+Each of us has a list of responsibilities that are important. We have work and families, organizations we support and people who depend on us. We try to fulfill all our duties properly. This is part of living a good, Christian life.

Undoubtedly, there are times when we could give more, and maybe even sometimes when it would be best to give a little less. But we feel committed to doing what's asked of us, and when we do these things, we feel we've done what we should – what God asks of us.

And yet, in this weekend's Gospel Jesus tells us that this is not enough. Simply fulfilling what is required as a parent, child, guardian, employee, committee chairperson, or neighbor is *not* the essence of discipleship.


Listen again to what Jesus says: If any one comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.


The force of a text like this reframes the ordinary world we know. Jesus' words should shake us up. So let's let these words do just that. According to Jesus, what is discipleship?

Discipleship is not just one more hobby or extracurricular activity. Discipleship is **why** we do what we do, mindful of the costs it brings.

What Jesus commands is prioritizing Him as the source of our life, and as its ultimate end. It is making our love for Him the ordering principle of everything else we do. For without Him, nothing else really matters – does it?




Sat. Oct. 26, 2019 – Join us!

Ephesians was one of the most widely circulated of St. Paul's writings because of its powerful, practical instructions for disciples of Christ. In fact, its six short chapters contain some of the most discussed passages in the New Testament. This study examines several much-discussed themes in today's Christian culture and society—the nature of marriage, the purpose and role of the Church, the preeminence of grace in God's plan, and the reality of spiritual warfare.

Who's Your Catechist?

"Who's Your Catechist?" is a new feature created to highlight our awesome catechists, many of whom have been volunteering in Faith Formation for many years. We asked catechists to answer a few simple questions about their experiences. This week's catechist is Andy Groen.

Andy has been a catechist for 22 years, 2 years with 6th graders and 20 years with 8th. He felt a nudge from the Holy Spirit following a request for catechists during Mass one Sunday, and has never looked back. Andy feels it is his "Heaven insurance."

He has fond memories of sharing personal stories and news stories with the students which helped them relate and open up with their own stories. He also has enjoyed playing "hangman" using faith-related terms such as "transubstantiation" which produced some pretty comical responses.

When asked about why he likes being a catechist, Andy said he likes getting to know the other catechists, working with the wonderful Faith Formation Staff, and learning more about our Catholic faith. But his two favorite things about being a Catechist are the holy moments that are made possible within the classroom setting that allow the students to freely share their faith and the trust that is created from those moments, and that being a Catechist requires him to focus on what is truly important ... our relationship with Christ, and sharing his message with others.

We appreciate Andy Groen, and all our catechists who make sharing faith a priority in their lives. Watch for more stories about our wonderful catechists.
