On The Journey

+There's a little story that's been around for many years; maybe you've heard it. There is a novice monk who entered a monastery where the vow of silence limited all speaking to two words every ten years. After this novice completed his first decade, the abbot asked him: "What are the two words you would like to speak? The monk said: "Bed...hard," and the abbot said, "I see." Ten years later, the monk returned to the abbot's office and was again asked the same question: "What are the two words you would like to speak?" His response: "Food...stinks" to which the abbot responds "I see." Yet another ten years passed, and once again the abbot asked the monk the same question: "What are your two words now?" "I ...quit!" said the monk. "Well, I can see why," replied the abbot, "all you ever do is complain."


This monk had spent 30 years in the monastery, immersed in the Scriptures, listening and studying Jesus' teachings, attending liturgies and most importantly receiving the Eucharist - eating and drinking Jesus' Body and Blood. Yet, somehow he still missed the point of it all. His interests were not in things associated with the kingdom that Jesus speaks about, but rather in those temporal things that mattered to him. By placing his needs first, he failed to see the value of the discipline that the author of the letter to the Hebrews suggests will bring the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it.

His story illustrates how our attitude, and failure to act from a place of God's love, can dampen our awareness of it. For God's love, kindness and fidelity are bursting out in everything around us. If we are to proclaim the Good News and unleash the Gospel to everyone whom we encounter on our journey through life, it begins by aligning our works and thoughts with the message of the cross, which truly proclaims the steadfast kindness and fidelity of God. We profess this faith when we speak two words, "I believe." Or when we affirm our belief with one word: "Amen."

Like the monk in the little story, we are privileged and blessed to consume the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ – his real presence! Let our "amen" in receiving Him indicate not just that we believe in who He is, but that we are committed to building our relationship with Him - such that we never hear the words from Him, Depart from me...I do not know where you are from. A relationship built here on earth will allow us to recline [with Him] at table in the kingdom of God for all eternity.


Our fundamental call is to develop an ever-deepening relationship with Jesus. May our response always be "yes, my Lord"! (continued on page 3)

Last weekend at the 5 p.m. Saturday mass, I had a huge smile on my face as I was directing cars into the now-open south parking lot for the first time since school let out in June. (One parishioner also asked if there was 'valet parking' now available too! Lol!) And now, hopefully by the time you are reading this article, the parking lot will be finished with its final course of asphalt and will even have stripes for parking on it! The construction people are working hard and long to make sure things are in place because we know what Monday is: **the first day of school for Holy Family students!!** And with no buses until the public schools start, this first week will see a "sea of cars" bringing and picking up students. **PLEASE: Everyone just be extra careful in the morning and afternoon drop-off/pick-up times with the students!**

The parking lot flow was designed by the civil engineers in conjunction with our architect and the city planning folks – along with our constant review/input. We will host a holy hour once a month after the morning mass.

The Holy Hour will include adoration of the blessed sacrament.




