## On The Journey

+In our life of faith, we are often confronted by beliefs and views that contradict and challenge our Catholic Christian faith. In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus is confronted by the views of the Sadducees on the thorny issue of resurrection — what can we expect after death?

A priestly group within Judaism, the Sadducees were wealthy families who valued social and economic status over the piety and learning that was important to the Pharisees. Most relevant to this encounter with Jesus, they did not believe in or follow any scriptural precepts beyond the Torah — and thus, did not believe in the concepts of immortality of the soul or resurrection after death.

But rather than engage them in their rather exaggerated and silly scenario about the seven brothers and the one wife, Jesus instead compares the ways of this world to the ways of the kingdom of God. The God we worship is the God of the living, not of the dead. Those who belong to God and who serve Him in life are rightly described as *children of God* — heirs of the kingdom — who will rise to new life in the resurrection. The rest, those whom Jesus describes as the *children of this age*, have no hope within them. They are lost for they have nothing to trust in.

While we journey through this month of November, we often think of our deceased relatives and friends – those who have gone to the other side of life. It often brings about contemplation on our own ultimate destiny by we who remain in this world. In that meditation, let us use the words of Saint Paul and pray that the Lord will direct and encourage our hearts to his love and endurance, keeping us on that path to God's Kingdom.

May God keep us faithful and strengthen us to be on guard against the Evil One and all that would separate us from the very love – and life –of God for all eternity. So we can raise our voices: *May all the angels and saints of God pray for us*!

+What a wonderful and prayerful celebration last Monday evening for our annual Mass of Remembrance! It was the largest gathering that I can recall in the seven years I have been here for this celebration of life, this special time of prayer remembering those who had died and were buried from the parish over the past year. I thank everyone for their participation and attendance, and express my special

**St. Frances Xavier Cabrini** (July 15, 1850 – December 22, 1917), also called Mother Cabrini, was an Italian-American Roman Catholic nun, who founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a Catholic religious institute that was a major support to the Italian immigrants to the United States. She was the first naturalized citizen of the United States to be canonized by the Roman Catholic Church, on July 7, 1946. For 28 years she worked in the U.S. and South America establishing some 67 institutions (schools, hospitals, and orphanages). Mother Cabrini is the patroness of immigrants and migrants. Her feast day is November 13.

## **November is Homeless Awareness Month!**

As of January 2018, Michigan had an estimated 8,351 experiencing homelessness on any given day. Of that Total, 965 were family households, 693 were Veterans, 604 were unaccompanied young adults (aged 18-24), and 861 were individuals experiencing chronic homelessness.

Did you know that you may be a saint in the making? You don't have to be perfect to be considered for sainthood. Saints are ordinary people whose lives were made extraordinary by their commitment to God. Some saints were born saintly. Others were not.

Perhaps you've heard the saying, "All saints have a past, and all sinners have a future." Many saints started out behaving badly. St. Augustine led an unsavory life. His mother, St. Monica, prayed fervently for him, and he turned his life around. St. Matthew was a tax collector, a very unscrupulous occupation in his day. But he changed his life to follow Jesus. St. Paul persecuted Christians, yet God called him to spread his message.


God chooses ordinary people and transforms their weaknesses. We are given the gifts we need to follow God's plan for us. God doesn't call the "qualified," he qualifies the called. That means we have been made ready, through the gifts we have been given, to do God's work.

It will be a live performance by parish friends (and some staff members!) to highlight some favorite saints.
