On The Journey

+WE WELCOME ARCHBISHOP ALLEN VIGNERON TO ST. ANDREW PARISH AS WE CELEBRATE THE DEDICATION OF OUR NEW BUILDING and bring our parish family together for our ANNUAL PARISH PICNIC!

+Today's Gospel, and particularly the parable of the prodigal son, reminds us of the merciful love that God the Father has for all of us, his children. Jesus depicts so poignantly the love found in the character of the father who runs out to greet his wayward son before he is even home – and who celebrates his son's safe return with the feast of the fatted calf.

We might wonder how a father can be so quickly and completely forgiving of a son who prematurely took a share of the father's wealth (to which he was not even entitled, because he was not the older son and heir), abandoned the family, and wasted the hard-earned money on immoral and reckless acts. But Jesus reminds us, as He did the Pharisees and scribes at the beginning of the Gospel, that God the Father himself is merciful, for Jesus was sent to encourage sinners to turn away from their sins and turn toward God.

These readings challenge us on many levels. If we are like the younger, prodigal son, it might be hard to imagine that God could forgive us for the wrongs we might have done, for the times that we turned away from God. But in the second reading, Paul reminds Timothy that God not only forgave him for his persecution of the Church, He called Paul to great glory as an Apostle. Paul describes himself as the foremost of sinners, who *was mercifully treated, so that in me, as the foremost, Christ Jesus might display all his patience as an example for those who would come to believe in Him for everlasting life.*

Through his mercy for this most zealous persecutor of the early Christians, Jesus gave Paul the grace to become one of his greatest advocates and one of the shining stars of the Church. If any of us feel that we have committed some wrong that can't be forgiven – or have strayed so long that we can't be welcomed back – we can take courage and comfort from these readings.

But, just as the readings encourage us to accept the mercy of God, they also challenge us to extend God's mercy to others. For we also know that the measure we give to others is what we shall receive. We are forgiven, as we forgive. And we have this Good News to share with anyone who needs to hear it: come home!

So as we accept God's mercy, let us extend it to others and rejoice, constantly responding to the challenge to *Unleash the Gospel*, bringing those who are lost home.

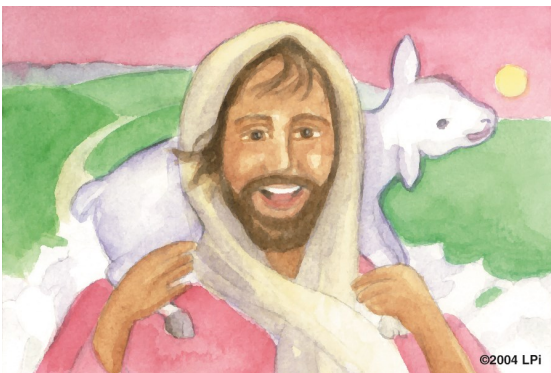

There has been a lot of hard work, long hours, many discussions and much sacrificial giving and financial support that has gone into our building project. It stems back to part of the parish vision of 2007, and our more recent *Changing Lives Together* efforts of 2013. Now we can see this part of those dreams become reality – and for that, we give God thanks and praise! Our next steps will bring us into *Unleashing the Gospel* even more, and help us as we are *Sent on Mission* to bring people to Jesus.

+As our efforts are blessed, you will have this weekend an opportunity to view the space *from inside* (after the noon mass, and during the picnic). We will have some folks wandering around the space (plus, yours truly!) to explain the rooms and see where we stand on the project overall.

Sadly, the west addition is not complete. Over these months of construction, you have heard the many stories and challenges that we have had to work through, so I will not bore you by repeating them. Most recently, and of major impact, was the delay in installing the new transformer by DTE. Now that we can use the new power source, we are able to move forward with many aspects of building that required the additional power. Some odd mistakes include installing the wrong carpeting in some of the rooms (it looked good, except, it's NOT what we ordered!) have pushed wrapping things up by, well, I'm not sure how many more weeks. Parking lots still need some finishing touches, and of course the landscape. We're struggling to get the plumbers back, since the landscapers cut the irrigation line in four places while installing the trees. Now you know why the color of my hair has been going from grey to white.... But overall, it's safe to say we are in the home stretch!

Your generosity has been wonderful with our 2019 CSA/Building effort. So far this year, we have donations/pledges totaling \$599,183, meaning we could have a potential refund (should all pledges be honored) of almost \$250K! My prayerful thanks for your sacrificial giving!

+With all the activity surrounding our dedication and picnic this weekend, we are celebrating Catechetical Sunday next weekend. This is such an important and fulfilling ministry and since we are still in need of a few more volunteers to help teach, I am asking that you consider giving of yourself to help share the faith with our young students. All lesson plans and support material are prepared for you – we just need YOU to help us bring the message to our students. Won't you please help us out?

RCIA...Part of Being a Joyful Missionary in the Catholic Church

Has someone asked you about your faith, inquired about being baptized, or completing their Sacraments, or was baptized in another faith but would like to learn more about the Catholic Church? Do you know someone who has an interest in becoming a Catholic?

The decision to become a member of the Catholic faith is often fostered by invitation by a member of our faith community. This means you! By our Baptism we are all called into missionary discipleship, and therefore, are in a key position to invite others into our faith journey. This is how we "Unleash the Gospel"!

The process known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process of prayer, learning, and joining with others who feel the Spirit of God nudging them to the Catholic Faith. Within the RCIA process are those adults who have never been baptized those who have been baptized in another faith, or Baptized Catholic but have not completed their initiation (have not celebrated First Eucharist or Confirmation).

The process of joining the Church is not as simple as filling out a "membership application". It starts with someone inviting an interested person to attend an RCIA session. Will you be that someone to extend an invitation? Will you be a joyful Missionary for Jesus?

Petition instructions:

It is crucial that each petition be filled out precisely as directed, so none will be rendered invalid and thrown out. Please keep the following guidelines in mind.

1. You may only sign once during this petition drive.
2. You must be registered to vote in Michigan
3. The signer must sign his/her FULL name.
4. In the space provided, the signer should write his/her house number and street name or rural route. POST OFFICE BOX NUMBERS ARE INVALID.
5. The signer must write in the City or Township where he/she is registered to vote.
6. The signer must include the zip code in the space provided.
7. The signer must also write in the DATE when signing the petition, NOT A BIRTH DATE.
8. If you make a mistake, cross over your mistake and write above it or simply use a new line. Make certain that all sections have been completed.
9. Ditto marks are not acceptable (husband and wife both need to fill out their complete address).

Can I Get a Witness?

The stage-4 breast cancer she'd been battling for six
years had decimated her body and progressed to the
point that words were rare and almost impossible to
understand. Taking earthly sustenance was nothing but
a distant memory, leaving her throat muscles so atro-
phied that swallowing even a spoonful of water was
discouraged. Despite the situation, whether to receive
the Eucharist or not seemed like an easy decision.

From the hospital bed she hadn't left in three weeks,
Diane opened her mouth just wide enough for a tiny
sliver of Christ's body to provide the nourishment her
soul longed for. She slowly raised her folded hands to
her face as she consumed our Lord and lipped prayers
to heaven. At that moment, I witnessed an indescriba-
ble peace wash over that amazing child of God...and got
a glimpse of what angelic bliss must look like. I could
almost hear Jesus saying, "Peace I leave with you, my
peace I give to you." Although it didn't hit me until later,
we had just celebrated communion together for the
last time.

That heavenly sight is forever seared into my memory.
Diane experienced a peace only Jesus can provide and I
received a lasting vision more beautiful than the day
my best friend walked down the aisle to become my
wife.

She was already a miracle - surprising the experts who
predicted her imminent passing just days after her di-
agnosis and emergency surgery. But God had more to
accomplish through his faithful disciple. Almost six
years later, on one of the more difficult days of our
journey, He was still doing miracles.

Colossians 3:12-14

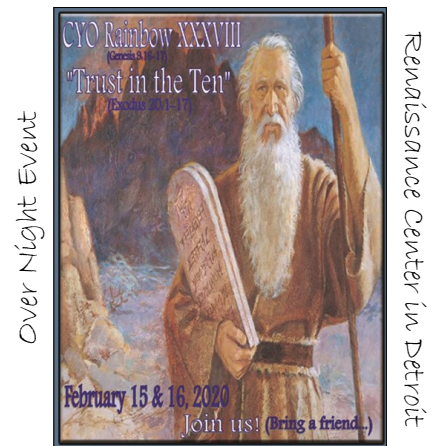

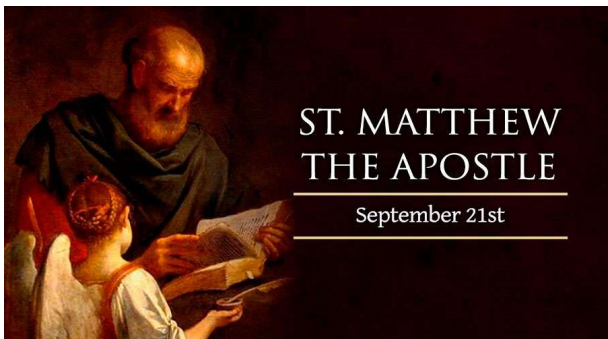

ST. MATTHEW THE APOSTLE

September 21st

Saint Matthew, the first-century tax collector turned apostle who chronicled the life and ministry of Christ in his Gospel, is celebrated by the Church today, September 21. Although relatively little is known about the life of St. Matthew, the account he wrote of Christ's ministry – traditionally considered to be the first of the four Gospels - is of inestimable value to the Church, particularly in its verification of Jesus as the Messiah.

The Gospel accounts of Mark and Luke, like Matthew's own, describe the encounter between Jesus and Matthew under the surprising circumstances of Matthew's tax-collecting duties. In

Chapter 9 of his Gospel, Matthew tells a story about how Jesus called him to follow him and how the Jewish people felt about tax collectors. Matthew wrote his Gospel for Jewish people who had become followers of Christ. He wanted his audience to know that Jesus was the Messiah that God had promised to send to save all people. Matthew's Gospel makes clear that Jesus is the fulfillment of everything said by the prophets in the Old Testament.

A witness to Christ's resurrection after death, as well as his ascension into heaven and the events of Pentecost, Matthew also recorded Jesus' instruction for the apostles to "go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

After Jesus' Ascension, Matthew preached the Gospel, as Jesus asked his disciples to do. It is believed that he established Christian communities in Ethiopia and other sections of the continent of Africa. Tradition tells us that he died as a martyr.

The symbol for Matthew's Gospel is a man with wings. Matthew wrote about Jesus' Incarnation and his Gospel makes clear that Jesus was true God and true man. Matthew is the patron saint of accountants, bankers, bookkeepers and tax collectors.

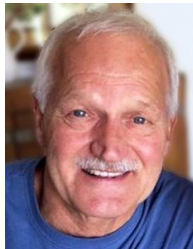

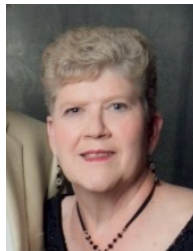
