On The Easter Journey

+There are numerous paintings of the Pentecost scene. Often they artfully depict Mary and the Apostles gathered in the Upper Room. Tongues of fire neatly appear on top of each head.

But let us listen carefully to the Scriptures. In our first reading from Acts, Luke depicts a much larger group of disciples – Mary and the Apostles (including the newly-chosen Matthias), men and women, young and old, all followers of Jesus – perhaps as many as 120 (Acts 1:15). These were all followers of Jesus – they had witnessed his miracles, loved his message, grieved at his death and rejoiced at his resurrection. They must have been bewildered. Jesus had promised to be with them always, but they felt very alone. They were sticking together; they were crowded into a house, and they were praying.

This was no quiet scene. *And suddenly, there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.*

This Spirit had been promised by Jesus. He had said that He would not leave them orphaned: *The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you* (John 14:26). And in today's Gospel, He had breathed this Spirit of grace upon his Apostles and given them power to forgive sins.

Jews from every nation were outside of that crowded house. They had gathered in Jerusalem for the ancient feast of Pentecost – fifty days after Passover (it was a celebration of God's giving of the Law to Moses). Yet each heard the disciples in their own language, and over time, thousands were converted.

Two thousand years later, we gather in our churches. Like those early followers of Christ, we find solace in communal prayer. Like them, we crave the words of Jesus and we feast at his table. Like them, we exist in a world of uncertainty and opposing rhetoric. Like them, we find strength in a Christian community. Most important, like them, we have been redeemed by Christ's sacrifice and have been baptized and sealed in his Spirit.

We may not feel the strong driving wind nor see the tongues of fire, but the Spirit is here and dwelling among us. He has given us varied gifts in order to build up God's kingdom. That same Spirit of Jesus is empowering each of us to go out and boldly proclaim the Good News – that Jesus Christ has died for all, that He has forgiven our sins, that He has destroyed death's power over us, and that in all things, Jesus loves us.

This is our task and challenge, to *Unleash the Gospel* to everyone we meet on our life's journey! May we be bold in our mission, and do it joyfully in forming a band of missionary disciples!

+This weekend at all masses, we will hear a letter from Archbishop Vigneron regarding the parishes moving forward with the next phase of *Unleash the Gospel*. There will be 9 parishes entering a "pilot/partnership" phase to explore the overall process. These parishes will work through the issues of putting together a "Missionary Strategic Plan" for their community and help leaders in assessing the procedures that could/should be used in a diocesan-wide effort. After their "dry run", time will be spent in reviewing results and making modifications to "instruction plans", and then preparing the packages for Archdiocesan-wide roll-out. While there is a financial component involved, the essence of this effort is to help us all grow in faith, put plans in place to help us in that effort, and assess costs that might be involved with each local plan. With this being Pentecost Sunday, let us pray for the Holy Spirit to guide and direct each of us in our missionary efforts!

+What progress we see with our building project! If you walk through the chapel hallway and peek through some of the windows, you can see some substantial work being done on the inside (what a difference a roof can make!) Also, be careful as work on the curbs and sidewalks is being done when we have some days of good weather; we truly need to pray for some DRY, warm weather so work can proceed more smoothly than our past weather conditions have allowed us to do.

In concert with the building project, our parish 2019 CSA campaign has reached \$367,253 in donations/pledges – we have reached our target of \$352,457! Amen, alleluia! We now move into the phase where all the money pledged and paid (\$14,796 so far) will be coming back 100% to the parish for use on our building project. My prayerful gratitude to those who have made their commitment! (And may I encourage those who have not yet come forward to please support our parish family and make a pledge today? Thanks!!)

+This Sunday evening, we have the second of our scheduled JAM sessions – an opportunity to listen to some powerful preaching, engage in some heartfelt singing, and spending time with Jesus in Eucharistic adoration and praise. Things start at 7 p.m. Sunday night – why not try spending some special time with the Lord as we enter into summer?!?

+Please be mindful of parking on the surrounding side streets. We have received communications from one of our neighbors who has repeatedly complained that cars often block part of her driveway on Saturday evenings and Sunday mornings. The law states that cars are to be parked at least 3 feet away from the driveways; if not, you may be ticketed.

+Schools will be completing their year of studies this week, if they haven't already done so. (Yeah!) May we enjoy the beauty of this season. A quick reminder – please dress appropriately for church, not your beach wear or summer cocktail party clothing. Give thanks and praise to God for the wonders of the gifts we have received! I look forward to seeing you in church!

Safety and security at Mass

In general, everyone should be aware of what is going on in the church and alert to any emergencies such as someone fainting or falling, any suspicious people or activities. If you see something, notify an usher or a staff member. Most of the ushers have been trained on CPR and our AED machine, they also know the procedure for working with emergency personnel when 911 is called.

As Msgr. Mike noted in his article, the staff has been attending trainings and receives regular updates regarding potential threats to houses of worship. In the past, members of the staff have attended a training from Homeland Security and recently were at a presentation by the Oakland County Sheriff's Office.

At the beginning of the building project, the Rochester Fire Chief met with the ushers on evacuation procedures in the event of an emergency. As we near the completion of the building project, we will be reviewing what changes need to be implemented with additional doors and building locations.

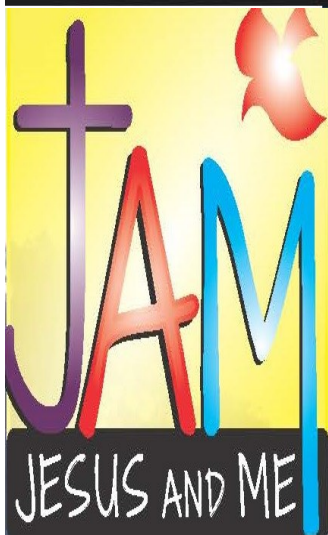

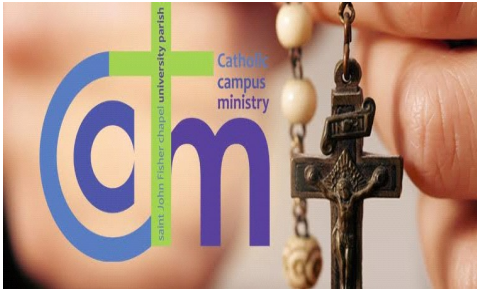

Striving Towards Virtue

The first thing we need to realize is that we're not perfect. Most obvious statement ever. That's not an excuse to not fix things though. We should be striving towards holiness each and every day. A year from now, you should see noticeable differences in emotional and spiritual maturity. This means admitting things that we fall short at, and strive to improve them.

One example is patience. Does the ineptitude of other drivers on the road cause you to be enraged? That is an opportunity to grow in patience.

Do you ever choose the fun stuff rather than the work? Maybe you were planning on studying, but a friend invited you to the Tigers game, so you decide to push off studying until you get home resulting in lack of sleep. Or perhaps you're playing too much video games or watching too much TV, and it's affecting your schooling, working, or relationships.

Matthew 20:26-28 reads "Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you shall be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you shall be your slave. Just so, the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." Are you regularly expressing charity towards your family, friends, co-workers, teachers, servers, etc? Do you help bring in the groceries without complaining? When you notice someone in need of help, do you step up?

The great thing about life is that there will always be something to work on. There are always ways we can improve. Working on these things doesn't mean we won't fall, but hopefully we get up quicker than the time before. I'd get angry at other people so quickly and bottle it up, eventually I realized that's causing me pain and it's holding me back from Heaven. So I've been working on letting things go. Sometimes it's easy, other times it seems impossible. But the key is to notice improvement. As you attempt to improve, have patience with yourself. The only people who are perfect are in Heaven, we're not there yet ;)

You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Praise be to Jesus Christ, now and forever! At the first Pentecost, Christ came to his apostles and breathed onto them the transforming power of the Holy Spirit. He breathes on us today, his faithful in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

We find ourselves very much like the apostles who were gathered in a room. Like them, our hearts rejoice when we encounter Jesus. Like them, he sends us on a mission and gives us his Holy Spirit so that we may go out and Unleash the Gospel.

God is pouring out his Spirit so we can continue the work of the apostles. The Spirit enables us to proclaim the Good News to those in our families, workplaces and communities. The Holy Spirit, our Advocate, gives us the courage to continue our missionary journey.

And on this day, I would like to announce the **next phase of our movement to Unleash the Gospel: the renewal of our parishes**. For the Gospel to truly be unleashed, we must re-found our parishes so that everything we do — how we pray, how we minister, how we serve — leads us to be more effective witnesses to the Gospel.

This next phase of our missionary journey will require prayer, innovation, and hard work so that our parish communities become what God made them to be: places where individuals and families encounter Jesus anew, grow as his disciples, and are equipped to be witnesses of the Risen Christ.

To spark this transformation, each parish in the Archdiocese will create a plan to realign all its activity and ministry to our shared mission to Unleash the Gospel. These missionary strategic plans will provide the direction and focus for each parish's missionary transformation.

Today, ten parishes in the Archdiocese will begin the process of creating these plans. I am grateful for the apostolic courage of these first pastors and their parishes. Other parishes will follow early next year and more will continue after.

into bands of joyful missionary disciples.*


*Come Holy Spirit:

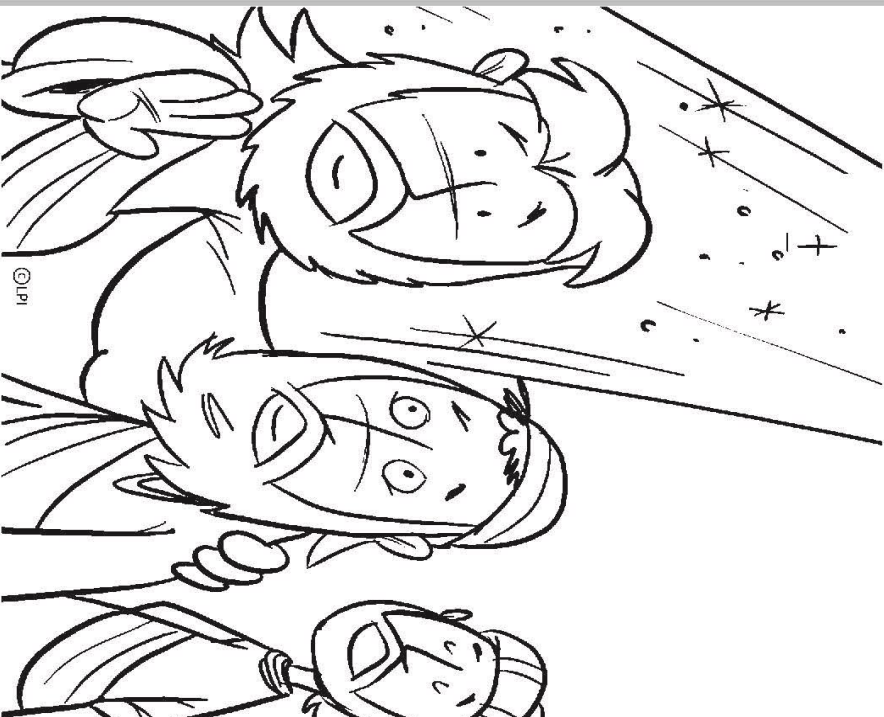
