On The Journey

+This weekend, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. As we profess in our Creed, we believe in one God, the Father Almighty, in Jesus Christ his only begotten Son, and in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life. One God in three persons, in perfect, right relationship with one another.

The Scripture texts for this celebration give us insight into that Triune God, and demonstrate some of how they relate to us: the Wisdom of God, the human and divine natures of Jesus through whom we have peace with God, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds from them both and is the Spirit of truth. In the totality of Scripture, we can see the hand of our Triune God as He loves and cares for us.

All of the Hebrew Scriptures guide the people of Israel in coming to terms with the reality that there is but one God. God is seen as the Creator, as the Protector and as the Judge of all creation, especially the greatest of all of his creation – **us!** In the New Testament, we witness God's promise to bring about salvation become a reality in the person of Jesus Christ. As Jesus, the Son of God, is completing his mission on earth He makes another promise. He promises to send the Holy Spirit. The promise is kept, the Holy Spirit comes upon us and a new Church is born.

We believe in one God, a Trinity of Persons, working in perfect unison to offer us a way home. As rational beings we want to fully understand things, and from a theological standpoint, the doctrine of the Trinity can be difficult to grasp.

But having faith in, and being in a relationship with a Triune God need not be: for God is a God **for us**. He created us in his image, dwelt among us, and remains with us in truth and as our strength and guidance. Everything He does, *He does for us*. How could we not respond in kind to such a love?

So as we celebrate this doctrine of our faith, let us give thanks for the mystery of our redemption by God, through Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. Let us give thanks for this divine outpouring of pure gift for our sake. And may we respond by glorifying God by living in right relationship with Him and with one another!

+**HAPPY FATHERS DAY** to all our fathers and to all the men who stand in that awesome role of being a father! Let us also remember our Dads who have gone over to the other side of life, and now rest with the Lord and St. Joseph, that wonderful foster father of Jesus. May you be blessed for all that you have done and continue to do for us all! Enjoy your special day!!

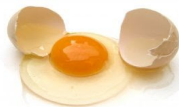
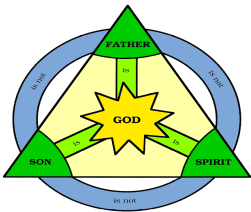
Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

In religion class one day, the catechist taught about the Holy Trinity; three persons in one God. After a lengthy explanation, she asked the children if anyone had any questions. One child raised his hand and asked, "What color pajamas do you wear?"

For children, the Trinity is a confusing concept, and verbal explanations are often beyond their focus. But there are visuals we can use to help. The shamrock is the obvious one used by St. Patrick. It has three leaves on one stem. An apple is another, with its skin, pulp and core. Still another is an egg with its shell, white and yolk. These tangible examples give us clues to the ethereal nature of God.

The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are always in relationship with each other, and with each of us. As a church community, we are in relationship with each other and with God. Think about those with whom you are in a close relationship. How did you get there? We can work on that with God.

CYO Camps

Looking for a great camp along the shores of a great lake? The Catholic Youth Organization for the Archdiocese of Detroit (<http://www.cyocamps.org>) offers a traditional summer camp opportunity for kids and families with an infusion of the Catholic faith right along the shores of Lake Huron.

This summer's theme is 'Be His Light,' and through programs and events campers will learn how to be a light in the world for Jesus Christ and how faith impacts their lives, their relationship with God, and each other.

CYO camps are centered on character development and virtues, which are naturally supported by the atmosphere of camp. The adult counselors and leaders are good role models who help teach the campers cooperation, communication and teamwork as part of the daily life at camp.

The CYO camps start June 30 and run through Aug. 3. Campers can attend mini – four-day, three-night programs, week-long programs or one of the specialty camps that runs for seven-days and six-nights. Camp is open to kids ages 7-16. During the first four weeks, the CYO camps will have co-ed and boys-only programs. The remainder of the summer will be all-girls programming. The CYO camps are the only Catholic camps that offer all-girl programs..

The Catholic Youth Organization also aims to make the programs affordable for all campers. There are early registration, multi-session and multi-sibling discounts, as well as scholarships for campers.

The CYO Boys Camp is located in Carsonville, Michigan and just a few miles up the road North of Port Sanilac is the CYO Girls Camp. Both properties are on the beautiful sandy shores of Lake Huron.

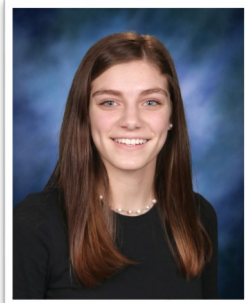
