On The Journey

+Weddings are joyous occasions which express our desire for a full and happy life. It hopefully comes about as the result of our prayerful discernment as to how God is calling each of us to love in life – as a single person or as a married person.

The image of a wedding is frequently used throughout the Old Testament to describe God's relationship with his chosen people – Israel. Though often unfaithful, God always took her back, forgave her and turned her sadness into joy. As she awaited the coming of the Messiah, Israel's hopes were expressed in terms of a wedding – a time of great rejoicing and celebration. Like abundant wine, God's blessings would be poured out on this people in full measure.

As we hear the account of the miracle at Cana, it is hard not to notice the shadow of the cross. Like all of Jesus' signs and miracles, this points to the greatest of all his signs: when He will be lifted up in obedience to the Father, for the salvation of humanity. This will be how the new covenant-marriage between God and his people will be brought about. Here Jesus speaks about his *hour* – a reference to that time when his truest identity and glory will be revealed.

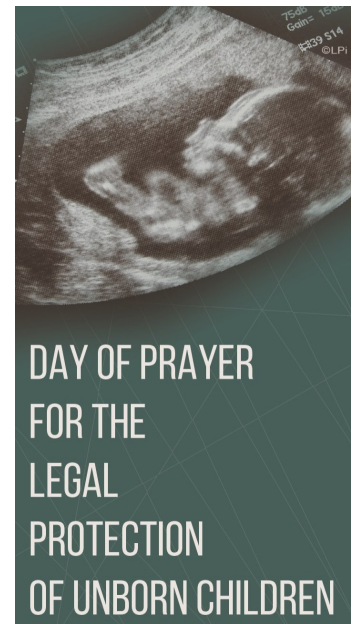
Significantly also, Jesus' mother is present at the wedding. In addressing her as *woman*, a title He will also use from the cross, Jesus is referring back to another woman, through whom sin first entered the world. Now, through *this* woman – Mary, his mother – the healing of that sin will begin in her Son.

For Christians, the cross is the ultimate blessing, as it is the source of eternal life. So the 120-180 gallons of wine is indicative of the inexhaustible riches of God poured out on the faithful believer. Just as a wedding is a sign of who we are and what we hope for, so the miracle of Cana is a sign of what God offers us if we put our faith and trust in Him.

Through the death and resurrection of his Son, God offers us more than we could ever hope. In addition to the gifts of the Spirit as listed by Saint Paul in Corinthians, God offers us the fullness of life and love. It is through faith that the water of our daily lives with all its challenges and achievements can be transformed into something far superior, full-bodied and with a deep quality and bouquet. Through faith our lives gain a new depth and meaning if we simply do as Mary says: *Do whatever He (Jesus) tells you.*

Through the glory of God – shining through his Son, Jesus – motivate us to truly be joyful missionary disciples of the Good News in our world today!

We need to continue to pray for an end to abortion in our country – and throughout the world, recognizing that this precious gift of life that is given to us from God is something to be treasured, cared for, and treated with all dignity and respect that we can muster!

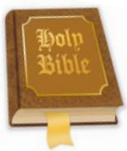

How Money Buys Happiness

Money can buy many things. One of the things people tend to keep off the list of what it can buy is happiness. I strongly believe that money can buy happiness. Have you ever given an extra amount for a tip? What about giving money at a fundraiser or at church? What about treating someone to dinner or buying them a tool or appliance they've been lacking? All of these moments tend to bring a smile to our faces. They are also moments where we used our money for someone else.

Many people think that they don't need to donate until they have "enough money" to donate comfortably. But in the Gospel of Mark, Jesus says "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." Those who lack money have a great opportunity to donate through the poverty. We don't need to wait to be successful to do amazing things for God. When it comes to donating, God will provide for you. Matthew 6:26 reads "Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not more important than they?" These two passages really hit me when I started this youth ministry position.

If I was supposed to be leading teens, I felt I needed to commit to donating an amount of money each month. I even made a budget for how much I was to give. I would use it to donate to charities, pay for a friend's lunch, give an extra tip, buy supplies for the church, etc. After a few months it became my favorite money to spend. As the month ended I'm looking up different organizations that I could help. There was so much joy that came from it. Since that money is already allocated to others, when someone asks for donations and the organization aligns with what I believe, I donate. The more I gave, the less I worried about money. It stopped running my life because I trusted God would provide.

My encouragement is do it. Start with donating to people/organizations that you instantly see an impact in. The more you give, the less you worry about money. Give and see your happiness levels increase. :)

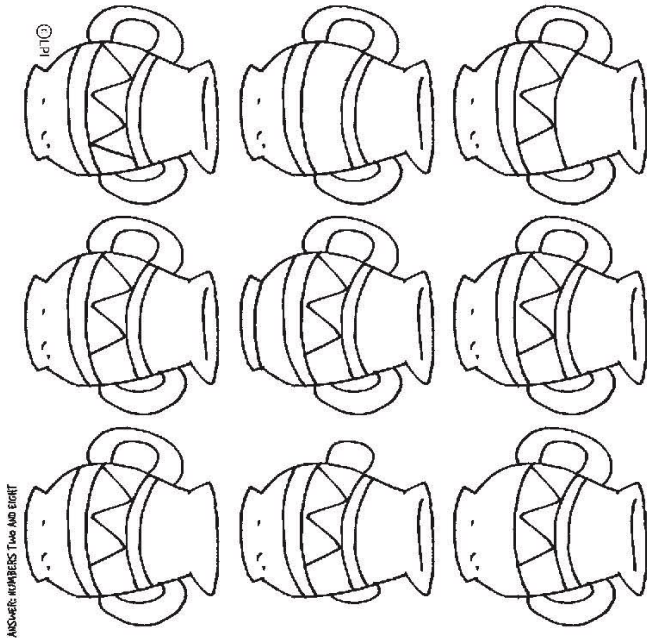

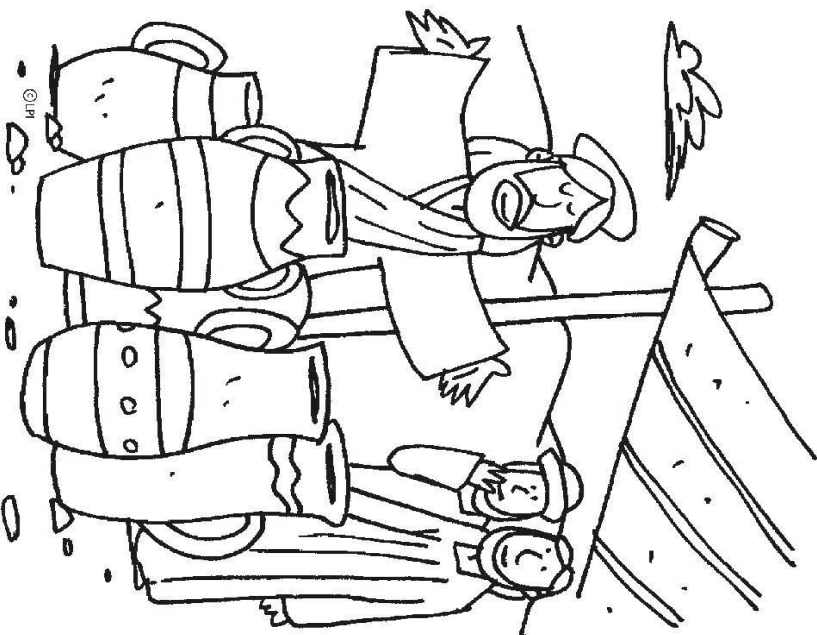

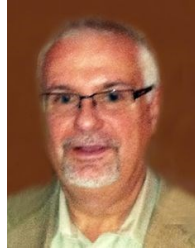
