#### On The Christmas Journey Into the New Year

+We have been hearing throughout this beautiful season of Christmas about the gift that God has given us – the gift of his only begotten Son, Jesus, as our Savior. Jesus, who is God Incarnate, born as a helpless baby. Today's Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the public "announcement," if you will, that the gift of salvation is available to all, not just those of the Israelite covenant with God.

Long before Paul tells the Ephesians in today's reading *that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel*, the revelation of Jesus Christ is made to the Magi. These Magi were not Jewish, but men *from the east* – Gentiles – who have traveled to Bethlehem *to see the newborn king of the Jews*. They were somehow drawn to the gift, and Matthew's Gospel tells us how they respond.

Their response is a beautiful example of how we ourselves should respond to Jesus – and to any gift that God offers to us. They have the vision to see the star, to follow it a great distance from their homeland and to accept the simple gift that is revealed to them: a humble, simple child who does not radiate the majesty of a king. The Magi are able to see beyond the surface, to see this child for who he is, and without hesitation pay him homage and present him with their gifts. Finally, they are obedient to the voice in their dreams and go home a different way, thus avoiding Herod.

Matthew's Gospel also gives us a completely opposite response to this gift, carried out by Herod. King Herod, hearing of the newborn King of the Jews, responds defensively and in great fear. If what the wise men report is true, Herod reasons, he will lose this status and prestige. Rather than see this child as a gift, as the longpromised Messiah, Herod sees him as a threat that needs to be extinguished right away. He responds with deceitful cunning, planning to kill the child once the Magi reveal to him where the child is. Herod closes his heart to the gift of God, the Messiah, wanting to keep his own power and glory.

None of us would claim to want to follow the example of Herod – to close our hearts and minds to God and to resort to killing innocent children to keep our power. Yet it helps us to think about how open we are to the many gifts that God presents to us throughout our lives – from the rainy morning that greets us upon our awakening; to the family God has placed in our lives; the work we are called to do; and the sufferings we are called to endure. Each of these is, in different ways, a gift from (continued on page 3)

God – some more easily seen as 'gift' than others. We can either reject them as Herod did, or follow the example of the Magi and accept them in humility, trust and obedience.

As we continue our celebration of the season, we pray for the grace to have the open-heartedness of the Magi throughout the coming year. All is gift from God. With the help of the Holy Spirit, may we greet the expected and unexpected gifts – the obvious gifts and those that are harder to understand – as truly gifts from our loving God. May we see the radiance and glory of Jesus in all we meet in the year - and *years* - ahead, and welcome them into our hearts with joy, reverence and trust.

+With the coming week, we go back into "regular operations" mode – Holy Family Regional School returns and our Religious Formation program start back up for the coming sessions. Meetings will be starting up once again after the holiday break. Please pay special attention to the bulletin and on-line notices as to the schedule of activities. With this new year and further use of our new space, some meetings may be moved from their previous locations to different rooms.

+The Feast of the Epiphany is a time when many ask the Lord to bless our homes and families. Today, we offer blessed chalk for use in your homes, marking the mantle over the doorway. There is a fuller explanation elsewhere in today's bulletin, along with the blessing prayer itself.

+Sometimes there are gifts (i.e. cookies and the like, but even at times little envelopes) left for one of the priests, without good identification as to who it's from. Please know of my gratitude for everyone who left a gift this Christmas season, but maybe somewhere in the hustle and bustle, you were overlooked in receiving a "thank you" note acknowledging your kindness and generosity. Know of my prayerful gratitude for thinking of me!

+During this cold and flu season, please don't attend mass if you are quite ill; it's not a sin to miss mass if you are truly sick. And remember, that at the greeting before mass starts, and at the time of the sign of peace during mass, if you are not well, your greeting might be just a warm, friendly smile and nod to those around you. It is not required to shake hands for either of these gestures. Please use common sense, and don't be angry if someone just smiles at you during this season!

+With the end of the Christmas season soon upon us with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord next week, let us not forget the presence of Jesus in our lives – Emmanuel, our God is with us - always! Safe journeys to our "snowbirds" – and to those who stick around our beautiful state, I look forward to seeing you in church!


#### Baptisms within Mass at St. Andrew

Next Sunday we will celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Once again we will remember that wonderful moment when Jesus received baptism from John the Baptist in the Jordan River. Once again we'll hear the words that came from heaven: "This my beloved Son, with whom I'm well pleased."

Every time when a baptism takes place, God repeats the same words to the baptize person: "You are my beloved Child, with You I'm well pleased, since this moment You belong to Me, You are mine." Every baptism is a blessing and a grace, but also a commitment and a responsibility, not only for the person who receives baptism, but also for the parents, godparents, family and the whole parish community.

Next Sunday we would like to begin something new at St. Andrew Church. On this second Sunday of January and February, the baptisms will be celebrated within the 12 p.m. Mass. First, we want to welcome the newly baptized and his/her family within the St. Andrew community and be recognized. It's a joyful and very significant moment for all of us when someone becomes Catholic, becomes a part of Christ's Body, the Church. Second, we truly believe that participating with this beautiful rite of baptism will be, for all of us, an opportunity to express our gratitude for the grace of our own baptism. For our parents and godparents who brought us to the faith, and remember and take even more seriously responsibility for the faith that we all profess and be proud of it.

I'm confident and hopeful that this tradition will bring many blessings into our lives and will help us with unleashing the Gospel.



#### Epiphany Home Blessing on January 5, 2020

From the east come the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh as a symbol of His burial. The blessing of the home, and the inscription of the initials of the three Magi at each entrance door, is an old Epiphany custom that is still practiced by some today. Using specially blessed chalk, many families mark above the entrance door of their homes with the year and with the inscription CMB, the initials of the traditional names of the

Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar (example: 20+C+M+B+20). The inscription really stands for Christus Mansionem Benedicat, Latin for "Christ, bless this house."

Use the chalk to write above the entrance to your home:

As you are writing pray the following:

O Lord, God Almighty, we ask Your blessing on this home and all who dwell within. Grant that if it be Your will, we may enjoy physical and mental health and Your spiritual protection. May all who visit our home this year rejoice to find You dwelling among us. May we seek to serve You forever and ever, through Christ our Lord. Amen



The Feast of the Epiphany, Three Kings' Day the manifestation of the Light of the World, Jesus. The traditional date of the feast is January 6, twelve days after Christmas, or the following Sunday. The Epiphany is the celebration of the visitation of the Magi (the three Kings) to the infant Jesus. The Magi gave special gifts to the new born King — gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

How can we celebrate the Epiphany as a family...

- Gift your family with three gifts: Gold — a family gift/activity Frankincense — a Religious item Myrrh — gifts for the body
- 2. Make a Star of Bethlehem or go stargazing.
- 3. Make a King's cake or an Epiphany cake.
- 4. Have a fun snack, have some star fruit!
- 5. Read the Epiphany narrative. (Matthew 2:1-12).
- 6. Bless your homes Chalk the Door. Mark the doorways of your home with blessed chalk, you would write 20+C+M+B+19 and say a prayer. The numbers represent the year, and the letters are the initials of the three wise men.
- 7. Celebrate Twelfth Night Have a special meal.
