On The Journey

+Today's first reading is another version of a familiar scenario: a prophet ignored, derided and mistreated. In this case, it is Jeremiah who prophesied in Jerusalem during the reign of Zedekiah. For many years he had warned the people of Judah about an oncoming disaster. Often referred to as the *weeping prophet*, Jeremiah scolded the Jewish leadership of the day for its failure to worship the one true God alone, and for its reliance on military alliances rather than trusting in the Lord.

Of course, no one wanted to hear these words of doom and gloom. In fact, determined to silence him forever, but to avoid having his blood on their hands, those in power contrived to have him arrested and imprisoned in a muddy cistern. There, they hoped he would be forgotten and would die.

As a prophet, Jeremiah brought division. Not because God sought to instigate such, but because people choosing whether to listen to and follow God's word – or not – necessarily divided the community. With a message no one wanted to hear, Jeremiah knew that his fidelity to the Lord could possibly result in death and yet he did not shy away from obeying God's call.

On his way to Jerusalem, Jesus tells his disciples that He has come to establish not peace but division. He describes how his message will divide communities and pit family members against family members. Relationships will suffer, and He himself will suffer death. As with previous prophets, those who heard – and still hear – Jesus' message had the choice to heed or ignore it. *That* is what divides. Because when we enter into Christ's baptism with Him, we are united to Him - and with each other.

Today, our lives as Christians are often marked with the same kinds of turmoil as our ancestors. Just as the cross is never too far from the empty tomb, so struggles and suffering are part of the human condition. Yet as Christians, we are challenged to keep our eyes firmly fixed on the Lord – never losing sight of his presence and his offer of grace. We are challenged to choose Christ's message uniting ourselves to and drawing strength from all those who walk the pathway of the Christian life with us.

Will we say "yes, my Lord" to the call and challenges of our faith? What *will* our response be?

Overview of St. Andrew Intercessory Prayer

Per Archbishop Alan Vigneron's pastoral letter, "Unleash the Gospel" we have started an intercessory prayer group. 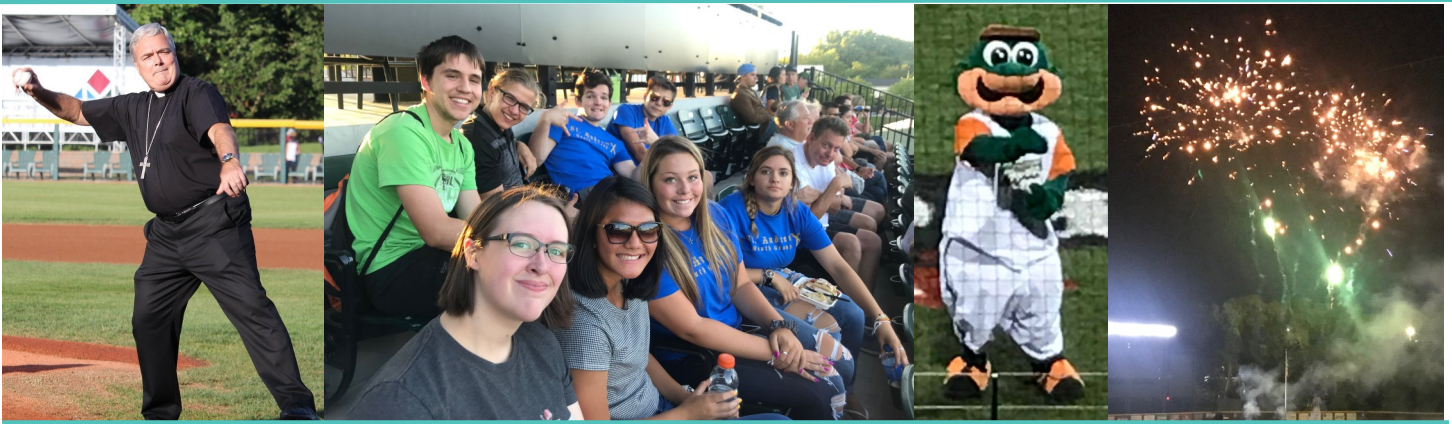

RCIA...Part of Being a Joyful Missionary in the Catholic Church

Has someone asked you about your faith, inquired about being baptized, or completing their Sacraments, or was baptized in another faith but would like to learn more about the Catholic Church? Do you know someone who has an interest in becoming a Catholic?

The decision to become a member of the Catholic faith is often fostered by invitation by a member of our faith community. This means you! By our Baptism we are all called into missionary discipleship, and therefore, are in a key position to invite others into our faith journey. This is how we "Unleash the Gospel"!

The process known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process of prayer, learning, and joining with others who feel the Spirit of God nudging them to the Catholic Faith. Within the RCIA process are those adults who have never been baptized those who have been baptized in another faith, or Baptized Catholic but have not completed their initiation (have not celebrated First Eucharist or Confirmation).

The process of joining the Church is not as simple as filling out a "membership application". It starts with someone inviting an interested person to attend an RCIA session. Will you be that someone to extend an invitation? Will you be a joyful Missionary for Jesus?

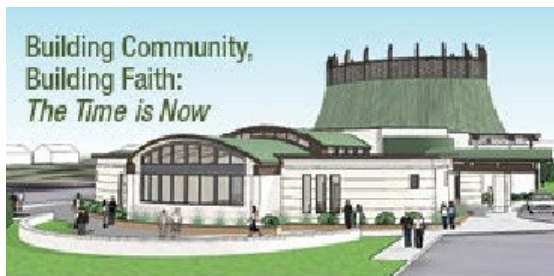

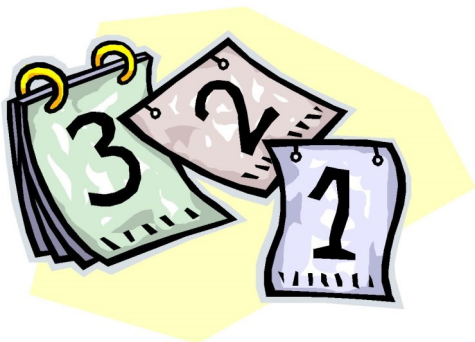
