On The Easter Journey

+In the readings for Mass today, fear is contrasted with confidence. In the first reading, despite the signs and wonders performed by the Apostles, some are unable to join them as believers, while others confidently are added to the number. A similar fear is evident in the seven churches of Asia in the reading from Revelation when John acknowledges their distress, and speaks with confidence about his testimony and imprisonment on Patmos.

John's confidence comes from his encounter with the risen Jesus in today's Gospel. This encounter carried the greeting, *Peace be with you*. Now this greeting is more than just a wish or a hope. It is a statement. It does not mean "*may* peace be with you." It means "*peace is* with you." The immediate effect of Jesus' presence and words is shown in their "rejoicing." And for this reason, John and his fellow Apostles have confidence that Jesus' peace will abide with them, providing the strength to face any fears life may present.

Thomas, who was not with them when Jesus appeared to the others, refuses to believe their testimony. While we do not know the reason Thomas was not present with the Apostles when Jesus came, nor why he does not believe what he is told, we do know what happens when Jesus appears again.

This time, Thomas is present and professes his belief in the Resurrection after touching Jesus' wounds. But, before Jesus invited Thomas to touch his wounds, He greeted him with *Peace be with you*. Again, this simple phrase, as it did for the other Apostles, instilled within Thomas a sense of confidence that would ultimately lead him to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world.

We all face encounters, events and people that can create distress and leave us fearful. But Thomas, John, Peter and the other disciples teach us today that Jesus came to liberate us from our spiritual and emotional prisons of fear. Jesus invites us to embrace the peace He offers and join with the other believers, who walk with confidence knowing the peace of Jesus dispels any fears.

Jesus' desire for us to enjoy his peace is echoed in his words when He told Sister Faustina, in one of his appearances to her: "*My child, life on earth is a struggle indeed; a great struggle for my kingdom. But fear not, because you are not alone.*" (*Diary*, 1488) May we bask in the confidence of His Divine Mercy in our lives, and confidently Unleash the Gospel in going forward through this Easter season – and always!

+What a wonderful celebration we experienced with our liturgies for Easter last weekend! Again, I want to thank everyone who participated in helping make them the meaningful expressions of our faith – no matter what your ministry was or how you helped. For those who attended, especially those from other parishes, the compliments were many –for the music, the decorations, and the warmth and hospitality shown and shared. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

+Remember to pray for our second graders from both our Religious Formation program as well as Holy Family Regional School as they approach the altar this weekend and next to make their first Holy Communion. What a blessed time to receive Jesus in this most special way during the Easter season!

+It was truly fun to experience the east vestibule being “open for business” with the start of the Holy Triduum last Thursday. While not everything is finished – missing some signs, inside locks, carpet/tile trim, bathroom mirrors, some small benches – it was assuring to hear the many positive comments from those who attended mass in the church and used that area.

I kindly ask that you be careful going through this area, and be “respectful” of the space, including how you use the lavatories. Don’t leave a mess/toss paper around for someone else to clean up. And please DO NOT sit on the window sills; that’s why we ordered some benches for the area!

+As we continue to make progress on the building, it reminds me of two things. First, your generosity on last year’s CSA drive in which we raised just over \$500K more than our target to help with the building expenditures. Many of you have been very generous – and the parish family thanks you for your stewardship!

Second, it is time for our 2019 CSA effort to begin, and once again, we have been granted permission to run building contributions through the 2019 CSA books so that we pay no “tax,” have no need to hire a fundraising firm, and let the CSA offices basically due all the accounting for us! What a wonderful way for us to work at paying off the debt which we will be incurring as well as saving thousands of dollars in interest expenses over the coming years.

Remember last year when we introduced this approach to our fundraising, we stated that we would try this for three years, so this is “year two” of our efforts. I ask that you be as generous as possible with our campaign this year. And for those who might have been hesitant in giving last year, or are new to the parish, *NOW* is the time to step forward and help our parish family in funding our project!

+As the fiscal year rapidly is coming to a close (June 30 is our “year-end”), I must sadly announce that Joe Soncrant will be retiring as our Christian Service director/coordinator at year-end. It was a tough decision for Joe to make. Also leaving us will be Jason Spranger, our High School Youth Minister and one of our Confirmation coordinators in the Religious Formation area. Jason has decided to now pursue full-time his interests in the music field as a DJ, further expanding his own company. They will both be missed greatly. We will be working diligently to find other candidates to fill these positions, so please keep our parish “staff” family in your prayers. We are also looking forward to hiring an RCIA Coordinator/Evangelization Pastoral minister in the coming year. Any referrals you might have should be directed to me at the parish office.

+Finally, I want to extend my personal, prayerful gratitude for your kind remembrances and generous gifts given to me on the celebration of this great feast of Easter! It was very kind and thoughtful of you (and of course, there were NO calories in any of those treats, right??!!) It continues to be my privilege to shepherd the people and work of this great community of St. Andrew! Please know of my prayers – I’ll see you in church!

PEACE

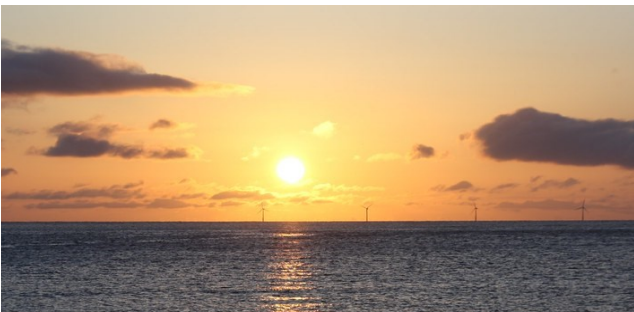
