On The Easter Journey

+Imagine living in the first century, and know that Jesus will soon be leaving. Like any anxious member of a group, we ask, "Who is going to lead us when you're gone?" Jesus replies, "Peter!" We can't believe it. How can Jesus select the person who denied knowing Him, not once, not twice, but three times? He would not follow Jesus to Golgotha. And yet he's the one who is supposed to lead Jesus' sheep. Peter might not stand out to us at that time as a first choice, but this is the man Jesus chooses to be the leader of the young Christian community.

Peter is flawed, and he might not be completely trustworthy. But redemption awaits him. He becomes a leader who is not afraid to voice his beliefs in the face of adversity. When he is brought before the authorities and reminded that he is not supposed to be talking about Jesus, Peter emphatically denounces their authority, obeying only God's authority. In following Jesus, Peter furthers Jesus' mission. And in doing so, he is honored by God the Father.

In our Gospel, Jesus and Peter have an exchange about love. For English speakers, we only have the one word – *love*. But the Gospel is written in Greek, and there are several words for 'love' in that language. Jesus asks Peter if he loves Him, using the Greek word *agapas*, which is divine love. Peter responds that he does love Him, but instead of using the term *agapas*, he uses the term *philo*, which is a brotherly love.

Peter, again, showing his limitations, is not able to say that he loves Jesus with divine love because he is limited by his humanity. It takes God's grace to be able to exude divine love, and that comes in the fruit of the Spirit of Pentecost. Only when he is imbued with divine love does Peter become capable of leading Jesus' flock.

When we partake of the Eucharist, we, too, become filled with that same divine love. But that love is not meant to be hidden, it is meant for us to share. As we go forth from our celebration at Mass, will we be able to go out and live our lives signifying that we, too, follow Jesus? Are we ready to *Unleash the Gospel* at home, and at school; at work and in our neighborhoods?

May that same Spirit move us to be the disciples needed in our world today!

+Thanks for the many compliments about our "locally-produced" CSA video that we showed last week as a prelude to this weekend's start of our 2019 CSA/Building campaign efforts. Our Archdiocesan target this year is \$352,457, an increase of just slightly over \$8500 from last year). As with last year's effort, any and all funds raised (continued on page 3)

over our target will be returned 100% to our parish, "tax-free," for use toward our building project. Last year's efforts netted us over \$500,000 returned to us to help in keeping our project loan down. Another great year like that would go a lo-o-o-o-ng way in helping us pay for the new additions and upgrades to our facilities!

By now you should have received our brochure mailing explaining our efforts – using the same approach that we used last year. Your continued generosity will help our parish family work through this wonderful addition to our facilities and get our parish campus grounds back in "tip-top" shape. As always, if you have any questions, feel free to contact me.

- +Please continue to pray for our students making their first Holy Communion this weekend. Last Saturday's celebrations were wonderful, and though a bit cold, even the weather cooperated with sunny skies. My prayerful thanks to all who helped both last week and this weekend!
- +We experienced a prayerful celebration for Divine Mercy last Sunday afternoon. I apologize for the delays with confessions; three of the six priests did not show up for one reason or another, causing some to wait over two hours to have their confessions heard. But let me clear up some misunderstandings about the "when" you need to go to confession in seeking the indulgences of the day: it is no longer ON THE DAY ITSELF (that is, Divine Mercy Sunday), but close to the day. The Vatican has described that to be "three weeks before OR after the day." In other words, there is about a six-week window to go to confession. Therefore, we will not be offering confessions on Divine Mercy Sunday itself in the future.
- +This past week brought with it the conclusion of our Religious Formation sessions for the current school year. We are so blessed to have such a wonderful Religious Formation staff: Maureen Schreffler, Barbara Pacella, Lidia Larges, Brenda Heughens, Barbara Zonca (Sunday Children's Liturgy of the Word), Jason Spranger, and Linda Martens. We are also blessed with many dedicated volunteers to help share their faith in teaching our children about our God, our Faith, our Church and our religious traditions. May the Lord bless you all for the dedicated commitment you make to our parish family!
- +After the Easter vigil, it was discovered in the balcony (on the south/organ-side of the church) that some very noticeable damage was done to one of the pews with the candles used to celebrate the opening light service as well as at the time of the renewal of Baptismal promises. If you were involved, or saw anything, it would have been appropriate to have notified an usher or someone on staff of the damage. It will now cost us hundreds of dollars for the repair. Given the climate of our country and the world, please be alert to our surroundings and notify the ushers or others parish leadership of such suspicious/vandalous activities.
- +This weekend brings about the first anniversary of my brother's death last year, just a week after his wife's passing. Thanks to the many of you who remembered and offered your continued support and sympathy. How appropriate that we celebrate a Mass of Hope this Monday evening at 7 p.m. in the church, in support of all who have and continue to face significant challenges in their life. Whether you attend or not, please keep these folks in your special prayers.
- Fr. Tom leaves for Poland for a time of vacation to visit family and friends. Please keep him in your prayers for safe journeys and a relaxing time. (And remember to go easy on the pastor while he's away!)
- +As we continue our celebration of this great season of Easter, know of my continued prayers for blessings upon you and your families! I look forward to seeing you in church!



Fish Story

My seven year old grandson has recently shown an interest in fishing. We sent him his dad's old tackle box. He thought his sister would like a pink one for her third birthday. She didn't. At one point during his last outing with his dad, he had a difficult time reeling in his line. He felt his hook was caught on a rock, or maybe a 100 pound catfish. He wasn't sure. Even though he never catches anything and is sometimes discouraged, he keeps trying. He needs Jesus to show him where to cast. (I am amused as I ponder this, because his dad has long hair and a beard, and looks very much like how we depict Jesus.)

In today's Gospel, (John 21:1-9, 12, 15-17) the disciples are shown where to cast their nets. They are also given what they need to go out and nourish the people, including the directive from Jesus to "Feed my sheep." What do we need to nourish one another? 




