On The Journey

+Our Scriptures today present us with a challenge to live out our Christian lives wholeheartedly, to love God with everything that is in us, and to put aside our own comfort and ease in the service of our neighbor – especially at the moment we see our neighbor in need.

In the first reading, Moses presents us with this deep challenge as he tells his fellow Israelites to return to God with *all your heart and all your soul*, listening to God and obeying God's commands. In the Gospel, the scholar seems to understand this demand when he tells Jesus that the way to eternal life is to *love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your minds – and your neighbor as yourself*.

This is a tall order. It calls on us to examine our conscience. It asks us to think about all that we do each day, and ask ourselves whether or not we are indeed loving God and neighbor absolutely and completely. We might consider how we give this love in the midst of our busy lives, when we have children to take care of, jobs that call on much of our attention each day, and responsibilities to our friends and our community.

One way to do this is through love and service to our neighbor – especially at difficult and inconvenient times. That was certainly the case in Jesus' parable in the Gospel. The Samaritan probably had his own plans for the day as he walked along the road. Yet, the moment he saw the robbers' victim lying on the road, severely injured, he dropped his plans and responded. He showed incredible care for this stranger, his neighbor, even changing his plans to return the next day to ensure that this neighbor was looked after.

This great love for God and neighbor is a "simple" command that we all know can at times be difficult to follow. Moses reminds us that God's law is written within our hearts. All we need is to listen to God as He speaks within our hearts and respond fully to what we are told to do at each individual moment. This could mean praise and adoration of God – or responding to the immediate situation: calling a friend whose mother died; listening to a child's tale of woe; or helping the stranger at our office door.

As we listen to or read Sacred Scripture, when we approach the altar, let us pray for open, loving hearts and minds, ready to respond out of total love for God to

We ask all of this in the all-powerful name of the Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns forever.

whatever is being asked of us at each moment. May our firm “yes” demonstrate that we are committed to love God in our love for our neighbor - showing that we are ready to help *unleash the Gospel* in all we say and do!

+With the upcoming petition drive to put legislation to end dismemberment abortions on the November ballot, we will be having a petition-signing effort here at St. Andrew. With our new Christian Service director Sam now on board, he will be working to re-institute a Right to Life committee here at the parish. Interested? Contact Sam!

+The weather this past week (if it holds true to the forecast, as I write my article on Monday afternoon!) looks as if it will have given the construction crews some solid time to make progress on the campus, especially the parking lots, lighting and other outside elements. (The work on the inside of the west gathering space is pretty much non-weather-dependent by now). We are looking forward to getting Detroit Edison to come out and install the new transformer and make the switch from the old to new equipment (we could lose power in church for part of a day with that work). Keep praying for this good weather so we can get the outside work done in time before school starts.

And again, still – please be careful when on the parish grounds...and please be patient with one another. It would be nice for those who are more ambulatory to park farther away from the doors to the church on the weekends, giving easier access to those who may have some difficulties walking from the street parking.

In conjunction with our project, we have moved forward with our 2019 CSA since last I updated you before the holiday week. We have now pledged \$455,713 against our goal of \$352,457, generating a potential refund of \$103,256, should all pledges be honored. My prayerful gratitude to the 731 families who so far have made a commitment this year. I ask those who haven't yet made a commitment to please do so as soon as possible and help us in our building efforts!

MISSION OF THE LAITY

Free Online Course Presented by Sacred Heart Seminary

Sacred Heart Major Seminary is once again offering a free non-credit online course. The course, “**The Mission of the Laity**,” is perfect for the everyday Catholic seeking to encounter the radiating beauty of the laity's mission.

Participants will be introduced to the incredible dignity and mission of the lay faithful. Through their consecration in Baptism and their anointing in Confirmation, the laity receive a high calling in Christ and the Spirit. Christ gives each of us a share in His mission and calls us into a radical life of missionary discipleship.

There are three traditional roles assigned to this lay mission: the priestly, the prophetic, and the royal. Each week of the course will be dedicated to one of these and the ways we are called to live them out — both in the Church and in the world.
