Parish Mission Statement

On the Easter Journey

+In today's Gospel, Jesus says, *If you love me, you will keep my commandments*. This assertion is meant not for just his contemporary disciples; it is intended for all who choose to follow Jesus. And for the first half of the sentence to be true, the second half must be fulfilled.

Loving Jesus begins, as St. Peter would later write, by sanctify[ing] Christ as Lord in [our] hearts. Evidence that the early disciples understood what it meant to love Jesus is found in Philip's ministry in Samaria. When Philip went to this Samaritan city, he did not just proclaim Jesus as Messiah. He expressed his faith through his witness, and all who herd him and saw the signs he was doing, believed. They believed because Philip did these works in Jesus' name - working with the Holy Spirit and imitating Jesus, who did perfectly the will of God.

If we love Jesus, then, we will continue to be, as Jesus was, a voice for the voiceless – the grieving, the abandoned, the persecuted. We will understand that Jesus' ministry of love did not end with his death, but continues through his body – the Church. Through baptism, we enter into Christ's prophetic, royal, and priestly ministry.

This call to love Jesus by following his commandments to love and care for our neighbors is challenging – and probably much more so during this time of pandemic. For this reason, Jesus did not abandon us to carry out this ministry of love with support. He sent his Spirit to abide with us, guarding us, guiding us, showing the way and strengthening us with God's grace.

It is comforting to know that we are not alone, no matter how much "social distancing" is still important for us to practice. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we become witnesses to the Resurrection and nourish the world with spiritual fruits. As Saint Teresa of Avila wrote, "Christ has no body on earth without us." So if we do not speak and act for Christ, who will?

Let us not be afraid to be strong, bold missionary disciples in our world today!

+Because of the disruptions of the Covid19 pandemic, all parishes have been given an extension for budget submissions from May 15 to June 15. This is to help adjust for the many changes that will undoubtedly have to take place because of the changes to parish worship and overall life. A couple of highlights for us to consider here at St. Andrew include:

-we have "closed out" the building project, and the final debt will be about \$2.6M (less than the allowed \$3M). For our first year, we will only have to make monthly interest payments of just over \$11k, and then move to a full principle/interest payment of \$26k/month the following year.

-I beg that you consider your parish financial support and help us pick-up where we left off before all this struck back in March. Without your assistance, we will be unable to continue all the great many activities that we had already implemented and the many more ideas put into place that we were hoping to weave into the fabric of our parish life and ministry.

+Thank you for all the help you have offered to me in my recovery. What is often said is that for every day in the hospital, it takes a week to recover; for me that would be 12 weeks before getting fully back into the swing of things. I thank the many chefs who have been sending food; I know it seems like forever already, but I have just been home a month; your continued support is much appreciated.

I don't know what the next couple weeks will have in store for me; I hope to get the colonoscopy once I can get in safely. My therapy is going fairly well; stairs continue to pose a little bit of a challenge right know. My spirits — well, it's a real challenge to manage in a limited world inside the rectory. But I know with prayers, and the grace of God through the intercession of Our Lady and Blessed Solanus and St. Andrew, all things are possible through Jesus. Jesus, I trust in you — we all do! So please help us now and every day of our lives!

The Gospel in the age of Covid-19

Today's Gospel reading comes from the Gospel of John. Throughout his various writings, John mentions the word "Love" many times, from the straightforward "God is Love" (1 John 4:8) to the infamous John 3:16 that we often see on signs at sporting events, "For God so loved the worlds that he sent his only son." And of course there is the command to "love one another" (John 13:34, 15:12). Today we hear "If you love me you will keep my commandments", but what exactly does this mean? Remember here, Jesus is not referring to a list of duties or prescribed acts to follow, but the more broad command that he gave to "love God and love your neighbor as yourself". It would seem simple, to love others, but in reality, what we observe and what we experience is that this is more challenging when put into practice. For Jesus, love has no bounds and no limits. For Jesus, love is sacrifice for the greater good for the other and for Jesus that was to the extreme of giving his life for us. To love another is to see the other as we see ourselves, so that their needs are as important as our own.

Over the course of the last several weeks I have seen both examples of selfishness, the antithesis of our call to love others and to the opposite extreme, great acts of sacrificial love. We all have the opportunity to show love for others, in even the simplest way. Recently I was disheartened by the report on the news of the employee at a Dollar General who was shot and killed because he asked a customer to wear a mask. Wearing a mask may be irritating or uncomfortable, but that discomfort is temporary. When we are allowed to return to Mass at Church, we most likely will be wearing masks, not only for our good, but for the good of the other. We will show love to the other by protecting them from the potential spread of a disease that we know causes great pain and suffering for all who are afflicted with the disease and we know that many who contract the disease do not survive. Our acts of love may not call us to sacrifice our life as Jesus did, but to move beyond ourselves and to place ourselves at the service of others. In this way we will show that Jesus lives in us and are responding to his command.

As we move forward in the coming days we are asked to wear masks to keep ourselves and others safe as we go out and begin living a "new normal". Are you able to help make masks for Senior Citizens or those who don't have access or the means to services that provide masks?






Pope Francis invites us to celebrate *Laudato Si'* Week from May 16-24, a nine-day global campaign celebrating the theme: "Everything is Connected."
