On The Journey

+Zebulun and Naphtali were sons of Jacob, and the leaders of two of the 12 tribes of Israel. The lands settled by their descendants were in the most northern part of Israel. Of all the Israelites, they were the furthest from the summer sun, giving rise to Isaiah's description of the people there who walked in darkness and in the land of gloom.

Their darkness wasn't just a matter of geography, however. These were also the first lands to be invaded by the Assyrians, and the Israelites were oppressed by their pagan conquerors who practiced false worship of many gods. Isaiah prophesies of a time when a great light will shine upon these people, freeing them form darkness and bringing them abundant joy and great rejoicing. He prophesies what we know to be the coming of the Christ, who will free them from the yokes that burden them.


Matthew shows us the fulfillment of this prophecy in today's Gospel. Jesus goes to Capernaum, which is the same geographical region of which Isaiah spoke. He has come to fulfill Isaiah's prophecy, to be the great light for those who walked in darkness, and so He begins preaching the Good News: Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. This message will appeal to many whom Jesus calls, such as Simon and Andrew, and James and John who all follow Him. Others will hate Him for it - and crucify Him.

The freedom found in Christ is what impels Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians. He is concerned about a growing lack of unity among them, in mind and purpose. So he reminds them of the cross of Christ – the one true sacrifice made for all, into which they are baptized - that it might not be emptied of its meaning. For it is not specific people or human words that give them life. It is Christ crucified who freed them from all burdens.

To be sure, there are people who still walk in darkness and there remains division in the church and among Christians. Yet we are freed from our burdens by Jesus Christ, the light who came into our darkness. With the gift of faith we can cast aside the nets of doubt, and through graces outpoured, we can resolve to follow Christ, our light and our salvation. What a truly blessed people we are!

+We conclude our week of Prayer for Christian Unity this weekend. How wonderful it was to have a "moveable" celebration of prayer and praise at the different local churches, sharing our faith in Jesus Christ and praying that one day, all might be one. I've been to the Saturday and Sunday celebrations at our own St. Andrew to start, then on to the First Congregational Church (UCC) here in Rochester on Sunday. While it's been a small-ish size group, the 35-50 people that gather each evening have been sincere in their prayer, and certainly enjoying the hospitality put on by each church.

I want to take a moment to publicly thank Mrs. Kathy Fabian for taking leadership in getting this all to come together. My prayerful thanks, Kathy, for all your hard work! God bless!

- +Remember that Saturday after the 5 p.m. mass, we are hosting a spaghetti dinner with the Knights of Columbus to help underwrite the cost of the first year class of theologians studying at Sacred Heart Major Seminary for their Holy Land trip. It will help them in making the Scriptures come alive and deepen their faith in the Lord as they journey toward priesthood. If you can't join us, you could still support them in prayer and with donations, sent directly to Sacred Heart.
- +This coming week we celebrate "Catholic Schools Week"! How wonderful that we have our great <u>Holy Family Regional School</u> as part of our parish family! Please make sure that you pray for all those involved in Catholic education in its various forms, and that the schools we do have are blessed with faithful and faith-filled staff and students! If you ever have questions about the school, don't hesitate to ask me, or contact the school directly at 248-656-1234 (north campus) or 248-299-3798 (south campus). Thanks to all who support this "treasure" with giving of your time, talent and treasures!
- +Please make sure that you submit your names for the annual "Wedding Anniversary" mass and reception, to be held on February 8th, for those enjoying the "benchmark" dates in their marriages. Deadline for letting us know if you will join us is January 27th.
- +Your generosity is greatly appreciated by the entire St. Andrew community, and especially by me, your pastor! Christmas this year was over \$330,000, and CSA for the year has \$723,221 in pledges/ donations, with just over \$669,722 in payments already received. This is against our target of \$352,457. These funds will help to pay down our loan, cover the costs of additional non-budgeted supplies for the new space, and be used for some other refurbishment in the church. Very specifically, we are going to try and tackle the sound system in the main church, which has had its share of "gremlins" troubling us. We are going to address dead zones and sound drops that happen intermittently in that space. We'll keep you posted.
- +Let me "officially" make the announcement though many are already aware that Fr. Tom will be completing his three-year assignment here at St. Andrew at the end of June and moving on to a different part of the Lord's vineyard to continue doing ministry. At this point, Fr. Tom does not know where he will be assigned, nor do we know of who will be assigned to help us out as associate (the official term being "parochial vicar".) Many priests are taking retirement this year, and many associates are done with their current assignments; please keep them all in your prayers as transitions are usually difficult and sad to experience. As we hear how all this unfolds in the next couple months, we will keep you informed. We just want to make sure and be clear so that the "rumor mill" doesn't get churning.
- +As winter takes a cold, firm grip upon us, may we be reminded of the warmth of Christ's love in our hearts, and the light of Jesus that we are to bear to and for one another. I look forward to seeing you all in church!






Stewardship Thoughts

In the long form of today's Gospel reading, the evangelist St. Matthew ponders Isaiah's prophesy in the First Reading: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. This foreshadows what is accomplished in Christ Jesus. In the Old Testament, the "land of gloom" refers to the beginning of Israel's trail to Babylonian captivity. In this same location, Capernaum, Jesus starts His public ministry. It is in this fishing village on the north side of the Sea of Galilee that He calls the first Apostles: Simon (Peter) and his brother, Andrew, and James and his brother, John. As faithfilled stewards, we know Jesus is our joy and the Light of the World Who pierces the darkness. When we accept the invitation to make Jesus personal in our lives, we are sent forth, in a spirit of evangelization, to share Christ's joy, peace, and light with all of our brothers and sisters.
