On The Journey

+We, as the body of Christ, celebrate our faith just as millions of people before us have done for two thousand years. We hear our salvation story proclaimed to us in the Scriptures, and when we celebrate the Eucharist. We remember that the body of Christ includes all of those who came before us, and all those across the world right now who profess the same creed. It will continue to include all who are baptized into the faith and who strive to follow the commandment of the Lord to love one another. For as Saint Paul says today, *in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.*

One faith, one baptism, one body. But infinite individuality: with unique gifts, charisms, and missions all for the sake of the body. All with a purpose designed and graced by God. All with honor and dignity for the sake of the Gospel. And all of this is possible because of God's laws and promises: the law as a means of signifying that God is *for* us. God will work for us, He will fight for us, He will take care of us and we will delight in his laws if we will only trust in Him. And God's promises that adhering to the laws will bring full, lasting and eternal joy.

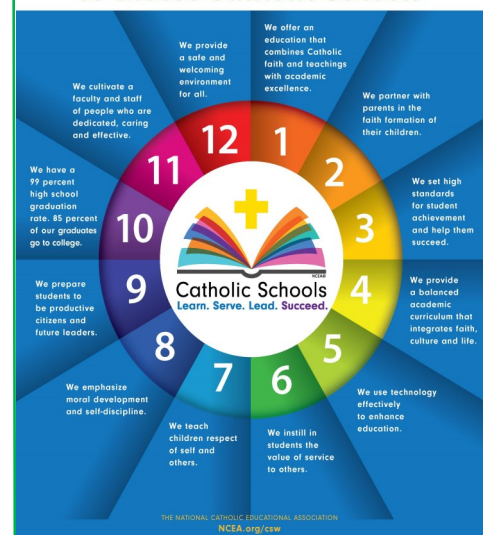
This is what the community of Nehemiah heard and understood when Ezra read to them, as told in our first reading today. They wept first with lament at their failures and then with joy in their understanding of God's love for them, and his promises of redemption.

Then in our Gospel from Luke, we see that promise fulfilled, as the scene echoes that of Nehemiah: Jesus reads to the community from the scrolls of Scripture, *The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.* Then He finishes with these words: *Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing.*

This is the God to whom we belong. This is the Christ who fulfills the law of love and embodies the promise of eternal life. As others before us had their purpose: Ezra and Nehemiah to lead others out of exile, Paul to evangelize the Gospel, and Luke to make record of Jesus' ministry, so do each and every one of us have our own specific, unique contributions to make to the body of Christ. All while mindful that,

as Paul says, *If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy.*

We are one body, one spirit in Christ. May the grace of the Eucharist we celebrate strengthen each one of us, and the entire body as a whole – for the good of the world and the greater glory of God.

+Thanks to the Knights of Columbus for hosting the “Desert Meal” in support of the seminarians’ trip overseas to walk in the footsteps of Jesus. Hopefully conditions allow this to take place, but we all know how volatile a place the Middle East can be (my class at the seminary was the first not allowed to go, due to the conflicts which erupted back in 1991). I thank all the parishioners who attend, and support their efforts for their generosity!

+Despite the cold, work continues on the building, and specifically on the inside of the east foyer. (On Monday, it was just too cold for the masons to any work on setting blocks on the west side.) We are still on track to get that space open by the end of February, so keep your prayers going! Whenever they can, the masons will work up front, and I expect with the roller coaster temperatures this week, some work will continue on the west side, but maybe not every day.

Some CSA/Building pledges continue to come in; right now, it appears that just over \$760K has been pledged/donated, which would result in a total refund of a little over \$415K should all be paid. My grateful praise for your sacrifices, my humble gratitude for your commitment to our project, and my continuing prayers, asking God to bless you for making this a reality for our parish family!

Just a reminder when in the parking lots, especially on the weekend, please be watchful! We had one mishap last Monday, when a contractor backed into a lighting pylon; the work will be repaired and paid for by others, not us. **Please be careful as you maneuver around the property.** I surely don’t want to see anyone hurt; it’s a little tougher to get around now in the cold and with snow on the ground.

+Please remember to keep our second graders in your special prayers over the next couple weeks as they approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time over the next two Saturdays. What a wonderful experience of God’s love and mercy for these little ones!

+This Sunday is Open House at Holy Family Regional School, here at the north/St. Andrew campus, starting at 11 a.m. Thus, no coffee & donuts, since we anticipate a good-size crowd and need the parking spaces. If interested, or you would just like to see what’s going on in the grade school, please feel free to stop by!

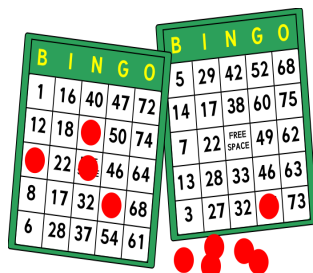

The Mercy of Purgatory

Most Christians believe that at the end of our lives we go to Heaven or Hell...they forget that there is a third place, purgatory. Not to be confused with Limbo (a place Catholics believed non-baptized babies went after death that was theologically disproven by Pope Benedict XVI), Purgatory is the place for the people who need purification before fully entering Heaven. Why can't God just let us into Heaven?

Imagine you are invited to the White House Correspondents Dinner (black tie event with the President), and on your way to the event you got a flat, and as you changed the tire you tear your tuxedo and the grease that started on your hands has worked its way on your white shirt, the tie, your face, and even your hair. As you arrive you feel out of place and want to leave, but someone calls you over and says they have a back room to get cleaned up and there is a full tuxedo waiting for you...even nicer than the original. Then once you suit up it is time to enter fully into the White House event. That's why God created Purgatory. It's not for us to suffer, but to cleanse our soul so that we can fully enter Heaven as the perfect version of ourselves.

It is through God's mercy that Purgatory exists. He doesn't want us to be in such awe that we feel insecure about ourselves. He is the ultimate form of perfection. Many people are under this fallacy that they will feel comfortable with their God because why wouldn't they? Have you ever felt intimidated by someone for no reason? Maybe their title, how they conduct themselves, how everyone else loves them, or something else really irks you? You get annoyed with how nice and welcoming they are? Well, if that failed human makes you feel inferior, imagine literally being surrounded by perfection.

Purgatory doesn't sound like a fun place. There is a lot of suffering that happens there. But there's a lot of suffering that happens in the gym, yet people are committed to going because it helps them. Think of Purgatory like the gym; there's suffering that happens there, but it's with a purpose. "Because gold is tested with fire, and acceptable people are tested in the furnace of humiliation. Trust him, and he will help you." Sirach 2:5

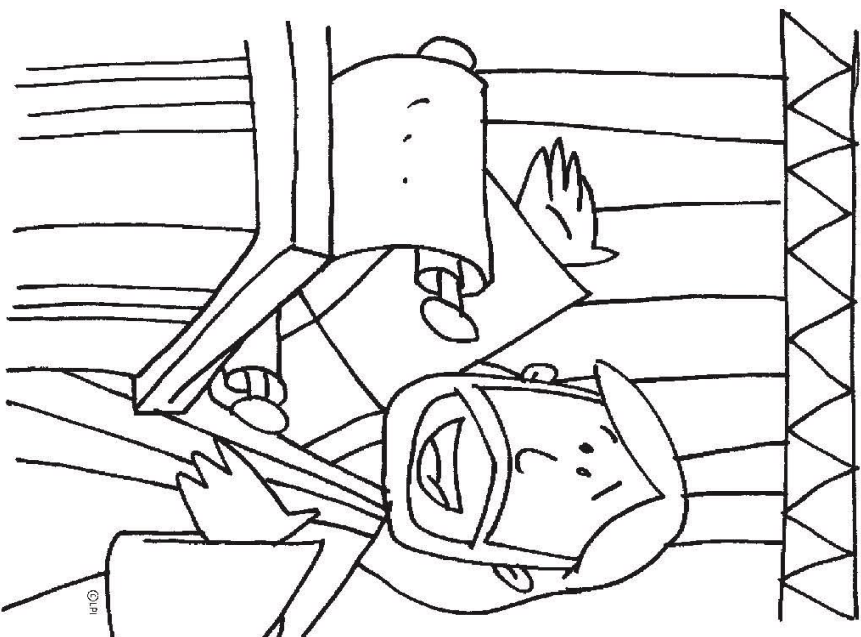

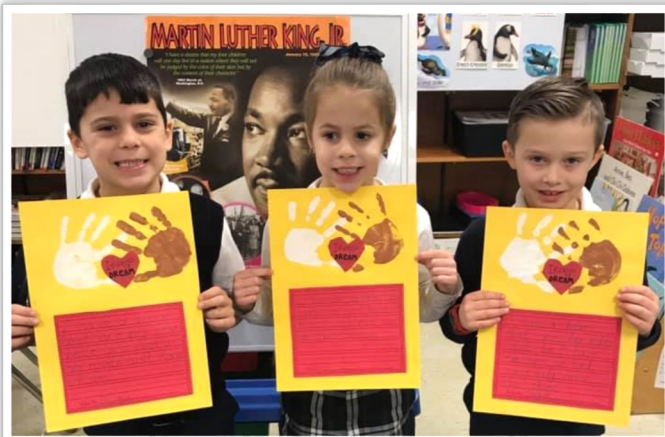
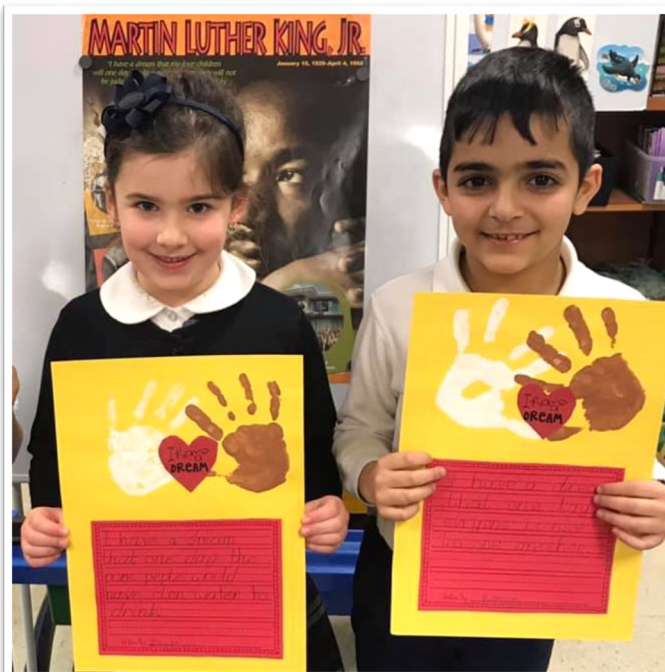
