On The Journey

+An interesting and true story to consider: a young mother with three young children in tow found a pew toward the back of the church. She regularly did this so that she could make a graceful exit if one of her children needed the bathroom or started to squirm a little too much. A few minutes late, an older parishioner came up to the young mother and announced that she was sitting in her seat. She quietly moved over, knowing her escape route had now been compromised.

Almost as if on cue, when the first reading began, one of the children started crying. The older parishioner who forced her way into "her pew" started glaring at this young mother. Thankfully, another older parishioner, sitting right behind her, leaned forward and quietly offered to watch the two other children while she took care of the one who needed her attention at the moment.

Thus, the Martha and Mary debate seems to continue even today: doing what is most important in the right moment. Do we listen to Jesus or tend to his needs? In the story above, one older parishioner wants to sit at the feet of Jesus and hear what He has to say without being disrupted. The other parishioner seems more concerned with meeting the needs of a distraught mother. In this instance, we might say that the parishioner who came to the aid of the mother did so because she was already hearing exactly what Jesus had to say, and she *acted* on it.

As a Church, we continue to struggle with how to make anyone and everyone welcome in our midst regardless of their circumstances. The Eucharist we gather to celebrate is an incredible gift given to us by a God who loves us beyond words. Both Martha and Mary's talents are needed within us so that we can bring others to Christ – so we can bring others to the Lord's Table.

If we grow complacent in our responsibility in not only *hearing* the word of God, but in *acting* upon it, the Church will suffer. Let none of us be responsible for turning away anyone who comes to our doors seeking Christ. Let us *hear* with urgency God's word spoken here - and let us *act* upon it. We can be both Martha and Mary at the same time!

+With the relatively good weather this past week (talk about summer heat!), the construction crews were able to proceed with more work outside on the parking lots, sidewalks, etc. Of course, the inside work is not so weather-dependent, and thus,

JOACHIM and ANNE

The story of Mary's birth and details about her aging parents, Joachim and Anne, come from apocryphal writings known as the Protoevangelium of James the Lesser that was written by an unknown author. Apocryphal writings are often connected with Scriptural themes although they are not deemed part of the canon of the Catholic church.

The Rev. Bert Buby, S.M., a Marian scholar at the University of Dayton, calls the Protoevangelium account "a very imaginative, creative story about the birth of Mary, written about 150 A.D." In the beginning of the Protovangelium, Joachim is fasting in the wilderness and Anne is mourning in her garden, both of them lamenting their childlessness. An angel appears to Anne, promises her that she will conceive, and then directs her attention to her returning husband. Anne and Joachim share a tremendous embrace indicating their great confidence in God that a child will be born, and Anne does conceive. They dedicate their daughter, Mary, to God, keeping her from sin and evil. When she is three years old, Anne and Joachim present her in the temple. Joachim and Anne celebrate their feast day together on July 26.






"Make Good Choices"

Martynka Kaczmarek and her parents need our prayerful support.

At the beginning, a few words for those of you who don't know her and her story!

Martynka Kaczmarek is a little sweet Polish girl who over one year ago was diagnosed with Stage IV Neuroblastoma – an aggressive cancer that has metastasized to her liver, lungs, bones and marrow. Many people decided to support Martynka prayerfully and financially. Since December 2018, she has been receiving an experimental treatment in a special clinic in Greifswald, Germany.

A few days before her 5th birthday, which was celebrated last Saturday July 13, her parents received devastating news that the treatment is over. The cancer became more aggressive and she has become very weak. At this moment, she is still in the clinic receiving palliative care. She cannot breathe without oxygen, she receives morphine and other pain relive medications. From our human perspective her situation looks hopeless. What are we supposed to pray for? For a miracle or for a peaceful and painless death? We know what her parents, her family, and we want. We want Martynka back, healthy and happy, but what is God's will for

her – we don't know! Why does He need her suffering? Why do her parents have to go through such a difficult time in their life? What kind of blessing God has prepared that will flow from her story? We don't know! We believe that whatever HE wants, it will be the best for HER! Please join me in prayers for Martynka and her parents.

God of love, mercy and healing – if you need Martynka in Your Kingdom – receive her with Peace. If you need her, here on earth please perform a miracle for her, we believe that you can do that because for you "everything is possible". Give strength and faith to the parents: Emilia and Michael. May your will be done always, may Jesus take care of Martynka and her parents. Despite of everything, we TRUST in YOU!
