On the Easter Journey

+In the second reading today, St. Peter provides one of the most beautiful, inspiring, and challenging definitions of what it means to be a Christian and part of the Church: You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation. As the Easter season continues, Christians everywhere rejoice – in the midst of the pandemic – that the risen Christ has called us out of darkness into His wonderful light. We exercise our royal priesthood as a community of believers when we work to share our faith with others, and support one another no matter how difficult it may be right now.

By our baptism, we are called out of darkness – both metaphorically and seasonally – during this spring of the year. May we embrace our role and our hope as we see the blossoming of the season bursting forth, knowing that through our difficulties there will be ever-increasing light – light that will fill us grace and hope and desire to come together and journey together as the family of faith being built up as the Body of Christ at St. Andrew! Let's not give up, for Christ continues to be the Shepherd leading us home.....

+It's been a while since you heard me....but I have heard from so many of you, received cards, prayer offerings, a whole army of people bringing food to the rectory over these past weeks. I cannot thank you enough for all your prayerful support.

As you probably know, on Friday, April 3rd, I was rushed to Ascension/Crittenton hospital. I ended up in the hospital part for a week, then was sent to the in-house patient rehab for another week to start building myself back up. That process continues. It all started with a horrible reaction to gout medication, (nothing to do with Covid-19) which lead to severe dehydration and weakness. I must be honest and state that I didn't think I was going to make it. Anyway with the help of so many, I was able to come to the rectory on April 16 and start in-home rehab and the challenge to get my strength and stamina back. This process continues and will for a while. The hold-up is that the doctors want to "take a look inside" with a colonoscopy, but those places are not yet open for business (as I write this on May 2). I hope and pray that I don't have to wait till after May 28, since it will be a long month more of basically waiting before they can get a better insight as to what is wrong and provide the steps to get that part of my health back on track. I kindly ask that you continue with prayers for my healing and recovery back into active ministry.

Please know that I continue to be involved with parish life, though more from and oversight perspective. I know that the staff is working hard from home, sometimes in the office and in many other ways with phone calls, etc. I salute them during this time! I ask that you pray for them and support them too. As a parish family we are truly blessed. I want to give a special thank you to Fr. Tom, who has been a busy liturgist during this time. He is doing a great service to our parish. Keep him in prayer for good health!

Who knows how things will continue to evolve; there is no pre-set course of action to any of this. So please be patient, and together, under the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes, and Blessed Solanus Casey, we will continue to ask the good Lord to help us navigate our way. No matter when, we know that things will be different when we are finally able to slowly open the doors of St. Andrew in a more physical and safe manner!!

- **+HAPPY MOTHERS DAY TO ALL OUR MOMS!** May you be blessed many times over for all that you have done and do for us, your children and families. We also remember our moms who have gone to the other side of life; may you rest in the loving arms of Mary, blessed Mother to us all!
- +This week, our new associate Fr. Craig Marion will give us a little bio on his journey into priesthood. It's hard to believe that Fr. Tom has completed his 3-year assignment already! We will miss him!
- +I offer special prayers of gratitude to those who continue to support our parish; what a challenging time to have had this happen, especially as we bring the building project to an official conclusion with the final payments to vendors and loan agreements being put in order. While that continues to unfold, I can at least tell you that we will be under the \$3million cap of the loan approved, so our monthly payments will be less than previous forecast. But we all know that there are bills to be paid, so I beg you, and ask for your generosity in supporting our parish. If you have stopped contributing, please re-start now so that we can keep our parish family moving forward, though maybe slower than previously thought. I continue to turn in my envelope monthly won't you please join me in your support?
- +Know of my prayers. God bless and looking forward to a safe, healthy time when we can celebrate together in church!

4 Worship

As many of you already know the Archbishop released a letter to the faithful of the Archdiocese of Detroit and also this week online in the Detroit Catholic there was an article about things that might look different when we return to Mass. Right now we do not know when that time will be, but we are keeping up to date with the latest recommendations and also networking with other diocese to see how they are planning. We have been discussing what may work and what we will try here at St. Andrew when the time comes that we will be able to have Mass again. In the meantime, if you did not see the article in the Detroit Catholic, I wanted to highlight the points that they presented in their article. Here are five things we should be prepared for as we consider a slow return to Church:

1. Wearing a mask

Masks save lives, especially because COVID-19 is so highly communicable. All the faithful at Mass will be asked or perhaps even required to wear a mask or face covering.

2. Social distancing in church

There will be clear protocols that will change where you can sit, how you can greet people, and how to receive Holy Communion. You will need to keep six feet of distance between anyone not in your household for the foreseeable future at church.

3. Fewer people

The dispensation for the requirement to attend Sunday Mass will likely be extended. Those at higher risk — the elderly, the immune-compromised and hospital workers — will probably need to be the last to come back to church.

4. Mistakes and imperfection

None of us have lived through a pandemic before. We will not get every decision correct. This means that we all will need saint-like patience or get really good at saying "I'm sorry" and "I forgive you."

5. Continued online presence

The slow and steady return means many things will continue to be online. Parishes will still provide opportunities in a digital format, and livestream Masses are sure to continue.

WELCOME FR. MARION

As you may know, I will soon be with you at St. Andrew's. A little bit about me, I entered Seminary in 2010. Prior to entering Seminary, I worked for almost 13 years. My college background prior to entering Seminary was Business, Accounting and Finance. I was fortunate at the age of 18 to be hired by a small consulting company. Beginning as an office clerk, and in my time there I was able to learn a great deal. I was eventually working as the Assistant to the Human Resource Manager, I then worked as Systems Analyst and when I left the company I worked in Systems Support and as a Recruiter.

After leaving the consulting firm, I worked for General Motors for more than six years. In a strange turn of events, I ended up worked in the Quick Service Business. Who would have thought a guy that almost always worked in financial work, would wind up running restaurants? Quick Service Restaurants were very challenging. Immediately after being training, I turned around a unit in Southgate, from there I was asked to "fix" a unit in Allen Park, this unit had enormous problems, gaping holes in the HVAC roof units, the main drain line was no longer functional, the store was in severe disrepair and the employee morale was very low. In the end, working on average of 80-100 hours per/week a great deal was fixed and repaired and morale improved. The unit stabilized and was making money. However, after 18 months, I realized I could not continue to work nearly 100 hours average per/week permanently. I also realized that was really the level of commitment needed for the unit to



continue to progress. So, I decided it was best for me to go back to doing the work I did best and returned to financial and business analytical work.

I was then hired to work for a multi-national insurance company; the intricacies of Insurance were challenging. While doing this work, in prayer I thought perhaps the Lord had a different plan for me. I become then, much more involved with my home parish, St. Vincent Ferrer. I began assisting as a Lector and an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist. I really prayed in a deeper way for the first time in my life and I really desired to know what God's will for me was. With that I spoke to my Pastor (Fr. John Esper) he encouraged me to contact the Vocations office for the Archdiocese.

I called Fr. Tim Birney, the Director of Priestly Vocations, at the time, and I decided to visit the Seminary for a discernment weekend. It was a beautiful weekend. I could see what life was like, living in the Seminary. Soon after I met with Fr. Birney again, he offered me an application to enter Seminary. I completed the application process and I was fortunate to be approved to enter Seminary. I resigned from working and entered Seminary in 2010.

I spent three years studying Philosophy and living in the college of Sacred Heat Major Seminary. I graduated from the College, in 2013, with a Bachelor's Degree in Philosophy. As all men who now study to be a Priest for the Archdiocese of Detroit, I immediately began studies in Theology at Creighton's University, within the Institute for Priestly Formation program, specifically the Spirituality of a Diocesan Priest. I then returned to Sacred Heart and began Theology as a graduate student in the fall of 2013, I was also then a candidate for Holy Orders. In April of 2017, I finished with a Master's Degree in Divinity from Sacred Heart Major Seminary and also concurrently earned a Bachelor's Degree in Sacred Theology which was awarded from the Angelicum in Rome. Thanks-be-to-God, I was ordained on June 3, 2017.

Most recently, I have been serving as the Associate Pastor at St. Paul on the Lake Parish, first for Msgr. Pat Halfpenny, and this my last year for Fr. Jim Bilot. I have been so very blessed in this assignment. It is a wonderful parish and the people are such a gift.

I pray that I will be a good servant to all of you at St. Andrew's and be supportive to Msgr. Mike as Pastor. I promise to keep you in my prayers. Please, if you would, pray for me.

Rite of Christian Initiation Asking for Your Continued Prayers



Today's Scripture passages hold powerful stewardship messages. In the Gospel, the evangelist St. John shares that Jesus tells His Apostles — and us — that I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. Our discipleship in Jesus, instituted at our Baptism, draws us closer to Christ, which opens the way to the Father. In the Acts of the Apostles, the Christians in Jerusalem choose seven deacons filled with Spirit and wisdom to help those widows neglected in the daily distribution of food and other necessities. In his First Letter, St. Peter reminds us that while accepting our Lord's gift of faith makes us special to God, it comes at a high price. Christian stewards strengthen this important gift with graces given from participating in Mass regularly and partaking of Holy Communion, daily prayer, and Scripture reading. In our ongoing stewardship journey, do we use God's graces and gifts to galvanize our faith, so that we can, in a spirit of evangelization, share the gift of faith with those we meet?
