Stewardship Thoughts

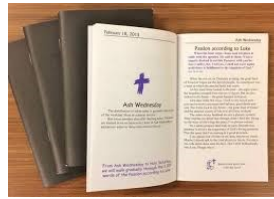
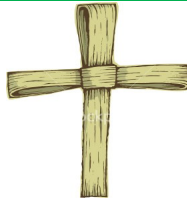
Today's Scripture passages from the Book of Leviticus and St. Matthew's Gospel emphasize the second of the greatest commandments: to love your neighbor as yourself. As the evangelist St. Matthew recounts, Jesus further proclaims: *When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well ... [and] love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.* Responding with forgiveness and love can be challenging for even the most faith-filled stewards, especially given that Christ directs forgiveness must come from the heart. Do you have a friend or family member in need of your forgiveness, or who you need to apologize to for a past wrong?

This is the final weekend, to bring your old palms and drop them in one of the baskets found near the Church entrances. The Lenten Season begins on February 26 with Ash Wednesday. Bring your palms to have them burned and turned into ashes.

LENT

Historically, Lent was the retreat-like preparation period for catechumens being initiated into the Church and into the Paschal mystery at the Easter Vigil. It naturally became a renewal period for the already baptized faithful, who were inspired by the conversion of the catechumens and spent Lent as a time of examining how they had lived their own baptismal commitment. Eventually, it also became the time of penance for those enrolled in the order of penitents, an early form of the Sacrament of Penance. Today, Lent has this same twofold focus of baptism and repentance.

Lenten Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Eucharistic Adoration and Exposition

9:00 AM-7:00 PM in the Chapel

"The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him

who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament."

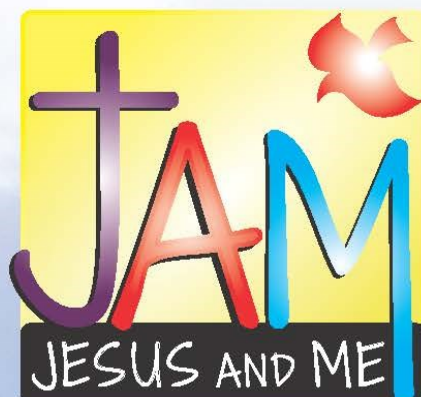

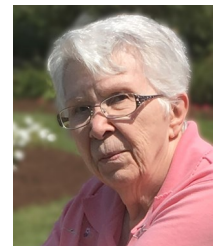
