### On The Advent Journey Into Christmas

+Today we begin a somewhat short Fourth Week of Advent. Advent is a time in which we prepare for the two comings of Christ: we remember his first, as a child; and anticipate his second at the end of time. All of our Scriptures are dedicated to this preparation. Thus far in Advent, the Scripture readings have been alternately full of consolation and challenge. They have spoken of God's fidelity, mercy and his justice. They have called us to repentance and newness of life. They have scolded our indifference and reassured us of God's enduring love — a love that will become incarnate in Christ's birth.

Now we begin to hear of the events surrounding that birth: the reason for our celebration of Christmas! Isaiah reminds us of the promise once made to the House of David that a maiden would bear a son who would be named *Emmanuel* – God is with us. Written about 700 years before the birth of Jesus, Isaiah clearly speaks of something unique, even mysterious, something that only God in his power could bring about.

As devout Jews, Mary and Joseph would have known of this long-cherished promise at the heart of their faith. Today, Joseph is at the center of our Gospel. He is a *specific* recipient of God's promise and given consolation and peace in the knowledge of Scripture being fulfilled. He obeys God's commands, takes Mary into his home and becomes the foster-father of the Son of God.

We're not called to such a mysterious and holy role as parents of the Christ Child, yet we, too, are inheritors of this promise as it continues to unfold through the generations. Thus, God speaks to each one of us in specific ways, just as He did to Isaiah, to Mary, to Joseph — and to all who have come to accept God's promise of new life in Jesus. Our participation in the life of Christ will be manifested in our vocation, our state in life, our strengths and our weaknesses. Some will enter religious life and priesthood, some may remain single, and many will marry and have a family. Where God places us - that is where we live out our divine call.

As we stand at the threshold of our celebration of the birth of Christ, we thank God for his promise of Christ – both as Christ child and as the One who will return in glory. In Him we have salvation, and for Him we await with further Advent hope!



IN HONOR OF OUR BLESSED MOTHER'S AND ST. JOSEPH'S JOURNEY FROM NAZARETH TO BETHLEHEM

1 C plus 2 T all-purpose flour ~

"simple goodness of the shepherds in the fields they passed"

\*mixed thoroughly with\* 1/2 tsp baking soda & 1/2 tsp salt

\*followed by\*

1/2 C rolled oats ~

"symbolize the animals in the stable where they found shelter"

1/3 C packed brown sugar ~ "for the brown hills of Bethlehem"

1/3 C sugar ~ "represent the snow"

1/2 C dried cranberries ~

"whose tartness symbolize the doors shut to Mary and Joseph"

1/2 C white chocolate chips ~ "for the stars in the sky"

1/2 C chopped pecans or walnuts ~

"represent the rocky road the little family traveled on"

### TO MAKE THE COOKIES:

Think of the preparation St. Joseph and Our Blessed Mother must have made for this journey to Bethlehem:

Heat the oven to 350 degrees and grease a cookie sheet or line it with parchment paper.

For the light of Heaven: In a medium bowl, beat together 1/2 cup softened butter, 1 egg, and 1 tsp of vanilla until fluffy. Add the hardships of the journey to the light of Heaven: Add the ingredients listed above, and mix until well blended.

Drop by heaping spoonfuls onto the prepared baking sheets
Remember the hardships of Jesus' life on earth and His passion:
Bake for 8 - 10 minutes, or until edges brown.

Anticipate His coming: Cool on baking sheets or remove to cool on wire racks. Appreciate the joy and promise of His birth: Enjoy eating them!







### **Stewardship Thoughts**

A common theme linking today's Scripture passages is the prophecy of Emmanuel, whose name means "God is with us." Both readings from the Prophet Isaiah and St. Matthew's Gospel proclaim this prophecy about Jesus Christ. In the Gospel, the evangelist recounts the story of an angel visiting Joseph in a dream, assuring him that Mary conceived a child by the Holy Spirit and encouraging him to not fear taking her as his wife. Joseph fully trusts in God and brings Mary into his home. As Christian stewards, we strive to model Joseph's trust in our Lord and serve as His disciples. During this busy Advent season, set aside a few quiet minutes daily to listen to our Lord so He becomes personal in your life.
