On The Easter Journey

+Everyone — believers and non-believers alike — is familiar with the Golden Rule: *Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.* In other words, treat others as you would expect to be treated. We can all agree that it is very reasonable and practical, and makes good sense. Even Jesus seems to endorse it. But as we hear today, Jesus is never one simply for minimums or convenient half-measures. He always calls us to a higher standard or way of thinking — one that is not just in keeping with human expectations, reason and demands, but one that aligns with God's ways.

In the Gospel passage today from John, Jesus gives us a new commandment, one that will take commitment, perseverance and self-giving on our part even when it might not seem practical or even sensible. We are told today that we are to love as He loves.

Note that Jesus calls it a commandment, not an option but a mandate for every Christian: As I have loved, so you also should love one another. Measure for measure, our behavior in all aspects of our life must strive to be Christ-like, not merely reasonable or convenient but modeled on Christ. Now that is quite a demand!

So how can we describe this Christ-like love? One key word that the ancient Greeks used was *agape* – selfless, unconditional and self-giving love. We have only to look upon the cross to see that love poured out for each one of us in the outstretched arms of the crucified Christ. Right through the Gospels, we see this love exemplified in Jesus' words and actions in the way He encounters sinners, heals and liberates the sick, faithfully preaches the word and is faithful to the Father in all things.

Based simply on reason, it might seem like the life and mission of Jesus ended in failure and death. But God's ways are so different from ours; Christ's love is so much richer and fuller than mere human love. And it is this love that we are called to imitate in all its fullness, its faithfulness and, even at times, its impracticality.

Today, Jesus sets a new command for his disciples. But He also give us the means to fulfill it: through his example (as He says in the passage), and in the sending of the Holy Spirit later to help us. We are not set up for failure, for the very credibility of the Christian message depends on our witness and how we live out that commandment of love.

And keeping in mind that we can do all things with God's help, let us commit to love of God and love of neighbor. Featured Saints of the Week

May 20 -Saint Bernardine of Siena +1444; O,F.M.

A famous reformer and eloquent preacher who traveled throughout Italy, encouraged devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus; known for his use of the monogram HIS, an abbreviation of the name of Jesus in Greek; patron of advertisers and advertising.

May 21—Saint Christopher Magallanes, priest, and companions, martyrs

Christopher and twenty-one diocesan priests and three laymen were either shot or hanged (+1915-1937) for their association with the *Cristero* uprising which opposed the anti-Catholic Mexican government in the late 1920s.

May 22—Saint Rita of Cassia

She was born in 1381 in the town of Roccaporena in Umbria. She lived with a brutal husband and had two sons. After the violent murder of her husband, she urged forgiveness instead of the customary vendetta of her day. Becoming an Augustinian nun, she spent some 40 years in prayer, contemplation, and service to the sick and the poor. She died in 1457. She is the patron saint of desperate situations.

Hearing Assist Devices



Evangelizing!!!!

We are called to be evangelizers! That doesn't mean to preach about hell on the streets of downtown, it means to share Christ with others. As Americans, we get so caught up on the results. We want everything to be instant. If someone doesn't instantly turn to Christ, we count it as a failure. The reality is the God regularly takes his sweet old time in converting people. As evangelizers, we are called to share Christ, not jam the faith down someone's throat. In Matthew 4:19, Jesus says "Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of people." This is the key to evangelization. If you've ever seen someone fish, they cast the line, then reel in the lure. They repeat this over and over and over again until they get a bite. In my 30 years, I've never seen someone successfully fish by jumping in the water and trying to grab the fish.

Evangelization is the same way. We have a very attractive lure in Christ. We cast it out, then reel it in. We cast out compassion, and reel it in. We cast out mercy, and we reel it in. We cast out sacrificial and unconditional love, and reel it in. We cast out forgiveness, and reel it in. Evangelization is about sharing all of the attractive things about our faith, and reeling it into Christ. Evangelization is showing Christ to others through our actions, and trusting God will take care of the rest.

John 4:37 reads, "...the saying is true, 'one sows and another reaps." When we cast out our lure, the more we are Christlike, the more attractive our lure becomes. This doesn't mean it'll always pull the person in. Often times we cast an attractive lure that intrigues them, but it might be someone else's lure years later than God reels them in with. Have patience and continue to trust that God is caring for that person. Psalm 46:10 "Be still, and know that I am God."
