### From Fr. Tom

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want" (Ps 23:1)

This is a beautiful way to live, a way that leads to life, peace, and true happiness. Jesus in the Gospel today tells us that he came precisely so that we may live with that life, peace, and happiness described in Psalm 23.

"I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full." (John 10:10)

As we listen to these words of Jesus in today's Gospel, they take on an added meaning because we are in the Easter season. Three weeks ago, we celebrated Jesus' death and resurrection. Jesus had to die to himself to live his new life. Jesus has shown us how to live life to the fullest, we must die to ourselves in order to rise to new life. Our secularized world thinks it has the answer to our needs, but what it offers only leads us into deeper despair, fear, and anxiety. All of the sudden, COVID 19 came and it seems that we lost every answer.

Jesus has the answer for every human question! Why? Because, He is the answer. He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

Only dying to ourselves as we follow Jesus will lead us to the happiness we seek. Jesus teaches us that the way to happiness lies not in filling up each of our wants and needs and desires. The way to happiness lies in a very different choice of life; the way to happiness may be found in sacrificing and taking up our cross with Jesus, reproducing the life of Jesus in our own lives. And so Jesus says, "I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture..." (John 10:9)

"I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full." (John 10:10)

Pope John Paul encouraged people many times to find and live life to the full by following Jesus and he did this by saying phrases like this, "Do not be afraid to open the doors to Christ..."

In Palestine the shepherd brought the sheep into the sheepfold every night. It was a circular stone wall with an opening or door where the sheep entered. Once the sheep were inside for the night the shepherd slept in that opening or door all night. The sheep could not get out without stepping over the shepherd's body which meant they would not get out at all during the night. Jesus is the gate, anyone who enters through him will be safe, and will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. Others steal and kill and destroy, but Jesus is the Good Shepherd.

I pray for all of you that during this COVID 19 time that you will have more time, a deeper desire, and willingness to listen to the voice of our Good Shepherd, to know Him better, to trust Him fully, and love Him more.





## MAY IS THE MONTH FOR MARY ~ Symbolic Mary Cake

### Ingredients Needed For This Symbolic Mary Cake (Aka Blueberry Lemon Pound Cake)

- |                                 |                            |
|---------------------------------|----------------------------|
| 2 sticks of butter              | 1/2 teaspoon baking powder |
| 1/2 cup Crisco shortening       | 1 cup milk                 |
| 3 cups sugar                    | 2 teaspoons lemon extract  |
| 5 eggs                          | 1 teaspoon vanilla extract |
| 3 cups flour                    | 1 teaspoon butter extract  |
| 1 teaspoon rum extract          | 2 cups of blueberries      |
| a few pinches of powdered sugar |                            |


- Preheat your oven to 325 degrees.
- If your blueberries are frozen, first you will want to run them under water until they are thawed. Then pat them dry
- Grease and flour your bundt pan. I like to use a paper towel to wipe crisco in the pan and then really flour it well. I do this step carefully as it can be hard to turn bundt cakes.
- Cream the butter, shortening, and sugar together in electric mixer on low speed until it is light and fluffy. The add eggs in and mix it well.
- In a separate bowl, combine the flour and baking powder together.
- Take your flour mixture and add a little of that to your sugar mixture, then a little of the milk, back and forth alternately to the sugar mixture. You can do this on medium with your mixer until it is all combined.
- Put about 1 cup of your blueberries into the bottom of your bundt pan.
- With a spoon, fold the rest of your blueberries into the cake batter.
- Then pour the batter into your bundt pan.
- Bake the cake 1 1/2 hours or until an inserted toothpick comes out clean.
- When the cake is finished, allow the pan to sit on a wire rack until it is completely cooled.
- Carefully run a butter knife around the edges of the pan to help loosen the cake.
- Put your cake plate on top of your pan and flip it over to place your cake on the plate.

**NOTE:** If your cake rises over the edge of your bundt pan, you can cut off the top before you flip it if you're worried about it being lopsided. Or you can just leave it. Dust the outside of the cake with just a little bit of powdered sugar.
