

On The Easter Journey

+Our Gospel writers often provide the most fascinating details as thy record what they witnessed or heard. Thousands of years later, we know particulars that give great life and vibrancy to the narratives. From the infant Jesus wrapped in swaddling clothes to the Jesus who ate supper with his disciples in an upper room and prayed in a garden while they slept. Jesus, whose persecutors wove a crown of thorns, scourged his body, gave Him vinegar on a sponge and pierced his side. Jesus who walked, slept, ate and drank – who suffered and died. We are constantly reminded of the human nature of this divine person of the Trinity, whose "humanity appeared as 'sacrament,' that is, the sign and instrument, of his divinity and of the salvation He brings" (CCC 515).

Today's Gospel is full of specific details – Mary Magdalene goes to Christ's tomb on the first day of the week...early in the morning, while it was still dark. She sees that the stone had been removed, she runs to tell Simon Peter and John, and they race to the scene. They see an empty tomb, discarded burial cloths and a separate cloth for his head which had been neatly rolled in a separate place. Still grieving from the loss of their Lord, they only begin to piece together the details and recall his predictions that He would be raised from the dead.

On this great Easter Day, it would be understandable if we "got lost in the details." We can too easily focus on the stone rolled away, the empty tomb and the abandoned burial cloths. But we know what the larger context is, and truly we can rejoice that Jesus overcame his tortuous death and that God raised Him from the dead.

How do we do that? Perhaps the greatest insight may be found in today's Preface to our Eucharistic Prayer. We hear the words: by dying He has destroyed our death, and by rising, restored our life. This is the summation of God's plan of salvation. This is the great Paschal Mystery of our faith. This is the heart of every liturgy we celebrate!

For today, we do not merely <u>recall</u> what happened two thousand years ago on a cross and in a humble rock-hewn tomb, we <u>participate</u> in this continuing sacrificial mystery. We rejoice that Jesus suffered, died and rose for us. We rejoice because his sacrifice was once <u>for all</u>. Today, we rejoice because He <u>continues</u> to save his people. Our risen Lord is here among us still – in word and sacrament, priest and people.

And like those first witnesses to the Resurrection, *He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that He is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead*. This is what we are called to do as we work to *Unleash the Gospel* in our lives - bringing that Good News to all whom we meet on the journey.

Today and every day, let us give God thanks and praise for such a spectacular gift of eternal life! Let us be so grateful that we spend each day of our lives so as to be worthy of so great a gift! Alleluia!!

+A HAPPY, JOYOUS EASTER TO EVERYONE! May you and your families be blessed many times over, especially for your generosity to our parish family in giving of your time, talents and treasures. I pray that your celebrations will bring peace and build the ties that bind us together.

I thank everyone for your gift to our Easter basket program. Through your kindness and generosity, we were able to reach out to over 300 families and individuals, helping them with celebrating this great feast and season.


+Please remember to pray for our second graders who will be making their First Holy Communion over the next two weekends. We are so happy and excited to have them join us at the table of the Lord!



Called To Be Christian Jedi

Christians, like Jedi, have been equipped with one weapon, a sword. This sword isn't made of metal, it's a much stronger material, the Word of God. At first it doesn't seam like much, but neither does a lightsaber against a blaster. But those who are experts with a lightsaber can take out an entire fleet of blasters with little or no assistance. The same is with the Word of God. The strongest example is Jesus. He was face to face with the devil and returned every blast the devil took at our Savior. "Jesus, jump and God will send His angels to catch you." Jesus replied, "Scripture says you should not put God to the test." Any temptation was refuted with scripture. It doesn't seem as dramatic as a lightsaber fight, but it's much more powerful.

See, the evil one is shooting temptation after temptation at us. We weren't created to only hide behind our shield of faith, but to go out and make disciples. "Hey, join our side and we get attacked a lot, but we just hide behind our faith and it's all good." isn't a good recruiting tool. Trust me, Christianity would have fizzled out long ago if it was like that. God calls us to go out and battle evil by slinging scripture. Temptations say "You're too weak to do that." But in Matthew 19:26 Jesus says "with God, all things are possible." Temptation tries to isolate you but Ecclesiastes 4:12 states "a cord of three is not easily broken." Temptation tells you to sit in your shame, but scriptures says to confess our sins to one another and that we are never far away from God's love.

Temptation says God can't love you after that sin you did, but John 3:16 says God loves you so much that He sent His only son to die in your place, so that you and I can be saved. The more we know scripture the quicker and stronger we can fight. Temptations come at us quick, so Googling it may be too late. Get to know Scripture. Read some of the Bible each day. Even if it is one chapter in Proverbs or Sirach.





Did you know ...

St. Andrew Parish is a Tithing Parish?

For nearly 35 years St. Andrew Parish has expressed the stewardship model of being a Catholic Church that tithes to the needs of the (local, national & worldwide) community through its time, talent & treasure. The treasure or offerings of each Sunday collection is totaled and 10% is allocated to charitable agencies and missions in line with our Catholic social teachings. The amount varies each month based of the generous offerings of St. Andrew parishioners. From the tithe-75% of the funds goes to organizations in the United States and 25% goes outside the United States. To date we support approximately 280 outreach organizations. The Tithing Committee believes 'charity begins at home,' so the parish tithe supports our parish outreach efforts with the St. Vincent dePaul Conference and the Neighborhood House on a monthly basis. Each month the report from the prior month's allocations will be in this bulletin. Historically, Thank you letters & photos from recipients of your generosity, are posted on the bulletin boards as you enter church. St. Andrew Parish sets an example and challenge for other churches to embrace.




