On The Journey

+Don't we all sometimes wonder when we see someone behave a certain way, "What, don't they know that's not right?" Or, "Why didn't they know better?" We witness so many actions and decisions that are contrary to what we expect of people, or that go against what we know to be right and wrong.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us "Every institution is inspired, at least implicitly, by a vision of humanity and our destiny, from which it derives the point of reference for its judgment, its hierarchy of values, its line of conduct (CCC 2244). There are rules for living properly in the world. We have federal laws and state regulations. But these are external rules. These rules do not form us. They can show some things, but it is from God that we properly learn how to act in the world. God's instructions show us how we can be our best selves.

How does God guide us? Listen to the words of Jesus in the Gospel reading from Luke this weekend. This is a great place to start.

The Beatitudes are the heart of Jesus' preaching. They tell us to love our enemies and love our neighbor. At the core of the sermon is Jesus' teaching on love. This love is characterized by forgiveness and generosity. These are characteristic of the Christian life. They offer us hope in the midst of trials and tests. And they show us what is already ours by virtue of our salvation through Christ. They help us to see the fullness of our lives as God designs it. According to the Catechism, "The Beatitudes respond to the natural desire for happiness. This desire is of divine origin: God has placed it in the human heart in order to draw us to the One who alone can fulfill it" (CCC 1718).

Just as there are consequences to disobeying rules and laws in our society, so, too, there are negative repercussions from straying from God's vision of human happiness. Unlike Matthew's Gospel, Luke gives four "woes" after his description of the Beatitudes. These woes are reminiscent of the cries of impending distress used by the Old Testament prophets.

Luke depicts Jesus as fulfilling the same prophetic role to warn that disaster comes upon those whose worldly comfort and prosperity has turned them away from God and fidelity to the demands of his covenant. The woes remind us that satisfaction in worldly wealth and prestige can give us a false sense of security and lead us to overlook our radical dependence on God's mercy.

Today, let us heed God's warnings about the dangers of a life lived apart from his grace, and follow the path of blessing and human flourishing He has chartered for us in the Beatitudes.

+Speaking of "human life flourishing," a truly sad event recently took place in the state of New York, where the state legislature and governor passed the so-called Reproductive Health Act (RHA) which will expand abortion under the pretenses of choice and progress, which in fact, it will do little to enhance. The bishop of the diocese of Albany, NY, went so far as to state: "Once truth is separated from fiction and people come to realize the impact of the bill, they will be shocked to their core."

Commonly referred to by pro-lifers as the "Death Star" bill, the RHA legislation "goes far beyond Roe v. Wade in its aggressive extremism." Several of its provisions are sadly and astoundingly shocking, such as "granting non-doctors permission to perform abortions" (which does nothing to advance the security and health of women); "condone coerced or involuntary abortions by repealing criminal sanctions even in cases where a perpetrator seeks to make his partner 'un-pregnant' through an act of physical violence" (certainly doesn't sound like any kind of progress in the choice, safety or health of women); "remove protection for an infant accidentally born alive during an abortion" (which is abject cruelty, something that most people of conscience would deem inhumane for even a dog or cat); and finally "allowing late-term abortions" (which is, in essence, granting a 'license to kill' a pre-born child at will).

This legislation has ended many criminal penalties and seems to be sending a message that 'abortion is a medical procedure, not a crime.' And we wonder why society has come to a point of senseless violence and killing.....just where is the regard for the sanctity of human life? Society can and MUST do better, and as Pope Francis always reminds all people of faith that "....our mission is to support the lives of all, especially the voiceless, the most vulnerable and marginalized."

Brothers and sister in the Lord, we must pray for an end to abortion, and work to end this 'culture of death' in our country, banding together to build a more humane society for the lives of all of God's family. It's part of what truly *Unleashing the Gospel* impels us to do as a band of joyful missionary disciples of Christ.

+I want to thank those who participated and helped support Holy Family Regional School last weekend with the annual gala! It was a wonderful gathering at the Royal Park Hotel, and a generous crowd who donated toward the efforts of their academic, athletic and spiritual programs. May you be blessed for your sacrifices!

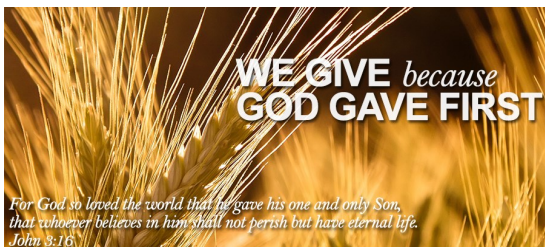

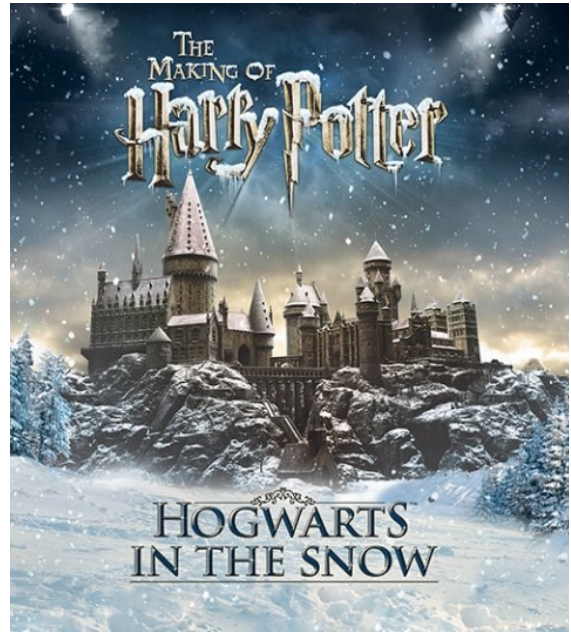

God's grace isn't noticed nearly as much as it should be. We don't see it in the not so pleasant times such as injuries, broken furnaces, and heavy traffic. Well, God's grace is there when we are focused more on God than ourselves.

Back when I was in seminary, my dad was in a wheelchair. Every time I was home, weird things would happen. The most memorable one was that I woke up with my mom yelling that my dad was hanging off the ramp. I jumped out of bed and was able to help my dad back onto level ground. Because of times like this, it was hard to return to seminary. I prayed asking for God to show me I wasn't needed at home. That prayer was answered when the first day of spring break I busted my shoulder and couldn't even lift my arm an inch. I was able to see first hand I wasn't needed at home. The next month I left seminary and was able to do side jobs and spend time with my dad. We had two massive gatherings of family and friends less than a month before he passed away.

We can get caught up in everything that was missed, and don't get me wrong, I miss my dad, but I'd be lying if I said I didn't see God's grace in the preparation. Life is going to kick you when you're down sometimes...ok, a lot of times, but there is nothing to fear because God, The Creator, loves you; and His timing will always be perfect. It may be different than what we imagined, but there is always a silver lining, a lesson to learn, an opportunity to grow into a holier person. God transformed the pieces of wood used for execution and humiliation into the greatest symbol of love. So much that there are billions of crosses displayed throughout the world. It is a reminder that God loves you enough to endure that pain and humiliation. Imagine what amazing things He can do through your break up, failed test, job loss, or rejection if you let Him. We just need to trust Him.
