### On The Lenten Journey

+Today's readings, as we begin the season of Lent, give us two special reminders that will help us on our journey: *Who God is*, and *who we are as human beings*.

The reading from Genesis presents our creation story: The Lord formed us out of the clay of the ground, and animated us by breathing life into us. Without God, we simply would not exist.

Yet from the very beginning, it has been hard for us as human beings to remember this basic fact. Like Adam and Eve, it is very easy for us to fall into the trap of wanting to be like God – wanting to be “in charge” of our lives and wanting to know good from evil. We certainly can go through our lives reacting to our problems and challenges as if we're in charge of everything, and forget to rely on the wisdom and guidance of God. Perhaps, however, as we begin our Lenten practices of *prayer*, *fasting* and *almsgiving*, our focus should be to remember to put God first in our lives, and to wrest out of our lives anything we want to put before God.

Jesus gives us a masterful example of how to do just that in the Gospel, as He's confronted with various temptations by the devil. For every temptation that Satan puts before Him, Jesus counters with a reminder that God comes first.

Tempted to make stones into bread after 40 days of fasting, Jesus notes that we live not only on bread, but on the word of God. Tempted to fall down and let God save Him, Jesus reminds the devil that He is not to put God to the test. Finally, tempted with all the riches of the world if He only worships Satan, Jesus counters that God alone should be worshipped. Jesus gives us a clear model: in all temptations to hunger, power and wealth, we are to remember that God, our Creator, comes *first*.

As we begin our own challenging journey of Lent this year, let us be assured by the words of Saint Paul in today's second reading. Although sin abounds in our world, God's grace abounds even more. As we struggle in the weeks ahead to put God first, to remove from our lives the obstacles to our union with God, God gives us graces to help us in our struggle. We are never alone on the journey when we strive to come closer to God – God is always waiting to give us any help we need if only we remember to turn to Him.

My friends, let us face the Lent ahead with the courage and strength of Jesus. May this journey of Lent help us to return to God and put the Lord *first* in our lives and our hearts.

+As we enter Lent here at St. Andrew, I am happy to say that we have tried to expand our offerings to include more opportunities for confession, followed by a Tuesday evening mass (for those who find it difficult to make it to morning mass because of work or other commitments). As before, we will offer Eucharistic

### Lent, “What happened with the Gloria and the Alleluia?”

The season of Lent is a time of reflection, sacrifice, and penance. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) is very specific on certain items during Lent. The General Instruction states:

53. The *Gloria in excelsis* (*Glory to God in the highest*) . . . is sung or said on Sundays **outside Advent and Lent**, and also on Solemnities and Feasts, and at particular celebrations of a more solemn character.

62. a) The *Alleluia* is sung in **every time of year other than Lent**. The verses are taken from the Lectionary or the *Graduale*.

b) During Lent, **instead of the Alleluia**, the verse before the Gospel as given in the Lectionary is sung. It is also possible to sing another Psalm or Tract, as found in the *Graduale*.

### Reflections on the Three Pillars of Lent

During Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in **prayer** and reading Scripture, to service by **giving alms**, and to practice self-control through **fasting**. Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

### Lenten Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

"Fasting makes sense if it questions our security, and if it also leads to some benefits for others, if it helps us to cultivate the style of the Good Samaritan, who bends down to his brother in need and takes care of him." - Pope Francis, Homily 3/5/14

Eucharistic Adoration and Exposition

9:00 AM-7:00 PM in the Chapel

"The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him

who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament."

### RESTORE THE CHURCH BUILD THE FUTURE

Around the world, women who face unplanned pregnancies or who have experienced abortion or miscarriage suffer psychological stress. They need material and emotional support to help them to heal. This reality is especially true in Eastern Europe, where for decades, the Soviet system proposed abortion as a method of birth control. Today in this developing region of the world, many pregnant women face difficult financial situations, are abandoned by partners and family members, and confront other hardships that compound their circumstances. In the Lithuanian capital of Vilnius, however, women who previously would have been alone and vulnerable in such times now have access to assistance and support when they face challenging pregnancies or losses.

Since 2014, Krizinio Nėštumo Centras (Crisis Pregnancy Center) has provided a wide range of long-term help to hundreds of women: psychological counseling, job search assistance, training in infant care, life skills such as budget management, and group therapy for women who have experienced miscarriages and lost babies. Where few government resources are available to support these kinds of services, local organizations—with the help of the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe (CCEE)—are accompanying the most vulnerable women and helping them to choose life, even in their time of greatest need. Your contributions to the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe help to train staff and further grow this

pregnancy center, helping to build a culture of life, solidarity, and support for women and children.

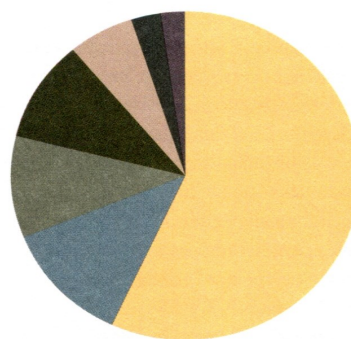

Our Faith Formation project for Lent will support Buckets of Water, a small non-profit organization founded by James Green, a Rochester resident and former Marine. He spoke to our classes this past week about the need for clean water in Africa. While deployed with the Marines to Uganda in 2012, he implemented a simple water filtration system to provide clean drinking water to villages there. James worked with Ugandan soldiers on constructing the filters. He funds this non-profit by selling the work of Ugandan artists.

Faith Formation students will have a chance to GIVE by choosing between two art pieces as they "vote" with their donations, Penny Wars style. They will be encouraged to PRAY for those without water whenever they take a nice, cool drink, and FAST from using more water than they need. The winning art piece will be displayed for all to see.

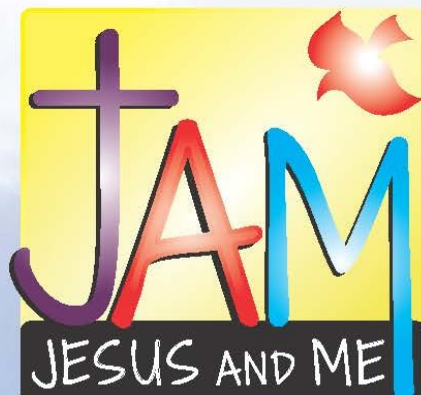

*Jesus And Me (JAM) is an evening of Praise and Worship, Adoration, and spiritual message. ## Prayer Corner—Prayer 101

### **Ways to Pray with Kids, continued...**

#### Pray Using Your Body

**Prayer through Movement:** There are several ways to pray with kids that teach how their minds *and* bodies communicate with God. So, try this simple prayer below, especially useful for the kinesthetic learner. Additionally, yoga and dance are great options that can be done with children of all ages.

*(3 deep breaths)*

*God, you are above (reach toward the sky), below (touch your toes), inside (hands to heart) and all around (big arm circles).*

*I worship you (reach toward the sky), and give my life to you (touch your toes).*

*And I love you (hands to heart) with all that I am (big arm circles).*

*(3 deep breaths)*

**Five-Finger Prayer:** Developed by Pope Francis, this prayer practice assigns each finger something to pray for. The thumb is for those closest to us. The index finger for those who teach, instruct and heal us. The middle finger, our tallest, is for our leaders. The ring finger, our weakest, for those who are weak. The pinky is for ourselves. Click here to download your free printable bookmark version of this prayer..

**Prayer Journal:** Invite your children to begin drawing and writing their prayers to God. Even little ones can draw their prayers. For those who are older, they may want to write letters to God. Additionally, giving children a prompt can offer needed structure. Perhaps, encourage them to write God about their hopes for the coming school year.

#### Pray Through Conversation

**Fill in the Blank Prayer:** Take turns going back and forth or from person to person, if you're in a group, saying, "God is great, God is good, thank you God for \_\_\_\_\_." See how long you can keep it going. It's fun (and sometimes breathtaking) to hear what your children say. Discussing what is inside our hearts and minds with each other is a crucial way to build relationships. Consequently, this practice builds both relationships with God and with each other.

**Prayer Walk:** Go for a walk together in search for the things you're thankful to God for. Sidewalks, trees, bird songs, smiles from other pedestrians, flowers in bloom, passing cars and buses that make travel possible. So much to appreciate! Additionally, this is an excellent way to get outside, slow down the mind and get active together.
