On The Journey

+Popularly known as the *Feeding of the Five Thousand*, this miraculous event is found in all four Gospels. For Luke, it took place in a *deserted* place, or in some translations, a *lonely* place. But do they mean the same thing? To be *deserted* means to be uninhabited, empty; to be *lonely* means to be alone, without company. We can see how both of these could be good descriptions. And maybe these words also refer to the human condition and the deepest desires of the human heart.

The Gospels agree that Jesus was followed by a great crowd into the hill country. What were they after? Maybe some came to hear a little more about the kingdom, inspired by his hope-filled promise of God's mercy and healing. Perhaps others simply came to see another miracle from one whose words could change lives, and whose deeds could do marvelous things. Maybe some were at the last stop in their journey of life with nothing to lose and yet everything to gain.

So they are willing, if not eager, to follow Him into this lonely/deserted place – willing to risk the growing darkness, hunger, and even the potential of a long walk home just to be with Jesus. And it is here in this lonely/deserted place that Jesus meets them and their deepest needs in a life-abundant and self-giving way.

We gather on this Sunday to celebrate the feast of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In many ways, we are very much like the Gospel crowd. We, too, have come with our hopes and needs to encounter Jesus. Here Jesus creates a Eucharistic world where all experience his real presence and the hope of something better – here, no one goes hungry!

At every Mass, Jesus meets these needs by giving us his total and unconditional love, while at the same time, nourishing us both physically and spiritually. Here we see why the Church calls the Eucharist <u>the source and summit of our faith</u>. It is *source* because Jesus is the source of our faith, and it is *summit* as our faith is ultimately about a sharing in his Resurrection and life.

Here we truly receive the same Jesus – his Body, Blood, soul and divinity, nourishing us for those lonely moments that are so often part of our human experience, reassuring us that God is *always* present in our lives.

When we prepare to receive Holy communion, we will repeat the words of the centurion from the Gospel who encountered that same Jesus: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be

healed (Matt 8:8). Every time we receive this great gift from heaven, we should do so with fear and trembling, knowing as Paul reminds us that we are proclaiming Christ's death and resurrection until He comes again in glory. Here we are joining the saints and angels in the worship of the One who has loved us without condition. Here in the signs of bread and wine, Christ meets our most basic needs: to be loved and to be nourished.

In the Eucharist, we receive the very presence and mercy of Christ – how truly blessed we are!

- +Next weekend, after all the masses, we will host a reception in the Activities Building for our retiring Christian Service minister, Joe Soncrant. We thank Joe for his work here at St. Andrew for almost 30 years, reaching out to help minister in so many ways to those in need in our parish and in the surrounding community. These receptions will give everyone a chance to thank Joe personally for all that he has done! Know of our love and prayers, Joe! (a little secret....Joe will be around for a while in July to help with transitioning.....but it's a secret!)
- +In that light, we will be welcoming some new faces to our parish family: Mrs. Susan Kowalski, who going to take on the role of RCIA and Evangelization minister. It's filling a need for RCIA, but helping us with evangelization as we work to Unleash the Gospel. Mr. Sam Jennings will be assuming responsibilities in the area of Christian Service for our parish. And Mrs. Margaret Kozak will become our Youth and Confirmation Minister, working with our Faith Formation team and replacing Mr. Jason Spranger, who is moving on to pursue other career opportunities (need a great DJ for your wedding or other function? A little free advertising for you, Jason!). In addition, we have Mr. Michael Miller joining our maintenance team to oversee the many facilities on our campus. Welcome one and all!
- +Big efforts have been made in work around the complex. As is evident, a lot of cement work has been done (curbs, sidewalks). The interior of the new west addition is getting put together nicely. - +This coming week brings about the end of the fiscal year for the parish; we will report more information as the final numbers become available in the coming months. Overall, we've had a pretty good year. Yes, we're behind on the building project, but directed changes at the beginning as well as poor weather conditions have caused the delays.

At this time, I get to reflect on my priestly ministry, as I will celebrate 24 years of ordination on June 24th. I am happy to enter into my silver anniversary year with my St. Andrew parish family! Please remember to keep me in prayer, and pray for an increase in vocations, especially to the priesthood so that there will be more shepherds working in the fields and vineyards!









