### On The Journey

+The three readings for this Sunday bring to mind the meaning of persistence. As long as Moses kept his hands raised, eventually, with the help of Aaron and Hur, Joshua and the Israelites prevailed over Amalek and his mean. Saint Paul reminds Timothy to remain faithful *to what [he has] learned and believed*. In the Gospel, Jesus uses the parable of the persistent widow to remind his disciples about the *necessity for them to pray always without become weary*.

What does it mean to be persistent? According to the dictionary, it is the “firm or obstinate continuance in a course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition.” Some synonyms for this “obstinate continuance” include: perseverance, tenacity, endurance, and two rather fun expressions: *doggedness* and *staying power*. Think about those last two with regard to our relationship with God.

There is no doubt that when thinking about how God relates to us, *doggedness* and *staying power* are apt descriptions. God created us and pursues us in love endlessly. He never diverts from this path. He loved us into being, and his love is what sustains us. From our existence, to the daily efforts we expend, God is our source of being. The entirety of Scripture attest to this.

When it comes to our relationship with God, however, we might ask ourselves if we can use these same descriptions. We certainly have the opportunity to do so. The sacramental graces we receive give us the power to persist in prayer, and our participation with that grace enables us to do so. The gift of faith allows us to trust that God will provide for us not just in answer to our prayer, but even in the act of praying for something, as He provided Aaron and Hur to assist Moses. Hope assures that our *doggedness* and *staying power* will be rewarded in eternity with Christ. How could we choose anything other than *doggedness* and *staying power* as the foundation for our relationship with God!

United by our baptism we are stronger together, and our unceasing prayer for our needs and the needs of the world really do have an effect. Here in this community of believers we are united in the Eucharist every time we gather for Mass – united in the Body and Blood of our Lord, in the person of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Here together, we have the *doggedness* and *staying power* to face whatever obstacles might tempt us or drag us away from our purpose in this life. For each of us is a beloved child of God, loved completely, journeying to be one with God in the kingdom of heaven.

As followers of Jesus Christ, we cannot resort to quick fixes. Quick fixes may work for a leaky tire, but eventually the tire will need to be replaced if we want to drive on it for a long journey. And it is a long and sometimes arduous journey we are on.

Together, the journey is safer than if we try to venture out on our own. For together, we lift each other up whenever necessary. Let us not ignore the voice of God reminding us to pray always without becoming weary. And may the Eucharist we gather to celebrate help us to follow that command!

+While I write this article before attending the Convocation, it seems odd to write and say we all enjoyed the time with fellow priests and the bishops and Archbishop – but we usually *do* find it to be a good experience, this time of “retreat” with each other. What I can tell you is that a part of the discussion with the Archbishop will be on our efforts as an Archdiocese to Unleash the Gospel and recognize our call to be Sent on Mission. It is a continuation of the work of Synod 16, and is rooted in our baptismal call as Catholic Christians.

Ultimately, what each parish will be tasked to do is put together a “Missionary Strategic Plan” – our local “strategy” or “plan” for doing more to bring people to Jesus in whatever ways we discuss and can formulate ideas for doing just that. It is through the working of the Holy Spirit that we find ourselves working on this effort – an opportunity and a challenge to help others come to engage more in their faith and encounter Jesus in their lives.

I am personally getting more and more enthused and excited to delve into this challenge, which is at the heart of priesthood – getting others to come to faith in Jesus Christ. We will work together in devising our plan and then acting upon it. (I am also much honored to be working on the council for the Archbishop to oversee these efforts throughout the Archdiocese.)

+Our “town hall” session on Tuesday, October 22 is to start doing some “visioning” – looking at what we want our parish to be, and how might we go about doing that (kind of like ‘pre-Missionary Strategic Planning’). I hope you will join us for the evening and share your thoughts and ideas (and I can share with you more of what *actually* went on at the Convocation)!

+Please remember to pray for our confirmandees who will celebrate Confirmation next Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup> at 11 a.m. We wish our young women and men the blessings of the Holy Spirit, to guard and guide them on life’s journey!

+May the beauty of the season continue to make us more aware of the gratitude we should show to God for all that God has done for us! See you in church!

### Mass with Anointing of the Sick

**Saturday, November 2 at 12:00pm**

During the course of the year the parish has a special Mass for those who desire to receive the Anointing of the Sick during Mass. As we approach our communal celebration of the Sacrament, it seems appropriate to provide some basic information about what the Church teaches.

The Sacrament of **Anointing** of the Sick is NOT just for the dying! It is also a beautiful sacrament for healing and strength. The Catechism of the Catholic Church's section on [the Anointing of the Sick](#) defines the purpose of the sacrament as "the conferral of a special grace on the Christian experiencing the difficulties inherent in the condition of grave illness or old age." (*Catechism*, 1527)

The Sacrament of Anointing is appropriate for those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or advanced age. This includes persons who are seriously ill whether at home, in hospitals or in nursing homes, as well as seriously sick children who are old enough to experience benefit from the Sacrament. Those who will be undergoing surgery may also benefit from the Sacrament. While the parish will have a special Mass with Anointing of the Sick in October, the Sacrament of Anointing is available year round and can be arranged by calling the parish office.

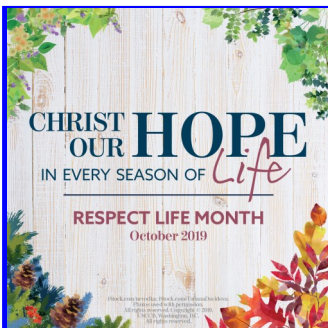
St. Andrew will be collaborating with St. Irenaeus and St. Mary of the Hills to provide a number of service opportunities for all ages!

### Climate Change and Poverty are Pro-life Issues

Unlike abortion and the death penalty, climate change and poverty do not entail an intentional act that ends the life of another human being. But taken together, poverty and climate change claim millions of lives each year.

To borrow from the renowned theologian Fr. Gustavo Gutiérrez, OP: *"The poverty and insignificance in which many people live violates life, which is a gift from God, and which is also the first human right. In effect, poverty means death, both physical death, early and unjust due to lack of the basic necessities for life, and cultural death, as experienced in oppression and discrimination. Theologically speaking, poverty is the negation of the significance of creation. It is contrary to the will-to-life of the Creator God."*

Today, Earth herself, which supports human life, is also under assault. In *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis invokes a comprehensive vision and language stemming from Cardinal Joseph Bernardin "seamless garment."

Francis speaks of an "integral ecology" which explores the interrelationships of human life, creation and social issues. *"How can we genuinely teach the importance of concern for other vulnerable beings however troublesome or inconvenient they may be, if we fail to protect a human embryo, even when its presence is uncomfortable and creates difficulties?"* (120) If we neglect any issue that deprives human beings of life our moral society will fall apart.

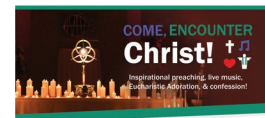

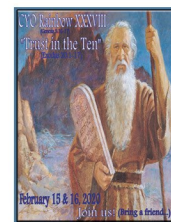

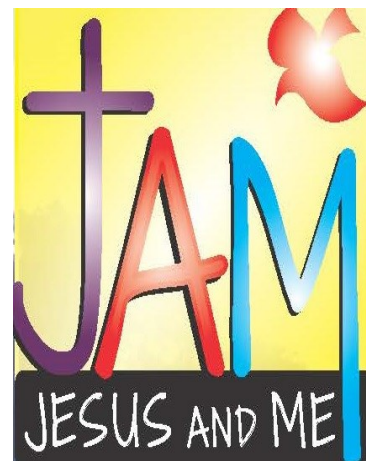
### Mass for Commerce

## Reporting Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons, and other church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, contact 866-343-8055. A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free telephone number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people, and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes, and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only.
