

On the Pentecost Journey

+The readings today for the feast of the birth of our Church, give us powerful images: a *strong, driving wind; tongues as of fire;* the *ability of the disciples to speak to people in their own languages*. This is a good day to celebrate the power of the Holy Spirit, transforming a group of fear-filled disciples into bold preachers. Pentecost Sunday is a great day to rejoice in the power of the Lord!

Pentecost is also a great day to challenge ourselves – even with all the challenges of the pandemic whirling around us for these past two months. In these weeks, we have commemorated the passion and death of Jesus and celebrated his resurrection, hi appearance in a glorified body to the disciples, his ascension into heaven, and now his sending of the Holy Spirit in great power. The key question is, what do WE do with this now, in our own time and place?

We know that there are different kinds spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord....[and] to each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. And all of these have one thing in common: they are to be used to build up the Body of Christ, the Church – our Catholic, Christian community and family. It's us working together in ways both big and small that helps us fulfill the Church's mission. That mission is the proclamation of Jesus as Lord and of the love that God has for each of us, shown to us through Jesus and by the interactions of our brothers and sisters.

Maybe in the craziness of our world over these past two months, in our prayer, we haven't really taken time to reflect and meditate on how this has happened in our own lives, just seemingly getting through our days, one at a time, completely exhausted, confused, lonely and fearful. Maybe this should be part of our time in prayer. God knows what's going on, and wants to hear from each of us – expressing our pain and sorrows, but also finding the little bits of sunshine and help that comes our way, and thanking God for those moments and people in our lives. I know I do daily – like when you bring food to the rectory, or leave a wonderful note and card of encouragement, prayer and support. You don't really realize how wonderful such little events make the day! And make me thankful for the blessings you are to me and to one another as you write and tell me about what might be going on in your lives too.

By faith and through the power of the Holy Spirit, we all have the basic gift that Paul mentions up front in his letter: the realization and the ability to say that *Jesus is Lord*! This is the foundation of being a Christian. Grace and discernment help us own the gifts we have been given and make an effort to use them for God's glory and the sake of the kingdom.

Reminders as we return to Church

Those 65 and older or with compromised health conditions or caring for the sick in any way are encouraged to remain at home. The dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all the faithful through Sunday, September 6, 2020. As an act of justice to the whole community if you are not feeling well, have a fever, cough, etc. STAY HOME.

- 1. Wear a face covering/mask All of the faithful are reminded that those 2 and over MUST have a face covering from the time that they leave their vehicle until they return to their vehicle, with the exception of when they receive communion.
- 2. **Follow Social distancing** Please make sure that you maintain a six foot distance between yourself and others. Follow the directions of those who are seating you. Do not congregate before or after Mass.
- 3. **Distribution of Communion** Receiving in the hands is highly recommended. Use of personal hand sanitizer before and after communion is also recommended. Those receiving on the tongue will be asked to receive last.

I know that many people have missed the opportunity to be together to celebrate the Liturgy and I know that you have missed members of your church family and that there will be the tendency to want to say hello and "catch up" with each other. We are NOT at a point where we are able to do that yet. I know it may seem like we are placing all of these rules on you and you may not agree with them. The steps we are taking are to ensure your health and safety. We are beginning slowly and will adapt our times and procedures as the situation necessitates or allows. Your cooperation in following the procedures will help in maintaining the health and safety of all.

Pentecost

Pentecost comes from the Greek word for "fiftieth" (pentecoste). For Christians, Pentecost is the fiftieth day after Easter Sunday. The Jewish people celebrate Shavuot, originally a festival for expressing thankfulness to the Lord for the blessing of the harvest. The celebration is also tied to the giving of the Ten Commandments. In the Old Testament, it is also known as the Feast of Weeks and The Feast of Harvest.

In the New Testament, Pentecost is the fulfillment of the promise of the Holy Spirit, which Jesus told his disciples would be sent by God. Acts chapter 2 records the events of Pentecost where we are given the symbols of the Holy Spirit as wind and tongues of fire.

The Story of Pentecost is more than just a story though. For Christian believers, it has true significance and calls us to be witnesses for Jesus and for the Good News of the Gospel. As Archbishop Vigneron has put forth the call to *Unleash the Gospel*, the Feast of Pentecost should inspire us to go forth with conviction.
