On The Easter Journey

+Most folks are aware that sheep are not the brightest of God's four-legged creatures. When left to their own devices, they wander off and risk being lost or injured. But we must not resent Jesus for referring to us as sheep! Let's face it, when left to our own devices, we, too, can wander off and risk becoming lost. We need Jesus, the Good Shepherd, in our lives.

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is often referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. No matter which liturgical year we are in, the Gospel will always be about Jesus, the Good Shepherd. So great is our Good Shepherd that He knows each of us *by name* and gives us eternal life.

Jesus states that no one can take a sheep from his hand or from the Father's hand because He and the Father are one. Some choose to interpret this as a "get out of jail free" card. In other words, we can choose to do what we want and it's okay because we are, after all, in Jesus' hand.

The truth is that no external force, no other person or entity, can take us out of Jesus' hand or the Father's hand. But we are certainly capable of letting go of Jesus' hand, the Father's hand. As tightly as Jesus grasps our hand out of love, we can break the grasp and choose to run away – risking the very real chance that we can become lost. The gift of free will given to us is linked to the responsibility we have in making good choices in our lives - choices that will not separate us from the love of Christ.

By the grace of God, we have Jesus the Good Shepherd grasping our hand, bringing us back time and time again – forgiving us, making us new and gifting us with salvation. Wander as we do, as lost as we might become, Jesus has promised He will leave the ninety-nine and come looking until He finds us!

The reality of our faith and our free will is such that we must allow ourselves to be found. God will never force himself upon us any more than the evil one can force himself upon us. It is always up to us to choose good over evil, light over darkness, and life over death.

We may not be smart sheep, but we are wise disciples. Wise enough to know that embracing Jesus and his ways and his truth bring us to the eternal life we strive for. May the journey we each take never lead us astray from the voice of Jesus, our Good Shepherd!

+Thanks to the many of you who came forward last weekend with your 2019 CSA pledge/donation! I was pleased to hear back from 152 families already, with gifts totaling \$76,380. (By comparison, these first week totals are 16 families and \$14,645 higher than the first week last year!) Your generosity and support of both our commitment to the many ministries throughout the Archdiocese, as well as our local building efforts, will be blessed many times over!

Our target this year is \$352,457, up just a bit from last year's target. It will be great if we can "hit another home run" with donations this year so as to keep our debt on the building project as low as possible. If EVERYONE were to make a sacrifice this year to give toward the building, we would be doing well with managing our cash flows and debt balance.

As an aside, I just want to give a special "shout out" to Lisa Grems who produced our own CSA video, and directed much of it with her contacts through work in filming and editing of our mini-film – all at no cost once again to the parish (just as last year's video)! We thank Lisa, the production company, Christopher Oskoian for the drone videography, and all the "stars" of our little production. (Rumor has it that we might be up for an Oscar next year for "Video Documentary/Short Film"! Hollywood red carpet, here we come!!)

+Internally, we are busy finishing up the parish and school 2019/20 budgets for submission to downtown. Overall, we welcome back some of our college student parishioners as they finish the current year of schooling and start returning home for summer. Our eighth graders are getting ready to finish up and move on to high school. And might I add that there's still a building project going on!?! (Thank for your patience with all that the construction disruptions!)

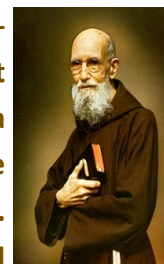

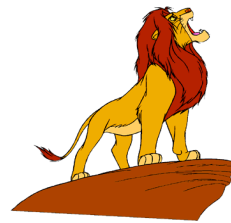
