On The Lenten Journey

+Bushes, trees and soil figure prominently in the Scriptures we hear this weekend. There is the burning bush that grows on holy ground. We hear Jesus' puzzling parable of the fig tree. Metaphors about growth and "plant" words are some of our favorite ways of describing our lives. We know what someone means when they say they are "putting down roots," or when we describe our children as "growing like weeds." Although we do not live in quite the same agrarian setting as did Jesus, we still know what He means when the Scriptures speak to us using expressions and images that are about trees and soil.

Think for a moment about our lives as Christians. Our lives contain elements of the burning bush, the holy ground and even the fig tree. Take first the captivating image of the burning bush in the first reading from Exodus. Our lives should be like that burning bush – we are called to be on fire with God's love. In other words, we should be radiant with God's love, a fire that burns within us. That love – God's love – should radiate out into the world through each of us, bringing warmth and light. That fire should be revealed in how we think and speak and act – a fire that does not burn yet which brightens the world.

Every time we gather in church to celebrate the Eucharist, we should remember that we are standing on holy ground. In fact, wherever we stand is holy ground, because it is ground that has been created by God. Deeper still, by the ashes of Ash Wednesday, we were reminded that we are made of that holy ground. We are made by holiness and are made for holiness.

Finally, there is Jesus' parable about the fig tree. In the end, it is not sufficient for the fig tree to simply be called a fig tree. It must bear fruit. The same is true of our identity as Christians. We, too, must bear fruit. Yet we also know that bearing the fruit of Christian living requires patient tending. We must allow God and others to care for us. We must also exercise Christ-like care for ourselves and for those around us. We, too, need nourishment – "fertilizer" – to energize us, to help us to grow, to fill us with life. God seeks to provide us with this nourishment each time we gather at Mass and receive the Holy Eucharist, the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

When we gather, God shares with us the food that will see us through the cold and dark of our Lenten winter. Here God tends to us, helps us to grow and change in new and holy ways. It is at our gatherings that we are nourished as we make our way to

the springtime of Easter. May we be attentive, then, to the graces being offered to us this Lent, so that we can grow and bear the fruit that our Baptism calls from each of us to bear.

+This weekend, we **welcome Friar Johnpaul Cafiero** to St. Andrew Parish to guide us through our Lenten mission, reflecting on the seven last words of Jesus, expressing the greatest love that can be offered to us. I hope to see many of you on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday evening from 7 – 8:30 p.m. in the church. Hospitality will follow each evening session in the Activities Building. Also, remember that on Sunday, the Christian Service Commission will be offering their annual Lenten Soup Supper PRIOR to Friar Johnpaul's talk. The supper will be in the Activities Building from 5:30 to 6:45 p.m.

+As we approach the end of the 2018 CSA/Building Campaign here at St. Andrew, we still have recently received some new donations, taking us up to a pledge/donation total of \$833,148, of which \$769,701 has already been paid. This will give us a good refund of almost \$490 thousand, having covered our target of \$343,900 and should all pledges be paid. **THIS IS A GREAT ACCOMPLISHMENT FOR OUR COMMUNITY – AND I AM PERSONALLY AND PRAYERFULLY VERY GRATEFUL FOR YOUR SACRIFICES!** I know that the good Lord will bless us in many new ways for this movement of our parish family in working at updating and expanding our complex to accommodate our faith journey into its next century.

Please remember, as we stated last year, we will try to collect additionally through the CSA over the next two years to help whittle the debt down quickly and avoid interest expense on the loan that we will need for the completion of the project.

+As stated at masses last weekend, Fr. Tom - and yours truly, as I learned on Sunday morning after the 10 a.m. mass! - have been scammed with false texts going out to various parishioners requesting I-tune and other gift cards and donations. **PLEASE, NOTE THAT THIS IS A SCAM – DO NOT RESPOND OR SEND CARDS AS MAY BE INSTRUCTED!** Should you ever have any question about such a request, please contact the Parish Office so that you do not fall prey to these scammers and we can stay on top of this illegal activity.

+Happy Spring, everyone! Finally it has arrived, but we will all have to wait and see if the temperatures start doing what they're supposed to be doing – going up! With our late start to Lent and late celebration of Easter, it just gives us all more to “anticipate”! Last Sunday was a real “nail-biter” in watching the big MSU/U of M basketball game, wasn't it? Watching with friends (who also wanted to see The Players golf tournament, going on at the same time), it became a real challenge to stay focused. But my prayers were answered for my favorite team. And now we all go into March Madness for the next tournament. Enjoy and don't get too worked up over it!

Marriage Coaching - Help for Your Marriage

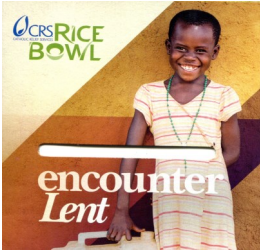
