On The Journey

+The Easter season has concluded, and we've celebrated the feasts of Ascension, Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity and the Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, so we now move back into the fullness of Ordinary Time. The Scriptures today refer to God's call, and the necessity for us to provide an answer to that call with an *act* of faith. If we truly believe the Lord to be the sovereign in the center of our hearts, then we must obey God's call without delay or excuse.

Just prior to today's reading on top of Mt. Horeb, the Mountain of God, Elijah was granted an answer to his prayers. After praying for death and enduring an earthquake, windstorm and wildfire on top of that mountain, he had heard the tiniest whisper. It was the voice of the Lord telling him that Elisha was chosen to be his successor. Elisha was not as excited as Elijah to learn of this. He wanted to go and bid farewell to his family, and perhaps get his affairs in order. Once he realizes he must leave everything and go right then, not only does he lay down the reins to his father's plow, he burns everything up – there is no turning back. Elisha set the stage for what Jesus' Apostles would do centuries later, when they would lay down their nets and leave the customs post to follow Him.

In the Gospel, we listen to the final verses of the ninth chapter of Luke. This is a very busy chapter in Luke's Gospel, and a tumultuous time in the life of Christ. Earlier in this chapter, Jesus had sent out the 12 Apostles on their first missionary journey. Next, Jesus informed his Apostles that He was going to be arrested and put to death. Then, He took Peter, James and John up on Mt. Tabor and they saw Jesus transfigured before their very eyes.

This weekend, as we work toward the end of the chapter, we see that Jesus increasingly meets resistance in his efforts to seek and save the lost. Fewer and fewer people wish to accompany Him, even Samaritans who previously offered Him the warmest of welcomes. They know why Jesus is going to Jerusalem, and they are not sure they wish to follow Him any further if it means suffering and death.

Jesus calls others to follow Him but, like Elisha, they have excuses, they need more time, they are not ready to go. The Lord has *nowhere to rest his head* and his days are numbered, but still He presses on, inviting others to join Him along the way of the cross. They will not go. Perhaps it is a sign of the abandonment and isolation Jesus is set to endure in his last hours, as almost everyone He cared about refuses to stay at his side.

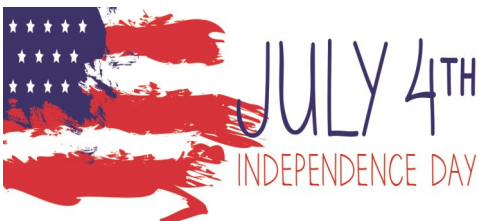

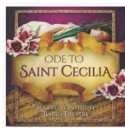
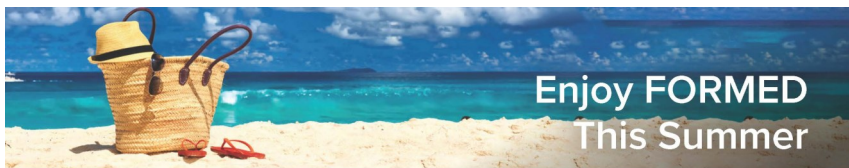

The CCRT was formed in 2004 by the Pastoral Ministers Association of the Pontiac Area Vicariate as a response to a population living at or below the poverty level. Did you know that 26% of Pontiac residents are living below poverty level? Addressing this issue is a way to live our commitment



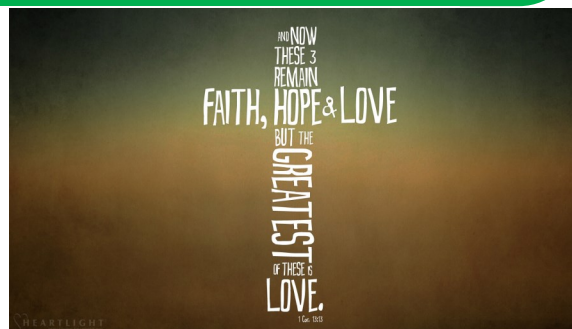

to the gospel as one church. CCRT clients include homeless people, low income families, people released from jail, people struggling with addiction and/or mental illness, and folks in need of food/clothing/furniture. Most clients have no income or an average monthly income of \$600—\$900. Their mission is to provide direct support and referral services to those whose basic needs are not being met...inspired by the message of Jesus Christ.

How does CCRT assist clients? Immediate needs of food, clothing, identification & toiletries. Long term needs for rental assistance, utility payments or furniture/household goods. They offer special projects for school clothes, Thanksgiving dinner baskets and bicycles. In a typical year CCRT helps about 2,000 clients with 4,660 services.

The Catholic Community Response Team depends on our area churches to help with volunteers, tithing donations, and food/toiletries drives from parishes. 100% of every gift goes to people in need. Your Sunday offering helps support this charity and many others in our community and beyond. We are asked to also spread the word and share information about CCRT and how we all are helping the poor in the Pontiac area. *Let's not hide our light under a basket?!*

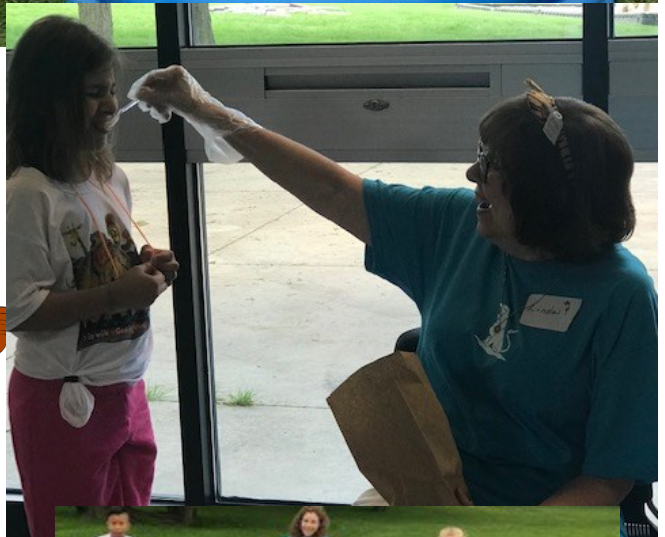

How To Truly Enter Into The Mass

First of all, Mass is an invitation to partake in the most perfect form of prayer. It's a ritual that we get to participate in as opposed to simply watching it. It's a time that we sit back and just embrace how powerful, merciful, and loving God truly is. In order to truly grow deeper in your faith, making Mass a priority is extremely important because it's reminding you that God needs to be the focal point in your life.

Now before the excuses start flooding in, I recognize there are external situations that don't allow us to always fulfill our Sunday invitation to Mass. Perhaps you're backpacking where a church isn't accessible or you work the entire weekend (medical, military, etc). Vacationing to areas where church is available, homework, social events, studying, etc doesn't count. Mass is the time to get rid of the garbage in our lives, and allow God to fill us with faith, hope, and love. Being "too busy" for Mass for these reasons is like saying "I don't have time to stop at the gas station" when you're under 1/8 of a tank.

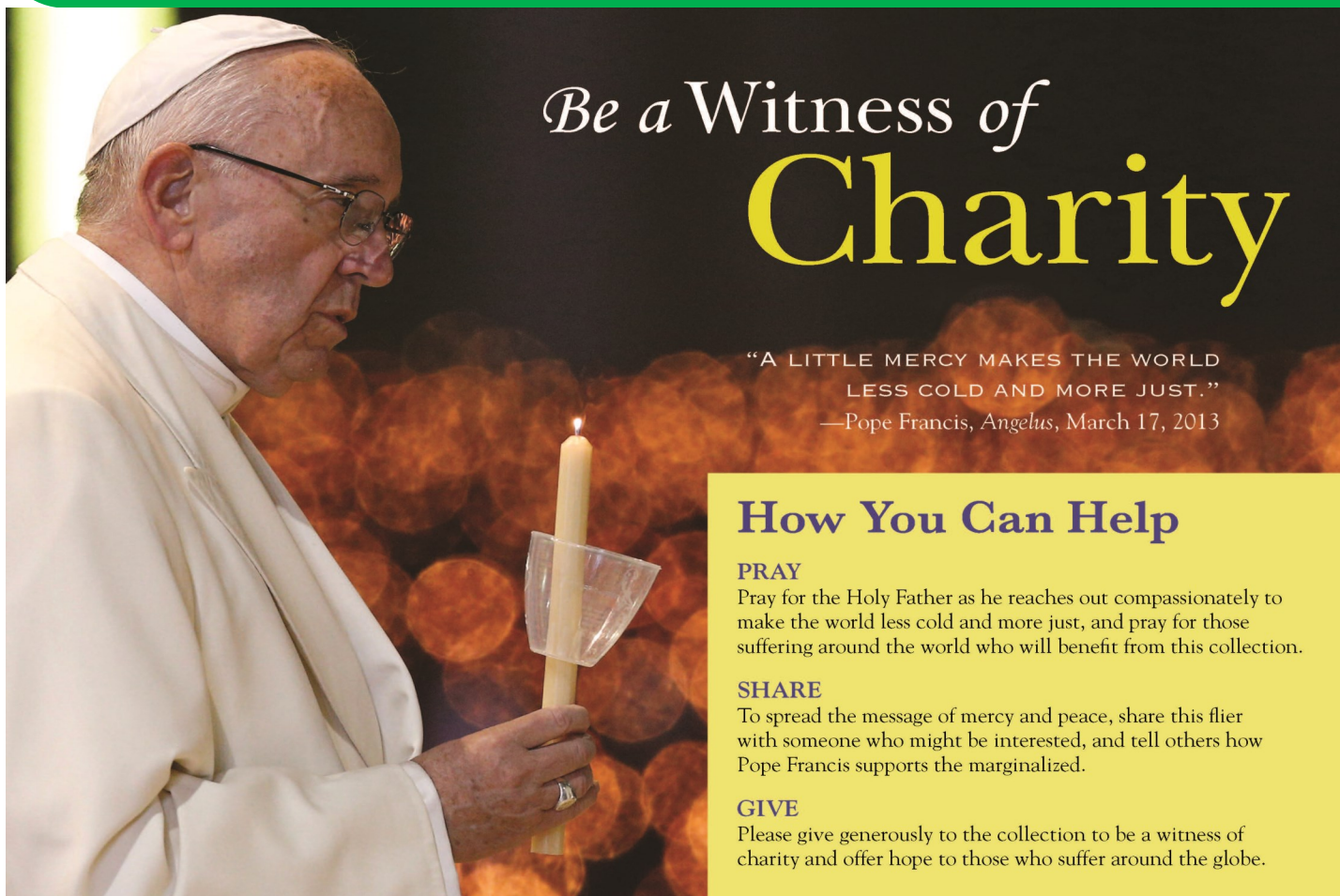
A rule of thumb is, if going to Mass is a burden, you're doing it wrong. It has guided prayer taken from scripture that meets us where we're at. For those struggling with anger towards others, focus on the sign of peace and how we're called to let go of the wrongdoings of others so that we can be in Communion with Christ. For those who are "too stressed" for Mass, just embrace the fact that you're away from the hustle and bustle for an hour (think of it as your sanctuary). For those feeling lost, depressed, or unloved, focus on the consecration and realize that Christ died for you in the hopes that you can be reunited with Him fully in Heaven. For any other struggles, you've got an hour of healthy distraction where you can ask God to enter into these struggles. We don't go to Mass for God's sake, God invites us for our sake.



Luke 14:15-24

One of his fellow guests on hearing this said to him, "Blessed is the one who will dine in the kingdom of God." He replied to him, "A man gave a great dinner to which he invited many. When the time for the dinner came, he dispatched his servant to say to those invited, 'Come, everything is now ready.' But one by one, they all began to excuse themselves. The first said to him, 'I have purchased a field and must go to examine it; I ask you, consider me excused.' And another said, 'I have purchased five yoke of oxen and am on my way to evaluate them; I ask you, consider me excused.' And another said, 'I have just married a woman, and therefore I cannot come.' The servant went and reported this to his master.

Then the master of the house in a rage commanded his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in here the poor and the crippled, the blind and the lame.' The servant reported, 'Sir, your orders have been carried out and still there is room.' The master then ordered the servant, 'Go out to the highways and hedgerows and make people come in that my home may be filled. For, I tell you, none of those men who were invited will taste my dinner.'"

A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free telephone number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people, and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes, and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with complaints not involving clergy or church personnel should refer to the archdiocesan web site at www.aod.org for contact information for civil authorities.
