On The Journey

+There is a simple, good and holy custom that exists among some folks. Whenever a funeral procession passes by, one pauses and prays for the person who has died, and for the family grieving their loss. Whether or not we have participated in that custom, it is doubtful any of us has ever witnessed a U-Haul following the hearse to the cemetery.

Why? Because of the old adage, "You can't take it with you."

Fool is not a word we are accustomed to hearing Jesus use. Jesus's use of the word in today's parable is done so to drive home a very important reality. If we are going to spend our lives chasing after things that in the end will not follow us in that U-Haul to the cemetery, instead of following after Him, we may not like where we end up.

Jesus does not condemn the rich or call everyone to live in poverty. It is about <u>balance</u>. It is about perspective. Saint Paul puts it this way today: *Put to death....immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire and greed that is idolatry.*

Another way to approach this would be to ask ourselves about our most fundamental and underlying motives for our decisions, behaviors and actions. Is it to serve others or simply to get ahead in life? If we approach whatever we do with the attitude of service to others, we will be rich beyond our imagination. If we approach our actions only with the attitude of, "bigger is better, status is important, success at the expense of others is part of the cost of doing business," then we are headed toward spiritual poverty, which can produce catastrophic consequences.

We must see each person, including ourselves, as equally contributing to the kingdom of God; each according to his or her abilities and blessings. Remember, God does not show favorites. We are all to be on the same path, for Christ is within each of us, guiding us and sometimes pulling us toward the finish live. So let us spend our time growing rich in the things of God and not of this world.

+Next weekend, we will be visited by Fr. Linus Kinyua as our annual Mission Appeal guest. Fr. Linus represents the Diocese of Meru in Kenya, Africa. The diocese of Meru serves a population of 1.8 million people, half of whom are Catholic. In Meru, their main source of income is farming, but due to the multi-year drought, there have been scarce to no crop production. It is because of this dire situation that the diocese is making this appeal — for prayers and financial support. Please welcome Fr. Linus next weekend as he makes this year's appeal.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and Children

How does one become Catholic?

Many Catholics are born into Catholic families and gradually come to share in the full Sacramental life of the Church. Others, previously baptized in other Christian Churches or never baptized, become Catholic through a process known as The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Children over the age of seven participate in a modified process, The Rite of Christian Initiation of Children. The Rites of Initiation of adults and children are the Catholic Church's way of initiating new members. At St. Andrew Parish we warmly welcome new members and attempt to provide an appropriate spiritual formation for each inquirer.

Who may participate?

Those never baptized as Christians. Those baptized in another Christian faith tradition now interested in the Catholic tradition. Those baptized in the Catholic tradition whose sacramental reception is not complete. Children over the age of seven who have not received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist or Confirmation.

How long is the process?

RCIA is not a class or a program but a process of conversion. It prepares one to embark on a journey of faith that leads to a lifelong commitment as a Catholic. All Catholics are called to daily conversion and renewal of our faith journey. RCIA stresses the need for a living experience of Church as a "people of God" and not just "knowledge" about the Church. A person's desire to turn toward God (conversion) and become connected to a community does not happen instantaneously, but takes time as the Holy Spirit nurtures the deepening desire within. The usual length of preparation is approximately nine months to a year. In most cases, the initiation of new members is celebrated at the Easter Vigil.
