Parish Mission Statement

On The Journey Into Ordinary Time

+Three of the four Gospels recall the Baptism of the Lord, each one in its own way. The version we hear today, from Matthew, is unique in recalling that when Jesus came to the Jordan, John the Baptist at first *tried to prevent Him*, saying that <u>he</u> was the one who needed to be baptized by Jesus. But Jesus replies, *Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness*.

Here, Matthew is keen to emphasize that Jesus is the fulfillment of the promises made to Israel – as found in the first reading from Isaiah – and the one whose sandals John is unfit to carry (Cf., Matthew 3:11). John acquiesced to Jesus' request, and upon coming up from the water, Jesus is revealed as *my beloved Son* through a voice from heaven, while the Spirit descends upon Him in the form of a dove.


As we hear this Gospel proclaimed, we note this revelation/divine action occurs after Jesus comes up from the waters of the Jordan River. We, too, have emerged from the waters of baptism and been anointed with the same Spirit. The words of the Father are words meant for us, too, for we also are God's beloved.

If anything, this feast has as much to say about us as it does about Jesus and his identity. Yes, by going down into the waters of the Jordan River, Jesus demonstrates his solidarity with our broken world, but we know that He was without sin and so his baptism is different from ours. Unlike Christ who embodied perfection, we have to choose whether or not to live up to that baptismal identity, and to continue his divine work in our world today.

We who gather here have made this choice, it seems. We may not do it perfectly, but by our profession of faith and openness to the grace available at Mass, we are, at the very least, committed to trying our best. May God bless us in our efforts, and may the Eucharist continue to transform us for the sake of the world!

+This coming weekend, on January 18th, we start what the Church has called a Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Trying something a little different this year, we are working with our local neighborhood Christian churches in offering a prayer service each evening. Why not attend one or all of the services, which will include some light hospitality, and visit with our neighbors? We at St. Andrew will start off this series of prayer gatherings by hosting on Saturday at 7p.m.

+It is nice to be writing "current and live" so to speak (and not three weeks early because of printing deadlines). What I can say is that I've heard many nice (continued on page 3)

We are getting anxious to get the correctly-sized coffee maker so we can start meeting in the new space for coffee & donuts. And as humans, we know accidents will happen, so if you have an "accident" of any sort, please let us know so it can be addressed promptly. This goes for the 3 individuals/cars that have hit the bollards supporting the new light poles in the parking lot already. Don't be shy, just tell us so if there is an issue, we can address it. (Note the new yellow striping on the light pole bases to help warn you of their presence.) Please help us keep our "new things" clean and in good, proper working order!

- +<u>Apologies</u> if you have had difficulties or been cut off when phoning in to the offices this past week. We have been working on installing the new phone system, and it has been a little more complex than first anticipated. Please be patient with us as we are all learning new steps in retrieving phone messages, transferring calls to another person, or just putting you on hold and cutting you off instead!
- +My thanks for your generosity in helping us finance these new areas and furnishings. Our Christmas collection was over \$325K, and our CSA received some additional gifts at the holidays, putting us to the point of potentially receiving over \$360K in refunds for our CSA efforts this time! - +This Feast of the Baptism of the Lord "officially" concludes the Church's celebration of the Christmas season. We move into what we call *ordinary time*, so you will see the decorations come down and the color green appear once again for a short while before we start our Lenten journey at the end of February. Again, my thanks to all who helped with the many efforts of the holiday season!
- +While the manger is put away for another year, let's remember that Emmanuel our God is with us each and every day! I look forward to seeing you in church!!

Ecumenical Prayer Service Celebrates Annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Six congregations, representing a variety of Christian denominations, will come together for an Ecumenical Celebration of the Word of God each night from January 18 – 23, 2020.

Begun in 1908, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated each year in cities and towns across the country and around the world.

The theme for the 2020 observance is "They Showed Us Unusual Kindness" (cf. Acts 28:2). The theme and text for each year's observance of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity are chosen and prepared by representatives of the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and representatives of the World Council of Churches. The international texts are developed, adapted, and published for use in the USA by the Graymoor Ecumenical & Interreligious Institute.

The services, part of the area's observance of the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, will take place at 7:00 pm each night at a different church. The services will last approximately 30 minutes with a reception following. A free-will offering will benefit the Rochester Area Neighborhood House. Please see the flyer elsewhere in the bulletin. ALL are welcome. This is an opportunity for us to get to know our fellow Christians and help Unleash the Gospel.

Baptism of the Lord begins new opportunity at St. Andrew

This weekend we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, which officially ends the Christmas Season and returns us to ordinary time. As with those we welcome at Easter, through the RCIA process, I encourage you to embrace this opportunity to welcome our newest members to the Catholic Faith.






