Parish Mission Statement

On The Christmas Journey Into the New Year

+Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family – Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The readings call us to attitudes and actions that can bring harmony and joy to our family life. Sirach, echoing the lesson of the Fourth Commandment, emphasizes our call to obey, honor, respect and even revere our parents. He notes the many blessings that this reverent and respectful attitude can bring us.

In a sense, when we honor our parents, we also honor our God, who worked through those parents to bring us life. The Catechism reminds us that respect and honor to parents "derives from gratitude toward those who, by the gift of life, their love and their work, have brought their children into the world and enabled them to grow in stature wisdom, and grace." (CCC 2215). This gratitude to our parents and to God can lead us to deeper appreciation of the gifts we have received through the fundamental gift of life.

Paul, in his letter to the Colossians, gives us tools to bring healing to our family relationships. As God's children, holy and beloved, we are called to put on heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, and to top these qualities off with forgiveness and the bond of love. Perhaps most important, Paul reminds us as Christian families to put Jesus at the very center of our family life – to be guided by the peace of Christ, to let Jesus' word dwell within us, and to do everything in the name of our Lord Jesus.

When we contemplate our actions in the name of Jesus, our focus will end up being on our love of God – and sharing that love to build up the family of faith with whom we journey here on earth!



Successful families flourish in their endeavors to follow Christ. Are we making Jesus personal in our home life, becoming the "Domestic Church" Pope St. John Paul II professed? The feast of the Holy Family offers the opportunity to reflect on the mystery of family life.

Happy Feast of the Holy Family!

As we celebrate this beautiful feast, it's important to understand that the word "HOLY" doesn't mean "PERFECT."

We have a wonderful example to follow -- The Holy Family.

We are reminded that families face many difficulties, messes, and problems and what makes a family "HOLY" is that you turn to GOD and to each other for help getting through everything.

Today, spend some time with your family; have a funky dinner party, pray together, go for a winter walk, play some games, watch a movie or make a fun recipe and share it with others. For example...

POPCORN BALLS

Yield: 12 balls Prep Time: 1/2 hour

3 quarts popped corn

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup light corn syrup

1/2 cup water

2 Tablespoons butter or margarine

DIRECTIONS

- Place popped corn in large bowl; set aside.
- Combine sugar, corn syrup, water, and butter in saucepan.
- Place over low heat; stir until sugar is dissolved.
- Cook over medium heat to 270° or until a small amount of syrup dropped in cold water separates into threads that are hard but not brittle.
- Pour syrup over popped corn; toss lightly. Shape into balls with lightly buttered hands.

CHOCOLATE POPCORN BALLS: Follow basic recipe, adding 1/2 package semisweet chocolate pieces to sugar-corn syrup mixture. PEPPERMINT POPCORN BALLS: Follow basic recipe, adding 1/4 teaspoon peppermint flavoring and few drops pink food coloring to syrup just before pouring over popcorn.
