On The Journey

+The Book of Sirach tells us that God *listens* to the prayers of every sinner, showing no preference. Yet He shows special *care* to those most in need: the last, the lowest, the vulnerable and the oppressed. God heard the prayers of the Apostle Paul with special favor, for when Paul wrote to Timothy, he was in a prison cell in Imperial Rome, soon to be martyred for the faith.

Paul identifies his own suffering with that of Christ, and he rejoices in it. His blood will be poured out like that of Christ. He had no one to speak in his defense at trial, and neither did Jesus. He forgave his betrayers just as Jesus did. God gave Paul the strength to preach the Gospel even in the midst of darkness and difficulty, much like Jesus the Son of God did.

Paul's prayers were answered because of his humility. Jesus, in Luke's Gospel, compares and contrasts the prayers of the humble tax collector with the arrogant prayer of the Pharisee. The Pharisee was among the elite of Jewish religious and political society. He believed that he deserved God's love and the admiration of others, but no one loved the Pharisee more than the Pharisee himself. In fact, what the Pharisee says can hardly be called a prayer. It was more of a self-congratulatory speech.

The tax collector, on the other hand, had some difficulty experiencing the love of God, and expected no love from the Pharisee or the people of his town, most of whom despised him and were in debt to him. He prays to God as a son pleads with a father, and he does so with no pretense or pomp.

The Pharisee asks for praise. The tax collector gives it. The tax collector asks for mercy because he needs it. The Pharisee shows no mercy because to him, it is just a word for the weak.

Jesus favors the heartfelt prayer of the tax collector over the many supposedly righteous deeds and words of the Pharisee because Jesus felt that only the tax collector was being *sincere* in what he prayed.

We can all learn from the tax collector. In prayer, we stand bare before God, seeing in ourselves what God sees in us, and worrying less about what others may think of us. The tax collector's prayer, *O God, be merciful to me a sinner*, fits well with the prayers of some of our greatest saints, such as Augustine who said: "Man is a beggar before God."

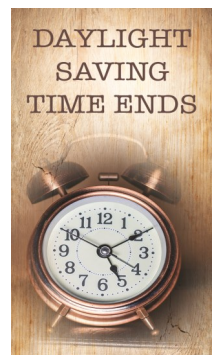

Saints were once sinners. We are sinners, called to be saints. The Pharisee admitted of no sin and that deprived him of sainthood. The tax collector admitted his unworthiness, and in so doing, became more worthy of the freely given love and mercy of God. Remember that when we approach the Lord in humility rather than pride, we have an opportunity to share in the glory of all the saints, admitting full dependence on God. Maybe we should make the tax collector's prayer part of our own: *O God, be merciful to me, a sinner!*

+Progress on our building continues, but has moved slower than expected at this time. The carpeting was correctly installed this past weekend (alleluia!). Flooring and finish issues in the chapel hallway where the buildings meet are still being worked out. There is a lot of electrical work behind the scenes still being addressed; it is a rather sophisticated system, but will hopefully help us save energy in the future! The Information Technology work is beginning to fall into place more quickly, but it is a complex process, given the size of our building and the various locations that have to be connected.

If you were to ask me when we can get in, my honest answer is that I still don't have a firm date from the contractors. We are waiting on so many "little" things, many of which put up some fairly large roadblocks to having it all get completed. As you can imagine, there are some heavy demands being put on various contractors in the greater southeastern Michigan area – and really not enough skilled workers available to do some of the work. Just continue to keep the project in your prayers!

+Related to our building efforts, I am happy to report that our 2019 CSA/building campaign donations continue to come in! So far, we have donations/pledges of \$666,958 against a target of \$352,457, which, should all be honored and paid, would give us a refund of \$314,501. We have already received our first "rebate" check in October for over \$133,000, so this area is going quite well, I would say! My prayerful gratitude for your sacrificial gifts to our campaign; God bless you!

+Our Confirmation celebration this Saturday went well, with our regional auxiliary Bishop Cepeda leading us in prayer. May our newly confirmed continue to pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance as they walk life's journey. Our second "batch" of Confirmation will be on November 9th. We pray for ALL our Confirmation students, who with this celebration will have completed their sacraments of initiation.

+Next weekend on Saturday, we will be celebrating a special Mass of the Anointing of the Sick at noon. This sacramental celebration within the context of mass helps those anointed to face the challenges of their illness/disease and the infirmities of old age. It lets them know that the entire Church is praying for them and with them, and thus, they are not journeying alone as they face their struggles.

+This coming Friday is the feast of All Saints, a holy day of obligation. Masses are at 8:15 a.m.; 12:15 p.m.; 2 p.m. (school mass, but all are invited); and 7:30 p.m. All liturgies will be in the main church. Hopefully your Halloween celebrations were enjoyable the night before!

+And next weekend we revert back to standard time, picking up that hour that got "lost" back in the spring!

+May we all be grateful for the many blessings we have received, and share the bounty with others, especially those most in need. I look forward to seeing you in church!

Mass with Anointing of the Sick

Saturday, November 2 at 12:00pm



During the course of the year the parish has a special Mass for those who desire to receive the Anointing of the Sick during Mass. As we approach our communal celebration of the Sacrament, it seems appropriate to provide some basic information about what the Church teaches.

The Sacrament of **Anointing** of the Sick is NOT just for the dying! It is also a beautiful sacrament for healing and strength. The Catechism of the Catholic Church's section on [the Anointing of the Sick](#) defines the purpose of the sacrament as "the conferral of a special grace on the Christian experiencing the difficulties inherent in the condition of grave illness or old age." (*Catechism*, 1527)

The Sacrament of Anointing is appropriate for those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or advanced age. This includes persons who are seriously ill whether at home, in hospitals or in nursing homes, as well as seriously sick children who are old enough to experience benefit from the Sacrament. Those who will be undergoing surgery may also benefit from the Sacrament. While the parish will have a special Mass with Anointing of the Sick in November, the Sacrament of Anointing is available year round and can be arranged by calling the parish office.

If you would like to be anointed at this mass, please call the parish office with your name and phone number by October 30th.

Did you know ... St. Andrew Parish is a Tithing Parish?

Since 1981, the St. Andrew Catholic Community has committed 10% of parishioners' regular collections –the tithe– to vulnerable communities both locally and within the global community. Informed by Catholic Social Teaching, the Tithing Committee hopes to build a world in which all people “have ready access to all that is necessary for living a genuinely human life”. This is done in two ways: by supporting organizations that seek to meet the immediate needs of the most vulnerable (works or mercy); and by supporting organizations that seek to address the root causes of social injustice through education and advocacy.

The Tithing Committee accomplishes this twofold mission through prayer and discernment in collaboration with members of the parish. This concrete and ongoing commitment to social justice distinguishes the St. Andrew Catholic Community and is an important part our mission as a parish.

Informed by a model of Christian stewardship modeled on the life of Jesus, transparent distribution of tithe monies is an important responsibility of the Tithing Committee.

Confronting the Culture of Violence: War & Gun Violence

Our stance as Catholics regarding war is that it is a life issue when we consider the destruction of lives, especially innocent civilians, and the refugee and poverty situations that result along with the long-term costs to the environment.

The Church recognizes two moral traditions in looking at war – the so-called “just war” or “justifiable war” and pacifism, both deeply embedded in Catholic thought. Even the Just war theory begins with a presumption against war, only permits defensive war, and has very specific requirements for a war to be considered morally justifiable (although still terrible). The church has been clear in condemning the stockpiling or use of chemical, biological or nuclear weapons, not only because it is immoral but also because it is “spending enormous sums to produce ever new types of weapons impedes efforts to aid needy populations”.

In the last thirty years the church, recognizing the mass destruction caused by modern weapons, the success of nonviolent means to resolve conflicts, and the centrality of nonviolence in the Gospel message of Jesus, has moved towards a stronger endorsement of pacifism. It seems less and less likely that any modern war could be considered just, as Catholic leaders argued in opposing the U.S. invasion of Iraq in 2003 and as Saint Pope John Paul II contended in opposing both the 1990 Gulf War and the Iraq War.

The US Bishops in their 1994 Pastoral Letter, *Confronting a Culture of Violence: A Catholic Framework for Action*, “Violence -- in our homes, our schools and streets, our nation and world -- is destroying the lives, dignity and hopes of millions of our sisters and brothers.” Gun Violence is no exception. The Bishops continue: “No nation on earth, except those in the midst of war, has as much violent behavior as we do – in our homes, on our televisions, and in our streets...” At the heart of much of this violence are guns – from handguns to assault weapons. There are almost as many guns in the United States as there are people.”

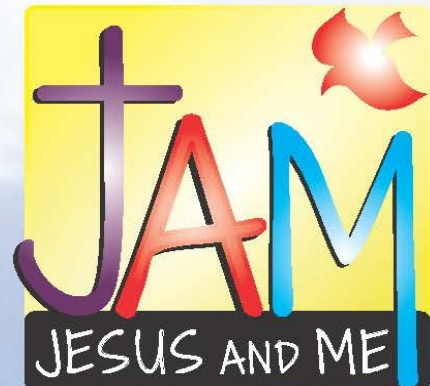
The USCCB has clearly enumerated its support for “implementing reasonable regulations on firearms” such as: universal background checks for all gun purchasers; limiting civilian access to high-capacity weapons and ammunition magazines; making gun trafficking a federal crime; improving access to mental health and addiction treatment for those who may be prone to violence; and supporting reentry programs to help people avoid re-offending.

As Respect Life Month comes to a close, I urge you to read the signs of the times in order to confront the culture of violence however it manifests itself in our society today. I leave you with the words of St. John Paul II: *“To choose life involves rejecting every form of violence: the violence of poverty and hunger, which afflicts so many human beings; the violence of armed conflict; the violence of criminal trafficking in drugs and arms; the violence of mindless damage to the natural environment.”*

North Oakland Circle of Support

St. Andrew is exploring establishing a new committee, in collaboration with some of the other parishes in the area, to provide support to any parishioners or neighbors who may be at risk of forced deportation from the United States by ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement). This committee will also educate parishioners about immigration issues, the treatment of new immigrants living in our area, and the Church’s doctrine on immigration, as well as advocate for changes to our immigration laws. This new committee will be called “North Oakland Circle of Support” and will be overseen by the Christian Service Commission. There are about 30 other parishes with Circles of Support in the archdiocese with new Circles being formed each month. Each Circle is part of a larger organization called Strangers No Longer, which provides training to parish (or in our case, regional) Circle of Support groups, in addition to pro bono attorneys and subject matter experts on immigration. Choose Humility

"I never make mistakes. Once I thought I did, but I was mistaken." I usually recall these words of Lucy from a "Peanuts" comic strip by Charles Schultz whenever I deal with people who assume they are always right.

It reminds me of the Pharisee in today's Gospel. His "prayer" wasn't a prayer at all, but a list of his good qualities. Humility was not one of them. He measured himself against other people he considered less worthy. His prayer was centered on himself and not on God.

The tax collector, on the other hand, was very aware that he was a sinner. He saw himself as God saw him, and he pleaded for God's mercy. His prayer was centered on God, not on himself.

Jesus had a habit of gravitating toward the sinners. They needed him more than the righteous. He knew that God always listens intently to those in need of his love.

The idea that "...all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted," runs through many bible stories, so it must be important! I think I will choose to be humble.

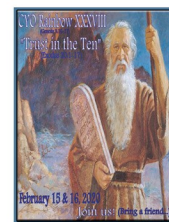

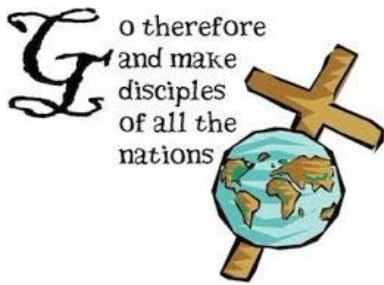

12 EVANGELIZATION



The St. Andrew Evangelization Committee is taking a fresh look at our parish's mission and activities in the context of the New Evangelization. We are witnessing an exciting new phase in our Church aimed at spiritual growth through encounter and witness. The committee hopes to be offering creative new approaches to our mission guided by the directives contained in the Archbishop's Pastoral Letter "Unleash the Gospel".

The next phase of Unleash the Gospel focuses on the renewal of our parish communities so they become what God intended them to be: places where individuals and families encounter Jesus anew, grow as his disciples and are equipped to be witnesses of the Risen Christ.

All Christians are called to evangelize. Jesus commissioned the disciples, "*Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.*" (Matthew 28:18-19). The last command Jesus gave his disciples before he ascended was, "*Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature*" (Mark 16:15). The Church exists to evangelize. This is not just the job of priest and religious, but of all Christians!

If you feel called to be part of a team of dynamic individuals who are working to share the Good News with others, and also grow spiritually at the same time, we invite you to join us. Evangelization

The 2019 Parish Day of Renewal, a day of fellowship and formation marking the third anniversary of Synod 16 and the second anniversary of the beatification of Blessed Solanus Casey, will be held at the Suburban Collection in Novi on Friday and Saturday, November 15 and 16.
