On The Journey

+We know that Jesus is Lord and God; He can do all things. Does He need the help of the seventy-two He sends out two-by-two in today's Gospel? No – and yes. No, because He saves the world all by himself. Yes, however, because He wants humanity to assist Him in building up the Kingdom and bringing salvation to all humankind. He is setting in motion the building up of the Church that will take up the reins of leadership after He has ascended into heaven.

Jesus sends these men out to heal the sick, forgive sins, cast out demons and announce the Kingdom of God. The harvest is plenty, the laborers are few. By chapter ten of Luke, which we heard from today, Jesus has already begun his final journey to Jerusalem - and to Calvary. Jesus knows his days are numbered, but the whole world must be touched by his message.

The chosen ones are told to travel lightly. All they can carry with them besides the clothing on their back is total trust in the providence of God to meet their needs. Hospitality would be the measure by which they would gauge the success or failure of their mission. Where God's word was welcomed, people would also welcome those who preached it. Likewise, where the Gospel was rejected, these disciples would shake the dust from their feet and move on to other towns. History shows acceptance and rejection from Jewish and Gentile communities alike.

The underlying truth of these instructions, it seems, is this: whether people want to listen or not, regardless of whether they come to believe it or not, *the Kingdom of God is (in fact) at hand*. And this fact requires something of everyone – repentance and faith. Jesus has given the disciples power over *serpents and scorpions* – they have nothing to fear if they trust in the Lord. The same is true for all who believe. Remember that Jesus said, *the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few*. The laborers are you and me. They are not some "other people." So let's start the work of the Kingdom today by traveling lightly, shedding the excess baggage of sin and worry, and depending on God to complete the great work He has begun in us. *Each* of us is called to help spread the Good News by word and deed.

Isaiah said, *The Lord's power shall be known to his servants*. This explains the unparalleled success of the early Church's first missionary excursion. From Jerusalem to the ends of the earth, all will experience the comfort and love of a merciful God thanks to the preaching of a chosen few.

My friends, the Kingdom of God is at hand, and that requires something of everyone. Are we ready to join in the call to Unleash the Gospel? Let us pray for the grace to carry out that charge!

+As we move forward into summer and welcome new staff members, we will have them do a little write-up about themselves as a means of introducing themselves to our parish family. Please join me in extending a warm St. Andrew welcome as we help them to share in the leadership of this great community of faith.

+With some reasonable weather lately, we have been able to make some good progress on our project. The concrete pole bases have been going in, so then the electrical contractor can start connecting them and hoisting the parking lot light poles in place. We hope that the drain work on the south side begins soon; without that, the asphalt cannot be put down. The contractor will work at keeping the lane open right next to the school so we can have limited access to the lots by the Activities Building and MPR. ***Please be patient*** with one another in entering and exiting the church property. Thank you for your understanding!

+Your prayers have been working in that a few states have recently voted to severely limit abortions within their governance (would have been nice to completely stop them, but we take all good movement forward to that point). We need to continue to work at putting an end to abortion and protect the life of the unborn innocents in ALL states! (I recently had a call in which I think the caller was complaining, mistakenly thinking that some of these new laws permitted a *more lenient* approach to abortions in these few states, but the case is rather just the opposite.)

Here in Michigan, there is forthcoming a citizens' petition drive to initiate legislation to prohibit the dismemberment abortion procedure. This petition drive, operating under the committee name "Michigan Values Life," is organized by Right to Life of Michigan and is supported by the Michigan Catholic Conference. We need to support this movement and seek petitions to sign to get such legislation on the ballot.

+Someone had also asked about why the American flag "suddenly" disappeared from the church, and why I was not honoring our country. First, the flag has not been in the sanctuary for years, and was not there from the time I arrived, almost seven years ago. It stands proudly by the Service Men & Women's Memorial wall in the chapel hallway. Liturgical guidelines direct the parishes, stating that flags are not appropriate in the sanctuary space (that includes the Vatican/Church flag). However at the time of special national holidays, we do bring it forward to the sacred space to make sure we remember how blessed we are to live in the United States of America, and to honor our military for all that they have done/continue to do for keeping this great land safe and free. Once the new gathering space is finished, we have already been considering special spots for these flags.

+Hopefully you have been enjoying this Fourth of July holiday, or as for many, the start of a summer vacation. I pray for your safety and enjoyment during these days that can bring families and friends together and build up the bonds of community and love. Let it **not** be a time of vacation from the Lord, however, from whom all good things and bountiful blessings flow! In that light, I pray that you find a parish church close to your destination so that you can give thanks and praise to God. For those of you who are "home," I look forward to seeing you in church!
