On The Journey

+We live in a world where the internet has become an essential communication method. Friends and family members no longer have to wait days or weeks to receive a letter; communication is almost instantaneous. Although the ease and speed of internet messaging is a blessing, it may also reduce the intimacy and sensitivity that generally comes with face-to-face conversations, making it easier to be less tactful in our internet dialogue.

When Jesus teaches his disciples to pray, He is giving them something much more than a speedier form of communication. He is providing them with an intimate way to communicate with God, and He spells out the expectations that come with this new way of relating with God. Consider for a moment the words Jesus suggests we use when we pray: *Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins to we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test.*

In these few words, Jesus is teaching his disciples, and all future generations who offer this prayer, that God is our Father, who loves us as a parent and seeks an intimate relationship with us. Whereas past generations relied on patriarchs and prophets to speak on our behalf, through Jesus we discover that we can communicate directly with God.

Even though we are sinners, we, too, can presume to speak to God. Even though we may have done dreadful and terrible things, God continues to love us, forgive us and draw us ever closer.

But the Lord's Prayer also reminds us: if we are children of God who have experienced the Lord's forgiveness, we are expected to *forgive everyone in debt to us*. This call to forgive is challenging. It begins with simple acts of kindness and a desire to forgive our neighbor when they have offended us.

Our resolve to live the Lord's Prayer will be tested, but the same Jesus who taught us how to pray also gave us the Eucharist, his Body and Blood, so that we are nourished and strengthened for the daily challenges we will face.

Let us not be afraid to accept this awesome invitation from the Lord, to deepen our relationship with Him and build up the Body of Christ, the Church, here on earth!

closer to the school have been worked on. Note that we are going down from three to two driveways on the school side of the parking lot; this is a city request to help with traffic flow. Hopefully by the time you read this, some of the asphalt work may even be done on that side.

Please note that when the first course of asphalt goes down on the south side by the school, they will jump to the north side of the parking lot by the offices and rectory, to prepare that side for the final course of asphalt too. So-o-o-o-o, what that says is.....be careful (as always!!) and at various times, the north section of the lot may be closed, while the south portion by the school will be open for church and office business. Please just watch the signs and directions of any volunteers. We need to get the parking lots done before school starts in just one month!

The inside of the gathering space is definitely taking shape with the drywall almost finished. We also had a “new green machine” – the new power transformer – dropped off by DTE, and if all goes well, they will try to hook it up soon (if not already); that will be highly dependent on demands placed on them by the weather/power outages across the area. So continue to pray for good weather.....

Sing Praise to the Lord, Give thanks to His name.

Saint Ignatius of Loyola was a Spanish Basque Catholic priest and theologian, who co-founded the religious order called the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and became its first Superior General at Paris in 1541. The Jesuit order served the Pope as missionaries, and they were bound by a vow of special obedience to the sovereign pontiff in regard to the missions. They therefore emerged as an important force during the time of the Counter-Reformation.

Ignatius is remembered as a talented spiritual director. He recorded his method in a celebrated treatise called the *Spiritual Exercises*, a simple set of meditations, prayers, and other mental exercises, first published in 1548.

Ignatius was beatified in 1609, and then canonized, receiving the title of Saint on 12 March 1622. His feast day is celebrated on 31 July. He is the patron saint of the Basque provinces of Gipuzkoa and Biscay as well as the Society of Jesus, and was declared patron saint of all spiritual retreats by Pope Pius XI in 1922. Ignatius is also a foremost patron saint of soldiers.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and Children

How does one become Catholic?

Many Catholics are born into Catholic families and gradually come to share in the full Sacramental life of the Church. Others, previously baptized in other Christian Churches or never baptized, become Catholic through a process known as The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Children over the age of seven participate in a modified process, The Rite of Christian Initiation of Children. The Rites of Initiation of adults and children are the Catholic Church's way of initiating new members. At St. Andrew Parish we warmly welcome new members and attempt to provide an appropriate spiritual formation for each inquirer.

Who may participate?

Those never baptized as Christians. Those baptized in another Christian faith tradition now interested in the Catholic tradition. Those baptized in the Catholic tradition whose sacramental reception is not complete. Children over the age of seven who have not received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist or Confirmation.

How long is the process?

RCIA is not a class or a program but a process of conversion. It prepares one to embark on a journey of faith that leads to a lifelong commitment as a Catholic. All Catholics are called to daily conversion and renewal of our faith journey. RCIA stresses the need for a living experience of Church as a "people of God" and not just "knowledge" about the Church. A person's desire to turn toward God (conversion) and become connected to a community does not happen instantaneously, but takes time as the Holy Spirit nurtures the deepening desire within. The usual length of preparation is approximately nine months to a year. In most cases, the initiation of new members is celebrated at the Easter Vigil.

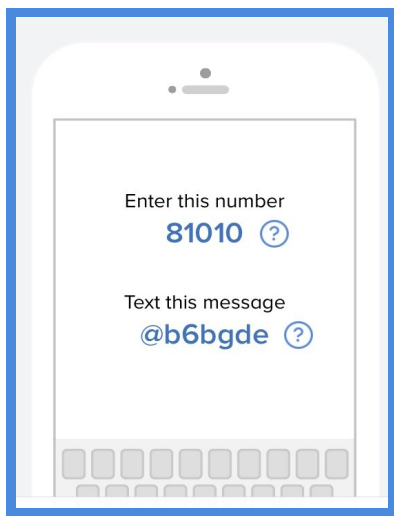

This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only.
