enabling those using the devices to better hear the presider, the readings, and the music. They may be used even if you already have a hearing aid. If you would like to borrow one of the units while you are at Church, they are available in the East Sacristy. Please see one of the ushers or a Mass Coordinator to sign one out.

FAITH FORMATION

Somewhat Famous

Did you ever wonder what it would be like to be famous? You go out and make it big, then return home. Maybe you are treated like royalty, or maybe you're still expected to walk the dog, clean the bathroom, and take out the trash.

In today's Gospel, when Jesus spoke in his home town, the people were amazed at first. But then, after realizing he was just the son of Joseph the carpenter, they drove him out. They were not ready to believe that the boy who grew up around them was anything special. They needed to be able to see him with different eyes, in new ways.

Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families by Kerstin Keber Smith suggests an activity to do at home to help look at people with different eyes. Have everyone make statements about family members that they feel are true. For example, mom makes the best pancakes, or little sister is very gentle with pets. Only positive statements, please. Let the person about whom the statement is made respond to the perception. After everyone has participated, discuss what it's like to be seen through the eyes of others. Did you learn more about one another? Then, ask family members to say something about themselves they think no one else realizes.

Can we open our eyes to see the world differently, not just in the complacent ways we've always viewed it? As we see people and events anew, we may be more likely to see the presence of God in each other and all around us.
