On The Christmas Journey Into the New Year

+As we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany, we hear the familiar story of the Magi. The Magi helped to make known God's presence in the world in a particular way. They are the first visible and tangible recipients of the mystery of which Saint Paul speaks. A mystery now revealed...by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel.

We are often so enamored by this familiar story of expectation, wonder, joy and faithful homage that we may forget something essential to the importance of the story: the Magi were not Jewish. They were Gentiles. They were not children of Abraham, people of the Covenant, or Israelites. They were "foreigners," most likely Persian, whose religious affiliation and actual occupation have not yet been settled by biblical scholarship.

Yet, they knew about Jesus. They knew about the coming of the Messiah. And they had the fearlessness to approach the Roman-appointed King of Judea – that is, Herod, then the current "king of the Jews," and ask him: Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do Him homage. Asking such a question – essentially implying Herod's successor and perhaps even deposer – could have been inferred as a threat, if not outright treason. But that did not deter the Magi in their quest.

Their journey in faith, and their strength in following God's prompts and witnessing to his faithfulness, is a model for our own discipleship. With one exception: God is *already* made manifest to us – we do not have to seek Him out; He seeks *us* out. And when we respond to his call, there are things we can count on – as if they were a star in the sky – to help us make our way to Him: his word; his sacraments; his grace; and the gifts He has given us that we might in turn offer back to Him. We are not alone in this endeavor.

As the Magi were a community of support for each other, so we, too, gather in our St. Andrew parish family as a community of support and belief. We gather in many different ways because we have heard about the coming of the Messiah and we wish to offer our gifts to Him. Gifts that will be returned to us in the gift of Christ's Body

Epiphany Home Blessing on January 6, 2019

From the east come the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh as a symbol of His burial. The blessing of the home, and the inscription of the initials of the three Magi at each entrance door, is an old Epiphany custom that is still practiced by some today. Using specially blessed chalk, many families mark above the entrance door of their homes with the year and with the inscription CMB, the initials of the traditional names of the

Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar (example: 20+C+M+B+19). The inscription really stands for Christus Mansionem Benedicat, Latin for "Christ, bless this house."


Use the chalk to write above the entrance to your home:

$$20 + C + M + B + 19$$

As you are writing pray the following:

O Lord, God Almighty, we ask Your blessing on this home and all who dwell within. Grant that if it be Your will, we may enjoy physical and mental health and Your spiritual protection. May all who visit our home this year rejoice to find You dwelling among us. May we seek to serve You forever and ever, through Christ our Lord. Amen




