On The Easter Journey

+How many of us have ever wished, in moments of indecision, that God would send us a clear sign about what we are called to do at that moment – perhaps an angel to tell us exactly what God wants, maybe a special text message?? At times like these, when we're surrounded by turmoil and violence, it can be easy to feel that God has left us alone to fend for ourselves – that we're left on our own with no clear direction.

But the readings today, as we come ever nearer to the great Feast of Pentecost, are reassuring. We are not alone, but have God, the Church, and the people around us to give us guidance and support when we need it – as long as we're open to the different ways the Holy Spirit operates in our daily lives.

In the first reading, we see the Church, our brothers and sisters in the faith, as a support system to help us understand what is required of us. The earliest Gentile disciples in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia were misled into believing they had to follow the ancient Mosaic Law if they were to be saved – if they were to be Christians.

But the Apostles, guided by the Holy Spirit in their discussions, realized that Gentile believers were not called to the same strict code of law that the Jewish people had been, and they sent emissaries to encourage the Gentiles, to lighten their load. Sometimes, in this case, the Holy Spirit speaks to us through the word of those around us, the faithful people who listen to the voice of the Spirit and help us to understand.

Jesus assures us in the Gospel that the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, will be with us if we stay close to God, if we listen to God's word and allow God to make his dwelling in us. Even though Jesus is not physically with us in his human bodily form, his Spirit is with us to guide us to the truth – to remind us of the words that Jesus spoke to the Apostles and continues to speak to us through Scripture. The Holy Spirit who dwells in us speaks to us in our heart, during our prayer and when we are open to receiving his message.

How do we know that the Holy Spirit is speaking to us? One way is to stay close to God through daily prayer, Scripture reading and the sacraments. One special type of prayer is the nightly *Examen*, in which we review the day past and see how God has been working in that day – where we received special blessings, where we were effective in our discipleship and where we might have failed. Through the daily

practice of examining our lives, we can more easily see how God has spoken to us that day – through prayer, for example, or through the words or action of a family member or friend.

With Pentecost coming up in just a couple weeks, let us always remember that the Holy Spirit – the Advocate – longs to speak God’s word to us and guide us on our journey – if we’re only open!

+As I write this Monday morning, I can look out my office window and see a “conga line” of mixers bringing in the cement for the west addition gathering space, conference rooms, etc. It is a good sight to behold, because once the concrete sets, many other trades will be able to get in and work diligently on finishing off the inside of the building. I ask that you continue to pray for the safety of all involved, and for the prompt completion of our building! Once school is done, then we will tackle the parking lots!

I thank you for your generosity to our 2019 CSA/Building campaign! To-date, we have received pledges/donations totaling \$289,765, or 82% of our target of \$352,457. Your support of the programs funded through CSA and of our building project is greatly appreciated! If you have not yet made your pledge, please consider doing so soon, so that we can continue moving forward with our project!

+Regarding an incident at the noon Mass last Sunday. While unusual and disconcerting, it was an unfortunate event that generated some actions, reactions and safety concerns. In this and any similar situation, a more appropriate response would be for the person to address the priest privately after Mass rather than expressing a dissent by standing up during mass. We are constantly making staff and usher volunteers aware of steps to take. We attend the safety classes offered by sheriff/police departments. As always, keep your eyes and ears open, and alert staff and volunteer personnel of any suspicious person.

+This Monday is Memorial Day, a special remembrance of all those women and men who have given their lives in service to our great country. Let us be mindful of the sacrifices that they have made and keep them in our prayers. Remember, too, to pray for our service members who are presently serving in our Armed Forces. Our mass on Monday morning will be at 9 a.m. in the church, preceded by the recitation of the rosary.

May your celebration of this holiday be joy-filled and grateful for the sacrifices made so that the rest of us may enjoy our gift of national freedom.

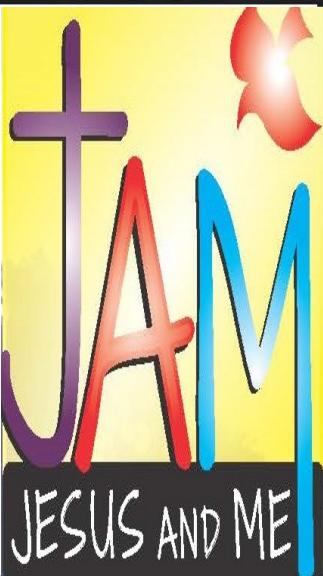

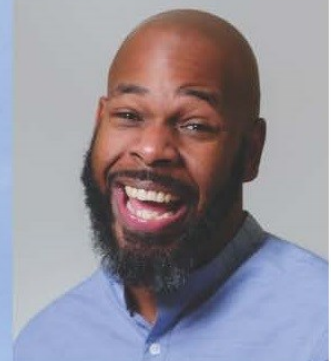

Love is...

Most of the books in the New Testament are letters to different groups of people struggling with different things. Corinthians is a letter Paul wrote to the people of Corinth addressing love. This passage has always been like an anchor for me when it seems I've drifted away.

Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails.

1 Corinthians 13:4-7

This passage is a great reflection to use when you're struggling with someone. "Am I being patient towards _____. Am I being kind towards _____." And answer each of them. Don't freak out, no one is going to do this perfectly, but it can be either an affirmation of your actions, or it can be an opportunity to correct them.

It can also be a good check to see if someone who says they love you is being honest. "Is he/she patient towards me? Is he/she quick-tempered?" Again, not looking for perfection, but there should be evidence of attempts. If they aren't loving towards you it doesn't necessarily mean to cut them out of your life, but it may mean you need a break from them or a discussion. We aren't perfect and should appreciate people correcting us providing it comes from a place of love...Part II next week ;)
