On The Journey

+*You are the salt of the earth...and the light of the world*, Jesus says to his disciples. And salt that has no flavor is good for nothing, while a lighted lamp under a basket fails to dispel the darkness.

No one here would deny there is too much darkness in the world. We also know how much we dread the dark days of winter and can't wait for the days to start getting longer again. Illness and depression are often linked to the lack of light. We all relish in the "bright sunshiny day" Johnny Nash sang about back in the seventies.

As faithful followers of Jesus, it is now our responsibility to disperse the darkness we encounter around us with the Light of Christ that dwells within each of us. As congregations and communities, we have to hold our leaders accountable for decisions that bring darkness to the world instead of light. We also need to praise our leaders when they buck what may be popular and choose to do what is right.

The prophet Isaiah says, *Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own.* These are all concrete ways in which we flavor the earth with God's goodness, and allow light to break forth in darkness. But these are not the *only* ways.

Jesus' metaphors do not have to frighten the introverts among us – we are not required to be a giant pillar of salt, or a strobe light on an airfield. Each of us has the opportunity to glorify God according to our gifts, our circumstances and our state in life. So even if all we can offer is a grain of salt, or a flicker of a match light, that is okay. Whatever we have been given by God is meant to be shared for the sake of the world. Whatever we have is worth giving; we cannot give that which we do not have.

As Saint Paul says, may the Lord grant that our *faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God*, that we may be salt for the earth and light for our world – a world in desperate need for us to spread God's word, and unleash the Gospel!

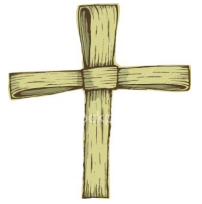

Candlelight Prayer Service

St. Andrew Ecumenical Awareness Committee is again hosting a candlelight Taize style prayer on Thursday, February 20, at 7 p.m. in the St. Andrew Chapel. It will continue with the theme for the week of Christian Unity, "Kindness". Come for an hour of multiple styles of prayer – from contemplative –song –intercessory and more; leaving with peace and serenity.

Sunday of the Word of God—Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

We'll conclude our look at how the Church uses the Scriptures at Mass.

The Responsorial Psalm: The psalm is meant to be our response to the Word proclaimed. The Psalms are the prayer book of the Bible containing God's words that we can make our own in every human circumstance: in joy, sorrow, love, grief, comfort, pain, security, or rest. When we pray the psalms we pray the same words Jesus used to pray to the Father. We praise God in the psalms and hear Jesus' voice echo in ours and ours in his (St. Augustine).

The Second Reading: As the First Readings and Gospels show us some aspect of Jesus revealed, the letters of the New Testament show us different aspects of how Jesus works in the Church. The life of the Church in New Testament times was far from simple; Paul, Peter, James, John, and many others had their work cut out for them! We read in Paul's letters of the many different matters of faith (like the mystery of the crucifixion in today's reading from 1 Corinthians 2) the early Church was trying to comprehend under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Hearing the letters should increase faith, hope, and love, and the fruits of the Spirit, in our Church today.

This is the Church's plan for reading the Scriptures every Sunday. You'll hear a good amount of the Bible at Mass, but not all of it. It is up to every Catholic, every family and parish, to continually set aside time to hear and read the Scriptures, but most importantly to pray with them. *God is speaking to you.* His voice is not so unrecognizable, nor his message so far off. "For this command which I am giving you today is not too wondrous or remote for you... No, it is something very near to you, in your mouth and in your heart, to do it" (Deuteronomy 30:11, 14).

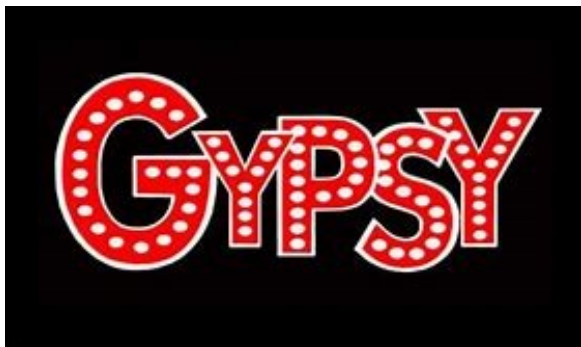

February: Listen to the Migrants' Cries

We pray that the cries of our migrant brothers and sisters, victims of criminal trafficking, may be heard and considered.

Knock knock. “Who’s there?”

This is a familiar format for a children’s riddle. You knock, I ask, you reply. It’s based on a simple action- someone knocks on my door and I ask, “Who is it?” Is this a stranger? A friend? A criminal? Who is knocking? We’re right to be curious. And it’s ok to ask questions. But should we automatically be suspicious? What if this is a friend, or someone who needs my help?

This February, Pope Francis asks us to hear the cries of migrants. After all, we shouldn’t bolt the door until we know who is knocking, right? He writes, “Every stranger who knocks at our door is an opportunity for an encounter with Jesus Christ, who identifies with the welcomed and rejected strangers of every age” (Pope Francis, Message for the 2018 World Day of Migrants and Refugees).

After the birth of Jesus, Mary and Joseph fled to Egypt with their child. They escape from King Herod who searches for the child “to destroy him” [Matt 2:13]. After this danger passes, the Holy Family returns to their homeland. They were refugees only temporarily. Perhaps they knocked on an unfamiliar door seeking shelter. Imagine Joseph offering to work in exchange for food and housing. Knock knock. “Who’s there?” Modern migration is a complex issue. A humane response requires compassion, wisdom, and cooperation from citizens, churches, police, and government leaders. If we shut our ears and lock the doors of our hearts, then we will never hear the cries of the poor seeking protection and opportunity. Jesus says, “I was a stranger and you welcomed me.”

Who is knocking at our door? How will we respond?

Prayer Corner—Prayer 101

Prayer as God's Gift—continued...

Do you pray? Do you think it makes a difference? Is God real?
You owe it to yourself to find out if it is true or not.

We return to see what the church instructs us regarding prayer in the Catechism of the Catholic Church which is summary of our faith put together by Pope John Paul II in 1992. I underlined what struck me in the text below, but I encourage you to read and ponder for yourself not only what strikes you but how you can form a deeper relationship with God through prayer.

Prayer as Communion

2565 In the New Covenant, prayer is the living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is good beyond measure, with his Son Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit. The grace of the Kingdom is "the union of the entire holy and royal Trinity . . . with the whole human spirit." Thus, the life of prayer is the habit of being in the presence of the thrice-holy God and in communion with him. This communion of life is always possible because, through Baptism, we have already been united with Christ. Prayer is *Christian* insofar as it is communion with Christ and extends throughout the Church, which is his Body. Its dimensions are those of Christ's love.

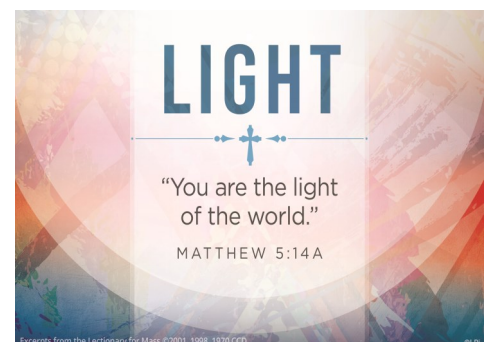
